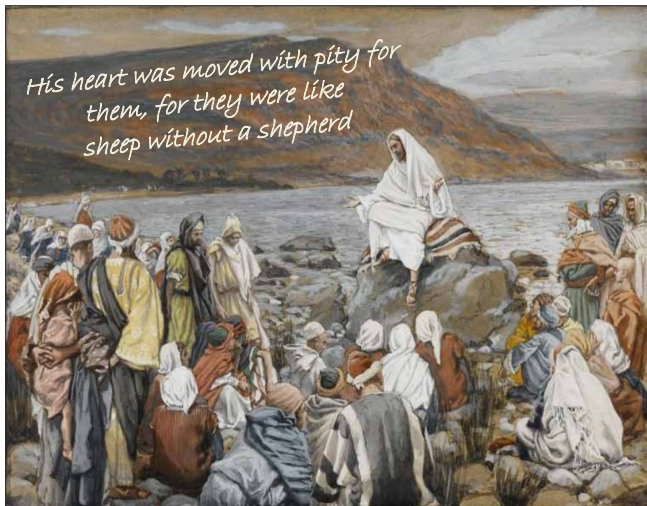

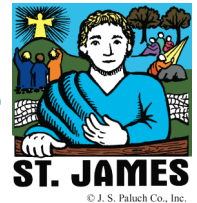

## Pastor's Note

Dear Parishioners,

Plans. All of us are familiar with plans. There are family plans, school plans, plans at work, travel plans, game plans and all sorts of other plans. Our days are lived out with plans in mind. Even our fun times are planned – sometimes over-planned.

In today's Gospel, we heard about the Apostles who had been out preaching and had come back to Jesus to report about "all they had done and taught."

Jesus then said to them, "You must come away to some lonely place all by yourselves and rest for a while;" for there were so many coming and going that the Apostles had no time even to eat. So they went off in a boat to a lonely place where they could be by themselves." They obviously needed a break, so Jesus decided it was time to get away and get some rest. We all can identify with that, can't we?

It must have been a lovely scene. They all get into a fishing boat and begin rowing out across the lake, the boat gliding along the smooth waters with only the sound of the oars dipping in the water and perhaps a screeching gull or two swooping overhead.

Peace at last, along with the prospect of finding a quiet place on the other side where they could unpack their food, sit and talk, and quietly have time to share stories and listen to what Jesus had to say.

But then as they approached the opposite shore, they saw a large crowd and heard the noisy voices of people. You can imagine how those Apostles felt. No doubt they were more than annoyed. Their plans were being disrupted. Life is like that, isn't it?

Our best-laid plans, and our cherished moments, are too often stolen from us.

How do we react when our plans are either interrupted or completely disrupted? How do we react when people get in the way of our goals? Do we get resentful and make life miserable for those around us? Do we lash out at those around us?

When you stop and think about it, Jesus endured many setbacks in his earthly life, and turned these moments into blessings for all. He answered a lawyer's tricky

We all have plans. At the same time we must remember that God has his, too.

## YLI Meets Monday

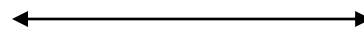


St. Clare's Young Ladies Institute (YLI) will meet this Monday, June 20th, at 6:30 p.m. for refreshments in the North Hall.

New and Continuing Registration Forms are available at the entrances to the Church, in the Parish Office and on our website. *All new registrations must provide a Certificate of Baptism even if the child was baptized at Saint Clare's. First Communion is celebrated during the second year in the program. The child must be at least 7 yrs old.*

### TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION (Marriage...Continued)

When you are thinking about traditions in the Church, 1563 is a "watershed" year. The Council of Trent began a reform of the liturgy that put an end to old practices and set many of our present practices in place.

For the first time, engaged people were absolutely required to appear before their parish priest, and to exchange consent in his presence along with two witnesses. To this day, Catholics are obliged to this form, namely: to marry another Catholic in the presence of a priest (or deacon) and two witnesses, unless dispensed from the law.

The Council really didn't forbid customs and ceremonies that added life to the celebration, but the mood of the times was dark and somewhat austere. Practices like the blessing of the marriage bed or using a canopy for the nuptial blessing started to fade away, as did the custom of bringing the presents for the couple to the church and the addition of fiddlers and jugglers to the procession.

The Council of Trent tried to preserve local customs, but the long-term effect was to standardize celebrations everywhere in the world.

## Scripture Readings for THIS Sunday

**First Reading: Jeremiah 23:1-6**

**Psalm: 23**

**Second Reading: Ephesians 2:13-18**

**Gospel Reading: Mark 6:30-34**

There's a bit of a "missing link" in the first two sentences of today's Gospel from Mark. In the first, the apostles return from having been sent out on mission two by two ("one who is sent" is the meaning of "apostle"). Their instructions were to preach repentance, drive out demons, and heal the sick in Jesus' name. In the second sentence, Jesus tells them to come away with him and rest a while.

It would be nice for us to imagine that, between those two sentences, a look of amazed gratitude and pleasure crossed the face of Jesus as he hears of the kingdom proclaimed in his name, and how they didn't have to shake the dust off their feet anywhere. They deserved a rest!

It might not be bad for us, when we gather together with Jesus as the apostles do today, to do this kind of debriefing, allowing the Lord to hear what we've sought to do in his name, our successes, our failures, our need to get away with him for a while to be fortified for further work in God's name. For we, the baptized, are not only the flock of Jesus Christ; through water and the power of the Spirit we have also become the Body of Christ, the presence of the Shepherd for the life of the world.

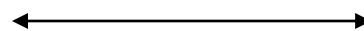
#### Sisterhood of Saint Elisabeth

The sisters of St. Elisabeth Convent, established in 1999, have been rendering spiritual, social and financial assistance to the sick and the suffering in Belarus.

They offer spiritual support and consolation to over 2000 patients in the National Psychiatric Clinic. With 125 young patients in a boarding home for children with special needs, the Sisters help with medicines, hygiene kits, wheelchairs, computers and foodstuffs.

At a charity shelter, over 170 residents receive comprehensive help with accommodation, meals, medicines and help with identification papers. Other help is given to a rehabilitation facility for women, the municipal hospital and a TB clinic.

Icons, crosses, vestments, church goods and other religious items are made with prayer and love in the workshops of the Convent to enable the Sisters' charitable work; in addition, the Sisters travel abroad offering these goods and making people aware of the people who are being served.
