Feast Days - Peter Scagnelli

Feast of Saint Philip Neri (1515-1595) ~ May 26

In a shop near the Vatican, a group of Americans laughed as the shopkeeper showed off his fluent English and latest souvenir, a key ring whose papal portrait, when pressed, activated a recorded blessing. Through the shop window, two clerics scowled disapproval. The shopkeeper grunted, “They're a very somber order who've left the Church. I recognize them.” “By their long robes?” an American asked. “Many in Rome wear robes,” replied the shopkeeper. “It's their long faces!”

When Philip Neri arrived in sixteenth-century Rome, there was reason to be somber. Swiss Guards had been massacred on Saint Peter's steps defending the pope. Parts of Europe were abandoning the Church. But Philip resolved to be an “Apostle of Joy,” drawing especially the young to Christ—and frequent confession and Communion—by his sincere interest in their problems, prayerful example, and gentle humor.

His “Oratory,” a movement as well as a place, provided recreation and devotion in a joyful atmosphere of companionship, service, and liturgy. Philip Neri challenges each of us to begin improving Church and world by changing ourselves with unflinching joy.

Time, Treasure & Talent Spotlight St. Vincent de Paul: Food Barrel Sundays and Fifth Sunday Collections

The St. Vincent de Paul Society was founded by a group of college students led by Blessed Frederic Ozanam in April, 1833 at a political rally condemning lay Catholics as "you people who put all the burden of relief for the poor upon your religious orders...what are you doing for them - you and your fellow Catholics?" In 1845, in St. Louis, Missouri, a Conference was begun which began to spread East and West in the United States. The Society is now active worldwide and we have helped Conferences when disasters have occurred, most recently the Conference in Haiti.

At St. Clare Parish, Bill Kolb, who gave more than 45 years service to those in need, told us they began "fund raising" for donations after Mass on Sunday sometime in the 1960's. Our Pastor at that time, Fr. Specht, began the use of the 5th Sunday envelopes for St. Vincent de Paul Society and included the poor box donations. This enabled the Society to help our neighbors in need with utility bills,

rent, prescriptions, bus passes, tuition assistance and supplemental food purchases.

It is estimated the collection of donated non-perishable food on the third Sunday, is at least 30-35 years young. Aiden Schroeder (over 40 years of service), Rocque Barrera (15 years), and Ramon Castellano, along with Bill, delivered groceries to aid our neighbors; thus the 3rd Sunday Food Barrel donation was born. Barbara Kolb remembers decorating the first barrels many years ago; our latest artist to update the look of the barrels is Mick Gonzales, a member for 10 years.

The St. Vincent de Paul Conference at St. Clare Parish operates all year long on this Parish's generosity of canned goods, toiletries, other dry goods, and financial donations. We have subsidized the non-perishable goods to our neighbors with food vouchers to Safeway for food and paper goods only. This relationship with Safeway started in the 1970's. In 2005, we encouraged those of you with an over abundant backyard harvest, to bring your produce to our monthly food distribution (at 9:00-9:30 a.m. on the 2nd or 4th Saturday of the month) or call 408-248-7786 and leave a message on extension 14 to

schedule some other arrangement. We are currently distributing groceries and vouchers to 58 to 63 families per month (regardless of race, creed, color, or status). Deliveries are still done for those unable to pick up their groceries at the Saturday distributions.

Membership of St. Clare Conference of St. Vincent de Paul Society has fluctuated over the years of service from highs of upper teens to lows of 5-6. Presently, there are 9 active members, with over 60 years of service among them, with 4 associate members bringing their special gifts to serve. Community service hours are available for school students. All but two of our members work other jobs full or part-time. Jim Schroeder, our current President, is the 2nd generation Vincentian at St. Clare and invites visitors to check us out; we meet on the 2nd and 4th Wednesday of the month in the St. Clare rectory at 7:00 p.m. Our mission is to respond to the Christian calling to seek and find the forgotten, the suffering, and the deprived so that we may bring them God's love. Come and join us...

A Renewed Sense of Awe

During the celebration of the sacrament of confirmation the bishop invokes the outpouring of the Spirit over the confirmands in these words:

All-powerful God, Father of our Lord Jesus Christ,
by water and the Holy Spirit
you freed your sons and daughters
from sin
and gave them new life. Send your
Holy Spirit upon them
to be their helper and guide. Give
them the spirit of wisdom and
understanding,
the spirit of right judgment and
courage,
the spirit of knowledge and reverence.
Fill them with the spirit of wonder and
awe in your presence.
We ask this through Christ our Lord.
(OC 25)

The sense of wonder and awe in the presence of the Lord (in Latin "Timor Domini" also known as "fear of the Lord") seems to be gradually disap-

pearing in our society. As we grow old in life we tend to lose the sense of awe before the Lord, a sense that is present in children. In their own special ways, with a smile, with a word, with their eyes and with their hands they are able to wonder at the simple yet essential things God provides in life, being also dependent upon others in almost everything. When reaching independence as adults, we can lose the sense of dependence on God and the sense of awe and wonder, feeling that we can generally do things our way. The Scriptures, though, tell us that God's ways are not our ways (Is. 55:9) and if we do not become like children we may not enter the Reign of God (Mt.18:6).

