## **Feast of Saints Philip & James, Apostles** ~ May 03

Call Philip the gospel's "Answer Man." "Can anything good come out of Nazareth?" Nathaniel asked Philip, who had proclaimed Jesus "the one about whom Moses wrote in the law, and also the prophets" (John 1:45). Jesus asked Philip, "Where can we buy enough food for them to eat?" (John 6:5).

Greeks brought Philip their request: "We would like to see Jesus" (John 12:21). Philip's answer to each question: bring people to Jesus! At the Last Supper, finally, Philip had a request of his own: "Show us the Father!" (John 14:8).

Jesus had three last questions for Philip: "You still don't know me? How can you ask that? Don't you believe?" And an answer: "I am in the Father and the Father is in me" (John 14:10).

Today's James is not John's brother, Zebedee's son, but, tradition says, author of the New Testament Letter of James, who died praying for his murderers in Jesus' words: "Forgive them, for they know not what they do."

Few historical details for either saint, but lessons aplenty: Bring every question we have and everybody we meet to Jesus; be, as James' letter challenges, "doers of the word and not hearers only" (James 1:22).

### Time, Treasure & Talent Spotlight "Principal" For A Day!

Monday of this week Nicholas S., a young man from 7<sup>th</sup> grade, was "Principal" for the day. I met him while he was acquainting himself with the parish office and the

workings therein. After showing him around and explaining my position and the tasks that I manage, we had a chat about him. He was very open about himself, his future and his ambitions.

To be "Principal for the day" his parents won the distinction for him at the winter event auction. This was not a top-down decision but an effort on the part of his parents to accede to Nick's desire to see what it felt like to be in charge for a day. He also wanted to see the real side of teachers and administrators, not

just their professional demeanor; he wanted a peek behind the scenes.

Nick began the day as principal at the assembly. I asked him whether he as shy to speak into the mike, but he said he feels comfortable speaking in front of crowds and always volunteers to lector at school masses.

He was a bit embarrassed, however, when he made a "screw-up" as he termed it, by announcing that he was "president" rather than "principal" for the day. Could this be a secret ambition? Within the hour he was demonstrating administrative abilities when a teacher came to him complaining about students pushing each other into the bushes on the way to class. Immediately he took charge, going to individual classrooms and letting students know that if this action continued, there would be dire consequences.

Nick says he might like to be principal in real life, but that's only if he does not become a sports star. He is truly keen on sports. He plays volleyball

and was playing basketball until he broke his wrist early in the season which put him out for four months. He plays street hockey every day and loves the San Jose Sharks. But the game that's going to take him to the top is soccer. He plays in a Santa Clara league where he's the goalie. He says he's good – not many balls get by him.

A student at St. Clare School since second grade, Nick says he learned there about God and praying. In fact he shocked his parents when he asked to be baptized a Catholic at the end of second grade. The younger son in the family, Nick's favorite subject is math and he looks forward to following his older brother to Bellarmine High School.

Nick is a self-assured, very likable young man who is not afraid of responsibility. Authority sits well on him and he has the confidence, energy and ambition to reach high goals. Perhaps he may become a star, or a principal or even a president.

## Celebrating The First Eucharist For Children

This month a number of young children in our parish will receive the sacrament of the Eucharist for the first time in their life. It is a unique and joyful event in their existence, a day they are going to remember all their life, a moment they have been looking forward with their parents who have hopefully accompanied them thus far after their initial reception of the sacrament of baptism. If these children have been taken all along to church they will be eagerly expecting this moment like those young children that I sometimes see taken along as their parents are going to receive Holy Communion. The little children, as they see the parents receiving the Body of Christ stretch out their tiny hands wanting to receive Holy

Communion as well. A blessing to them makes them happy; yet, sometimes a few would like by all means to receive the host.

I have often wondered about their strong wish for the Eucharist. Truly, these children want to receive all that the parents receive: I believe though that the good Lord is telling them through their guardian angel that some One important is in front of them and of us all in the Eucharist: our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. The children stretch out their hands to Him in the Eucharist; at the same time they indicate to us the One we are called to trust. And we know that, as the saying goes, "children and fools speak the truth."

