Please join me in welcoming Father Victor Trinidad to our parish. He officially began his ministry here this past Friday, July 1. I know that you will welcome him as warmly as you did me this weekend, two years ago, and that he will be enriched by the life of our parish, just as we will all be enriched by his presence among us.

The gospel reading this Sunday makes me smile, falling as it usually does on the first weekend of July, warning Jesus' disciples: "Go on your way; behold, I am sending you like lambs among wolves." This has never been my experience as I took up a new assignment over the years, and I know that it will not be Father Victor's experience at Saint Clare.

The instruction given by Jesus to the seventy-two disciples is worth repeating today: "Carry no money bag, no sack, no sandals; and greet no one along the way." In other words, travel light and do not get distracted from your mission. In this busy world, we can all learn the simplicity of such discipline, mindful that the Lord who sends us will always be with us.

Another Delay in Church Roof Replacement

Statewide Roofing called to advise us that the re-roofing of the church will not begin until this Tuesday, July 5. It is still expected to take around four weeks to complete the job. With this change, daily Masses – Monday through Friday – will move to the tent on Tuesday, July 5, for the duration of the work.

Eucharistic Renewal

Saint Clare Parish will participate in the national program, “Eucharistic Revival,” to encourage us and all Catholics to deepen our understanding and appreciation of the Eucharist, which began last Sunday, as we celebrated the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (*Corpus Christi*).

As Bishop Cantú announced in December 2021, the Diocese of San José seeks spiritual renewal of our local church at all levels. The Eucharistic Revival is the heart of this renewal, which also includes the 2023 Diocesan Synod to discern the direction of the mission and ministry of the local church in Santa Clara County. Over the next three years, every Catholic parish, school, apostolate, and family are invited to be a part of renewing the Church by enkindling a living relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ in the Eucharist and going out in mission “for the life of the world.”

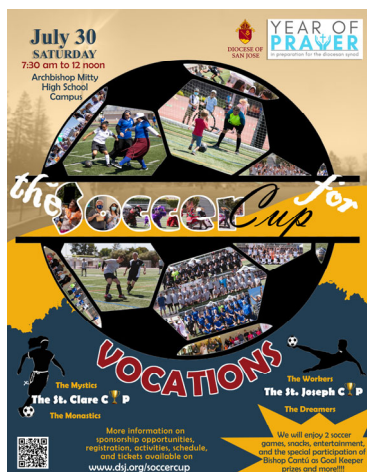

Have you heard about Fair Trade products? Fair Trade allows farmers and farm workers to receive a fair salary—a just salary—not just the minimum that consumers are willing to pay which often is not enough to live on. When they enjoy better living conditions, farmers and farmworkers may avail themselves of health services and send their children to school (rather than keeping them on the farm to work from a very young age). The leading Fair Trade products are coffee and chocolate, but there are also teas, rice, spices, and bananas. Look for the “Fair Trade” logo and encourage a fair business in the name of the God who loves justice.

in preparation for the diocesan synod

Diocesan Year of Prayer

A message from Bishop Oscar Cantú:

Not only will we participate in the universal synod in a few months, but in preparation for our 50th anniversary, I invite us all – laity, religious, and clergy – to participate in our first Diocesan Synod, which will begin in Advent 2022. In this Diocesan Synod, I will invite us to reflect on the question, “where does our local Church of San José need to be in 10 years to live and proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ effectively in Silicon Valley into the future? Moreover, to be faithful to the mission of Jesus Christ, what do we need to do differently? What strengths can we leverage? What obstacles must we overcome? Do we need to pivot from old ministries to new ones? These are all broad questions, and I’m sure, with thoughtful prayer, there will be various and creative ideas to offer. We will surface those ideas and then enter a process of discerning the voice of the Holy Spirit amid the many voices.

To begin to prepare ourselves and our Diocese for our 50th Jubilee, I invite us all – laity, religious, and clergy – to participate in a **Year of Prayer** to convoke the **Holy Spirit** in our discernment process. The Holy Spirit inspires, strengthens, and guides the Church, and we need to listen prayerfully to the Spirit’s promptings so that our Diocese might embark on a journey of faith that is “ever ancient, ever new.” Pope Francis reminds us that God is God of surprises. It is in the spirit of prayer that we can prepare our hearts and our “spiritual ears” to hear his voice and to respond with courage, wonder, faith, and zeal.

Young Adults and Parents

For young people, that they will know the importance of their voices, their experiences and the ways that the Lord speaks to and through them.

That young parents, open to the gift of life, may not despair in face of the difficulties that face them, but discern in their lives the abiding presence of God in and through them.

Grandparents and Elderly

For an appreciation of the lived experience of our elders, turning to them for wisdom as we walk together the path of listening and hearing one another.

That our grandparents, aware of our love for them, may rejoice in the gift of their sons and daughters and granddaughters and grandsons, who turn to them for encouragement to pursue the highest good.

California Bishops Commit to Working for Better Futures for California's Women, Children, and Families

The approaching 49th anniversary of Roe v. Wade comes at a historic moment. The nation stands on the precipice of potentially overturning Roe v. Wade. At the same time, the Governor and state legislators have issued calls to make California a "sanctuary" destination for women seeking abortions from in and out of state.

However, asking to increase the number of abortions in California completely misses a vital, life-affirming point. California is already uniquely situated to respond actively to the needs of women, children, and families. Over the years, the California Catholic Conference has supported the state's dynamic efforts to build programs for our most vulnerable populations, lifting families out of poverty and affirming the inherent dignity of each person.

Furthermore, the Catholic Church is the largest provider of private social services in California. We serve millions of the most at-risk families through our Catholic Charities and diocesan ministries, our Catholic hospitals and healthcare systems, and our Catholic schools and parishes.

With Pope Francis, we believe that abortion attacks the "sacredness of human life," and that "it is not 'progressive' to try to resolve problems by eliminating a human life." At this pivotal moment, we, the Bishops of the Dioceses of California, commit to a vision for our state that honors women with life-affirming support and practical resources so that all families can thrive, and so that no woman feels trapped into the devastating decision to end a life by abortion.

El 49º aniversario de Roe v. Wade llega en un momento histórico. El país se encuentra en el precipicio de la posible anulación de Roe v. Wade. Al mismo tiempo, el gobernador y los legisladores estatales han hecho llamados para convertir a California en un destino "santuario" para las mujeres que buscan abortos dentro y fuera del estado.

Precisa-se de mensageiros de Deus que venham trazer e anunciar a Sua paz, porque o nosso mundo precisa urgentemente de paz. Amaranhados e desorientados as pessoas ficam com tanta comunicação orientada para os interesses dos governos, das grandes companhias e empresas, as pessoas perdem-se no remoinho de tanta desinformação. É necessário nos nossos tempos homens e mulheres dedicados a servir o povo de Deus e serem meios de ajuda espiritual neste labirinto destruidor dos valores cristãos, meios de divulgação da mensagem de paz e de amor de Deus para a humanidade.