All the more we are called to pray for this gift as Church nowadays. It is not praying to be afraid or fearful of the Lord, Who does not wish the sinner to die but to repent and live (Ez.33:11). We are called to a sense of not taking God and God's gifts for granted. It is

an attitude of the heart and of our life that can be fostered by responding to God's generosity with the awareness of these blessings to be used for the glory of God and to the service and love of neighbor. We stand in awe and reverence to God for all that the Lord has done for us in the created universe, in the redemption and reconciliation between God and humankind obtained through Jesus Christ's suffering, death and resurrection, in the action and gifts of the Holy Spirit helping us to live the promises of our baptism and our call to holiness. Let us pray for a renewed sense of wonder and awe in the Lord's presence, particularly in the Sunday Eucharist, memorial of the paschal mystery, through this special gift of the Holy Spirit.

Pentecost: A Birth And A Gathering

Our children love to hear the story of their births—the time of day, the place, who was there, and the countless other details unique to their own birthday. When it comes to tell these tales or answer our children's questions, Kathleen holds an encyclopedia's worth of memories. In this way, she reminds me of what the evangelist Luke wrote regarding Mary's memory of Jesus' birth and youth: "she treasured these things and stored them in her heart."

Today, the Church celebrates its own birthday—the Feast of Pentecost described by Luke in the Acts of the Apostles. Like with the birth of our children, we treasure the accounts of the early days and perhaps long for more detail than the written accounts afford us. Still, the first moments of the Church present a clear model and direction not just for the universal Church but especially our own parish.

Luke describes a scene very much like Saint Clare: devout believers "from every nation under heaven...gathered in a large crowd...hearing [the word of God] in their own tongue." Finally, the group of believers speaks with each other—seeking to understand the event of Pentecost and the purpose of God's revelation as one people from many lands.

The coming festival, and especially the multi-lingual liturgy, gives us a time to gather in a large crowd and hear the word of God. The festival offers us a chance to speak with each other and to share meals of all varieties together. We will have a chance to play and perform—or enjoy watching those who play and perform.

I hope that the festival also stands out as invitation for each of us to reach out to each other throughout the year so that this Church of many tongues is in fact one body in Christ celebrating, in the words of Luke, "the mighty acts of God."

Social Concerns: An Oil Spill

Catholic Social Justice is rooted in what is "right"—what is reflective of progress toward the "Kingdom of God" toward which we are called to direct our lives.

Part of this responsibility is executing successfully our responsibility as stewards of Creation. Today, we are faced with a DISASTER! Our processes of managing and governing regulation and oversight of the Gulf Coast environment have failed in a manner that not only jeopardizes the environmental "purity" of a section of our Gulf Coast, but the life, dignity, and economic security of our citizens.

Experts project that, if this release of at least 200,000 gallons of oil per day is not "controlled" soon, the impact on the environment will be totally disastrous—greater than that of the Exxon Valdez over 20 years ago. And "the environment" is not just birds, fish, and beaches; it's us! The environment and humanity are inexorably linked.

It's the birds and fishes that will die; it's the economic loss in trying to save them; it's the loss of jobs for the fishermen, shrimpers, and crabbers; it's the loss of jobs of the people who sell these products and transport them to far-away stores. It's the impact on those who rely on the tourist business—on small resort owners, their children, and the aging parents they support. With attractive sandy beaches destroyed, vacationers will go elsewhere, and hotel workers will lose their low-wage jobs...and the livelihood of people who work in restaurants and gift shops will be compromised. Do we care?

What form does "caring" take? Being a faithful citizen does not mean "just voting"—it means getting involved much deeper—both as an individual and as part of a larger community: in challenging and changing the defective processes that permit situations like this to happen in the first place!!! Do you know how to contact your representatives and senators and tell them how you feel and what you suggest?—if not, now is the time to find out...and "just do it!"

Gift Of The Holy Spirit



"Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful. And kindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit, Lord, and they shall be created. And you shall renew the face of the earth."

This prayer to the Holy Spirit is one of my favorites. The image of fire and stoking one's flame of faith, love and charity is a powerful reflection of the tongues of fire that inflamed the hearts and minds of the apostles on Pentecost.

We don't seem to speak much of the Holy Spirit but it is the Spirit of God that came to earth to live among us.

Do you know that there is a list of the "Gifts of the Holy Spirit?" They are from the Book of Isaiah 11:2-3.

Wisdom is the ability to value what we believe through faith, prioritizing those things that are of God.

Understanding is the ability to achieve a certainty of our faith that goes deeper than faith.

Counsel is the ability to judge how best to act, almost intuitively.

Fortitude gives the strength or courage to follow through with the actions we know are best.

Knowledge is the ability to know God's purpose for our lives and to live it out.

Piety is the desire to worship God and to serve him out of love not duty.

Fear of God is the desire to not offend God because of our love for him.

Following is a prayer to ask for these gifts:

"Come, O Spirit of Love; O Fire of Love, purify my heart, mind and soul; sanctify all I think, say, and do. Bestow on me plentifully your holy gifts. May I always and only give thanks, and praise, and glory to you, my Lord and my God. Amen."