One of my prayers is that not only these children may keep their enthusiasm for years to come leading to First Eucharist and beyond, but also may their parents and grandparents remember the First Eucharist they received and realize the presence of the One in Whose Name we gather as Catholics every Sunday. May all be aware of the real presence of the Lord Jesus Christ our Savior, as the young children point that to us with their little hands, when we share the Bread of Life and the Cup of Salvation remembering the paschal mystery until the Lord comes again. In this way we can celebrate this special day of First Eucharist and make it memorable not only for these children but for all of us gathered in His Name.

## The Festival Is A-Changing

When I was growing up, my uncle Paul and aunt Lydia would enliven every family holiday. They would

take us to Golden Gate Park or a playground. Sometimes, they would simply organize a massive football game for all the kids on the block. I imagine this was a relief to the adults in the family, a chance to clear out the naturally loud children and have a quiet conversation. It was always so disappointing when Paul and Lydia went elsewhere for a holiday and we kids would lament to our parents about how no one would be there. My mom's response to her 8 urchins: "We will be there and that will be quite exciting enough."

I thought of these family holidays in light of the news that Butler Entertainment has chosen not to return to the St. Clare Festival. I imagine (no, I know) that the children and teenagers of our community will be very disappointed to hear that this year's festival

will have no Graviton or Super Slide. To overcome the impact of this change, we will be working with parents to create some events and activities that interest the children and young adults in the whole parish (not just the school children).

Long-term, the loss of Butler impels us to look at the nature and hopes of our community festival. From the very beginning of the process that led to the creation of the Pastoral Plan, parishioners have wondered how we might better structure the festival to promote a greater sense of community. A couple years ago, in fact, we conducted a survey to ask how the festival could be improved—allowing for a variety of activities and the opportunity for conversation that would appeal to all corners of our community.

Both the long term needs of the parish and the immediate need prompted by Butler's departure motivated the agenda of a recent Pastoral Council meeting with William Dempsey, the

When we clean, repair, or otherwise restore things in our possession, we often say "good as new" or "just like new." This, according to the book of Revelation, is what happens to anything that is filled with the glory of Christ.

When scripture uses the word "new" it doesn't merely mean "a different one, a replacement" (as our advertisements do), but it carries the sense of something being transformed so fully and completely that it is now almost unrecognizable. Our world is filled with tears, death, pain, thirst, darkness; but the new world—the new heavens and new earth brought about by Christ's resurrection—is filled with joy, everlasting life, glory, living water, and light.

As Paul noted in his second letter to the church at Corinth, if we are in Christ, then we are a new creation. And disciples who are a new creation, who live in the new heaven and earth brought about by Christ, are also daily practitioners of a new commandment: to love one another with that transforming, re-new-ing love that Christ bestowed on us.

unpaid point person for festival management. The Council proposed some creative, diverse activities: a Friday night taco night with mariachis and dancing for the adults of the community; Saturday games and contests organized for parish children and families and then teen or pre-teen centered activities for Saturday night; a Sunday multi-lingual Mass to bring everyone together, followed by the usual potpourri of ethnic foods and the traditional Sunday chicken dinner. A great vision indeed!

Yet visions take time and given the paucity of workers supporting the festival, the hopes for a new and improved festival will grow gradually: an afternoon or evening of fun activities on Saturday for families and children; a revitalized Treasure Cove organized by Stacey Poston-Thorn, among others; a 10:30am outdoor Mass, which will be prepared by the parish's Liturgy Committee, will be a featured element of Sunday's gathering. The multi-lingual Mass will replace the 9:00 Family Mass, the 10:30 Portuguese Mass, and the 12:00 Spanish Mass.

Who can you call to offer your help: Mary Park if you wish to assist the Liturgy Planning; Stacey Poston-Thorn for Treasure Cove; William Dempsey for anything else.

For my part, I wish I could offer more personal involvement in this year's festival but it falls on the weekend of my parents' 50<sup>th</sup> wedding anniversary. That is where I will be heading right after our community Mass on Sunday. Paul and Lyd will be there, too, no doubt organizing the family H-O-R-S-E tournament.

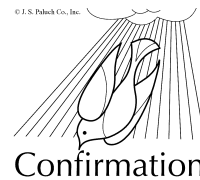
