

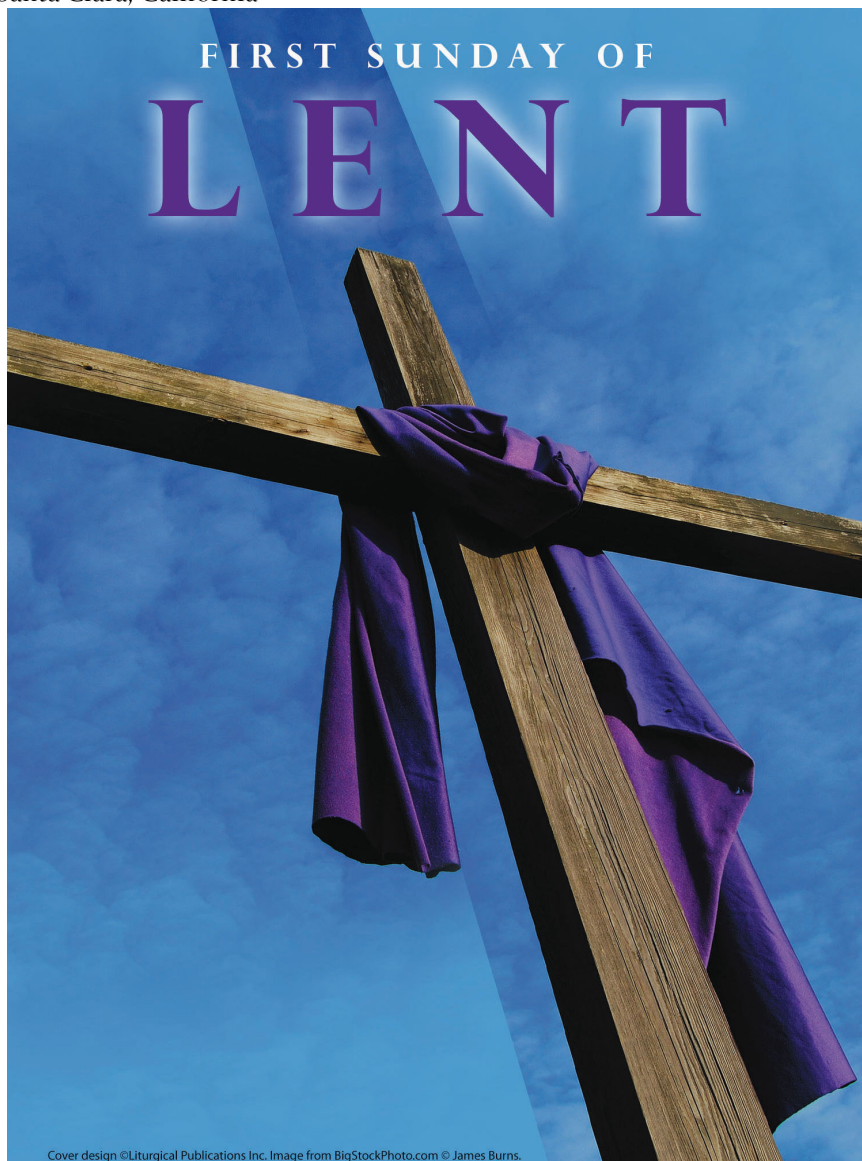

This First Sunday of Lent transports us to the desert where Jesus was tested by “every temptation.” In the course of His forty days in the desert, Jesus remained faithful to the Father. Our Lenten journey serves to strengthen us, also, to be faithful to the Baptism we share.

During Lent, the traditional practices of prayer, penance and care for the poor are the means by which we strive to mature in Christian living. It is also a time of special prayer for those who will approach the waters of Baptism at Easter. May our efforts, under the guidance of the Holy Spirit, encourage them on their way to union with Christ and the Church.

In keeping with the Church’s traditional practice, the Fridays of Lent (except for March 25, the Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord) and Good Friday are days of abstinence from all meat and Good Friday is also a day of fasting, as was Ash Wednesday, for those between 18 and 59 years old.

**About the Lifting of the Dispensation from Sunday and Holy Day Mass Obligation**

Although Bishop Cantú has lifted the general dispensation regarding Sunday and Holy Day Masses, those whose health is impaired continue to be encouraged to remain home, to participate in our Masses via livestream or recordings.

While we look forward to welcoming all of our parishioners back to Sunday Mass, we remain sensitive to those who, for reasons of health, choose to stay home. At the same time, we pray that circumstances will soon allow them to be with us.

Trusting in God



*Today's readings: Deuteronomy 26:4–10; Psalm 91:1–2, 10–11, 12–13, 4–15; Romans 10:8–13; Luke 4:1–13.* Each year on the First Sunday of Lent, we hear the account of Jesus spending forty days in the desert. From the Gospel we learn that our Lord didn't just wander into this desolate land but was led by the Spirit. Jesus trusted that the Spirit would help him through the difficult time ahead.

After long days and nights of fasting in the desert, Jesus was hungry when the devil appeared. The devil challenged Jesus to turn stones into bread, to worship him, and to test God's loving care. At every turn, Jesus knew the Spirit was within him, and that his Father was close.

Confident that he would receive strength to sustain him, he did not yield to temptation.

