The readings this Third Sunday of Lent cover much ground in the history of salvation. In the story of Moses and the burning bush, we hear of God's love for the people of Israel: "I have witnessed the affliction of my people in Egypt and have heard their cry of complaint against their slave drivers, so I know well what they are suffering." Psalm 103 declares that "The Lord is kind and merciful," yet the reading from the first letter of Saint Paul to the Corinthians warns against the kind of infidelity that Israel practiced in the desert with the caution that "anyone who thinks to be standing secure should take care not to fall."

Jesus warns of the need to repent, otherwise, "You will all perish," telling the parable of the fig tree that had not borne fruit: "'For three years now I have come in search of fruit on this fig tree but have found none. So cut it down. Why should it exhaust the soil?' He [the gardener] said to him [the owner of the orchard] in reply, 'Sir, leave it for this year also, and I shall cultivate the ground around it and fertilize it; it may bear fruit in the future. If not you can cut it down.'"

Even for our kind and merciful God, revealed most fully in Jesus, there comes the day of reckoning. So let us hear the call of Ash Wednesday, and of all of Lent, to "repent and believe" and live in the Lord.

URGENT NEED IN UKRAINE



Catholic Relief Services (CRS) in recent weeks has increased its presence in Ukraine, Moldova, Romania, and Poland. CRS is supporting Caritas Ukraine by providing shelter, food and livelihood support for those displaced and affected by the war. CRS is also helping Caritas partners in Moldova, Romania, and Poland to prepare for displaced people, mapping out a likely initial response and conducting assessment and planning sessions with its network near Ukraine's borders.

Weekly Justice Challenge

As we enter more deeply into Lent, we recall Jesus washing the feet of his apostles. This action contains two essential challenges for those who seek justice in the world: the challenge to serve and the challenge to be served. Jesus sets the example to serve in ways that may seem to be beneath us and calls Peter to accept service. Many great leaders, even in the corporate world, spend some of their time doing the work of the lowest paid person in the organization as an important reminder that all work is valuable. This act is also a beautiful sign that the service of these all-too-often forgotten people is well-received by the leader. Step out of your comfort zone this week and do a task that may seem to be beneath you. Experience the dignity in your simple service.

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THIS WEEK AT HOME

Monday, March 21 Attending to the Ordinary

The Gospel today notes how those with no status, such as an unknown widow, a leper, and a man from Nazareth, were overlooked. No one saw their greatness. The living God works in and through every part of creation, most notably through human beings. Pay attention to all the ways that God presents himself to you in ordinary ways—the sunrise, a budding plant, the person behind the counter when you get lunch, the laugh of a family member. *Today's readings: 2 Kings 5:1–15ab; Psalm 42:2, 3; 43:3, 4; Luke 4:24–30.*

Tuesday, March 22 How Many Times?

How many times should we forgive? Jesus says seventy-seven times. Furthermore, he doesn't mean an exact count either! If we are to expect God to forgive us, we must be willing to forgive others. Set aside time today for journaling, reflecting upon, and writing about any grudges you are holding or past grievances you have not released. Forgive in your heart, and vow to keep the grievance in the past. *Today's readings: Daniel 3:25, 34–43; Psalm 25:4–5ab, 6 and 7bc, 8 and 9; Matthew 18:21–35.*

Wednesday, March 23 The Greatest

Greatness often is associated with accomplishments, athleticism, or scholarship. Jesus presents another vision in the Gospel. He tells us that to be the greatest in the kingdom, we need only to follow God's commandments and teach others to do the same. The best way to teach is by example. Be mindful that your actions and words show love for God and your neighbor. *Today's readings: Deuteronomy 4:1, 5–9; Psalm 147:12–13, 15–16, 19–20; Matthew 5:17–19.*

Thursday, March 24

Listen, and Listen Again

Jesus strongly tells us that a kingdom divided against itself cannot survive. If hearts are hardened against God's Word, we cannot be unified—as a community, a country, or a Church. Pray for unity today, that we will listen to the voice of God and open our hearts to God and one another. *Today's readings: Jeremiah 7:23–28; Psalm 95:1–2; 6–7; 8–9; Luke 11:14–23.*

Friday, March 25

Annunciation of the Lord

Today we hear the story of Mary's encounter with the angel Gabriel, when Mary said yes to God's will. Mary's courage, faithfulness, and humility are examples for all seeking to live as disciples. The annunciation is the first of the joyful mysteries. (The other mysteries are the visitation, the nativity, the presentation in the temple, and the finding in the temple.) Pray the Rosary, reflecting on each joyful mystery. *Today's readings: Isaiah 7:10–14; 8:10; Psalm 40:7–8a, 8b–9, 10, 11; Hebrews 10:4–10; Luke 1:26–38.*

Saturday, March 26

Steadfast Love

The Pharisee was sure of his worthiness, while the tax collector was just as sure of his sinfulness. Though the Pharisee fasted, paid tithes, and kept the law, it was the tax collector who went home justified. Our God of steadfast love and mercy welcomes back sinners who seek forgiveness. Do not be afraid to acknowledge your sins and receive God's mercy and forgiveness through the sacrament of reconciliation. Check neighboring parishes and your own for schedules for confession. God will heal and bind up the wounds of contrite sinners. *Today's readings: Hosea 6:1–6; Psalm 51:3–4, 18–19, 20–21ab; Luke 18:9–14.*





De Monseñor Fran Cilia

Las lecturas de este tercer domingo de Cuaresma cubren mucho terreno en la historia de la salvación. En la historia de Moisés y la zarza ardiente, escuchamos el amor de Dios por el pueblo de Israel: "He sido testigo de la aflicción de mi pueblo en Egipto y he oído su clamor de queja contra sus negreros, así que sé bien lo que están sufriendo." El Salmo 103 declara que "El Señor es bueno y misericordioso", pero la lectura de la primera carta de San Pablo a los Corintios advierte contra el tipo de infidelidad que Israel practicó en el desierto con la advertencia de que "cualquiera que piense estar seguro hay que tener cuidado de no caer."

Jesús advierte de la necesidad de arrepentirse, de lo contrario, "todos perecerán", contando la parábola de la higuera que no había dado fruto: "Hace tres años que vengo a buscar fruto en esta higuera, pero no he encontrado ninguna. Así que córtalo. ¿Por qué ha de agotar el suelo?" Él [el jardinero] le dijo [al dueño del huerto] en respuesta: 'Señor, déjalo también para este año, y yo cultivaré el suelo alrededor de él y lo fertilizaré; puede dar frutos en el futuro. Si no, puedes cortarlo'".

Incluso para nuestro Dios bondadoso y misericordioso, revelado más plenamente en Jesús, llega el día del juicio final. Así que escuchemos el llamado del Miércoles de Ceniza, y de toda la Cuaresma, a "arrepentirse y creer" y vivir en el Señor.

A liturgia deste Terceiro Domingo da Quaresma fala-nos da misericórdia de Deus. Compreende-se claramente essa misericórdia no dono da figueira que acede ao pedido do trabalhador de dar mais um ano para que esta frutifique. Assim também é Deus com cada um de nós em dar oportunidades de nos arrepender-mos e de termos fé na Sua misericórdia. Tal como a figueira, somos pertença de Deus e consequentemente nascidos e criados para dar-mos fruto. O Espírito Santo de Deus acumula-nos de doms; esses doms são os frutos que se devem repartir e de graça dar áqueles que nos rodeiam e deles necessitam. Retendo-os estamos a ser egoistas, preguiçosos, apegados ao mundo e aos seus vícios.