In the first reading, we hear the prayer that the Israelite said while offering the firstfruits of the harvest. This prayer told of trust in God, who heard the cry of the afflicted, brought the Israelites out of Egypt, and led his people to a land of milk and honey. During Lent, we learn again to place our trust in God, for as St. Paul says in the second reading, "Everyone who calls upon the Lord will be saved." When we cry out in distress, as our ancestors did, we will be heard. With such knowledge, we pray with the psalmist, "Be with me, Lord, when I am in trouble."

Este Primer Domingo de Cuaresma nos transporta al desierto donde Jesús fue probado por “toda tentación”. En el transcurso de sus cuarenta días en el desierto, Jesús permaneció fiel al Padre. Nuestro camino de Cuaresma sirve para fortalecernos, también, a ser fieles al Bautismo que compartimos.

Durante la Cuaresma, las prácticas tradicionales de oración, penitencia y cuidado de los pobres son los medios por los cuales nos esforzamos para madurar viviendo cristianamente. Es también un tiempo de oración especial para quienes se acercarán a las aguas del Bautismo en Pascua. Que nuestros esfuerzos, bajo la guía del Espíritu Santo, los animen en su camino hacia la unión con Cristo y la Iglesia.

De acuerdo con la práctica tradicional de la Iglesia, los viernes de Cuaresma (excepto el 25 de marzo, solemnidad de la Anunciación del Señor) y el Viernes Santo son días de abstinencia de toda carne y El Viernes Santo también es un día de ayuno, como lo fue el miércoles de ceniza, para aquellos entre 18 y 59 años.

Esperamos dar la bienvenida a todos nuestros feligreses nuevamente a la misa dominical, nos mantenemos sensibles a aquellos que, por razones de salud, eligen quedarse en casa. Al mismo tiempo, rezamos para que las circunstancias les permitan estar pronto con nosotros.

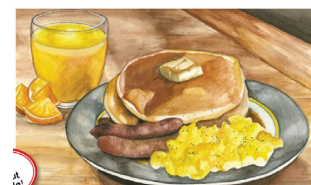

## **Boletim Paroquial Português**

Domingo I da Quaresma– C

*Reflexão por: João Pereira Arruda*

Na última Quarta-Feira demos entrada no Tempo da Quaresma. Quarenta dias que nos desafiam a nos concentrar em darmos uma “limpeza” às impurezas que limitam-nos e nos atolham os movimentos a sermos melhores, que impedem a nossa proximidade com Deus, em que o desânimo nos imperra de nos doar-mos com os nossos dons a Deus e aos irmãos, às causas da igreja, da comunidade, às causas sociais e religiosas. Quaresma é o tempo favorável para rever-mos o nosso interior, limpar as teias que nos fazem “brandinhos” para uma vida activa cristã e cidadão activo e idóneo da comunidade em que se vive. Abrimos este Tempo Quaresmal com uma profissão de fé na oferta das primícias colhidas da terra. Entramos na Quarta-Feira dizendo: “Lembras-te que és pó e ao pó hás-de voltar” ! Assim é porque do barro (terra) o homem foi formado e no barro será enterrado. O tempo entre o nascer fica á conta de gerirmos a nossa vida em contínua ação de graças ao Pai que nos criou, ao Filho que nos resgatou do pecado, nos justificou e nos legou a promessa da ressurreição e ao Espírito Santo que continuamente nos defende e nos dá vida activa enquanto vivemos. Fazemos esta caminhada Quaresmal acompanhados por esse Deus Trinitário que nunca nos abandona pois aí está o amor perfeito e misericordioso de Deus; que alimente as nossas vidas na terra e nos garante uma vida que não acaba aqui neste mundo mas no Céu na morada que o Pai nos prepara para cada um de nós. Este Tempo Quaresmal convida-nos á conversão e mudança de vida, é p próprio Jesus que diz: “Cumpru-se o tempoe está próximo o reino de Deus. Arrependei-vos e acreditai no Evangelho”. Durante esta caminhada que iremos percorrer até chegar á Festa das Festas: a Páscoa da Ressurreição iremos ser tentados pelo maligno tal qual Jesus o foi no deserto. O Demónio procurou exercer tentações de necessidade básica (fome), riqueza “se prostradesdiante de mim e me adorares te darei todos os reinados da terra, de poder fantasmagórico; “se te atirares do cimo deste templo os anjos e arcanjos do Céu te livrarão de caires” é a tentação do poder. Por assim ser iremos também ser experimentados e sem a ajuda de Deus de certo que muito fãcilmente cairemos nas diversas ciladas e tentações que o demónio tem á sua disposição pera nos perder. No nosso caminhar sejamos prudentes, sejamos diligentes a ter Jesus Cristo nas nossas vidas através da oração diária (que esta seja mais assídua) neste Tempo Quaresmal. Que tenhamos vontade de nos doar-mos generosamente em actividades de voluntariado em actividades que servem as necessidades da comunidade em que se vive. Usemos e participemos nos programas que a nossa paróquia oferece durante esse tempo quaresmal, os livros as devoções de vias-sacras, a peregrinação quaresmal ás igrejas de Santa Clara, programa tigela de arroz; tudo isso e mais quando feitas com amor ; tiram a oportunidade ao maligno de nos fazer mal. Façamos todos os esforços possíveis para termos a presença de Jesus nas nossas vidas, no nosso coração, nesta nossa caminhada Quaresmal.
