“Do not be afraid. I am the first and the last, the one who lives. Once I was dead, but now I am alive forever and ever” (Revelation 1:17b-18).

For the Church, the great Easter Feast extends for 50 days, until Pentecost, this year on June 5. But the “day” of Easter itself lasts until this Sunday, which we call the Second Sunday of Easter. This is the greatest of our holy days. Even Christmas Day is only one day, but Easter Day is eight days. In fact, it takes that long for us at our daily Masses to hear all of the Easter appearances of the Lord.

While we are not literally at the empty tomb, in the garden, the upper room or on the road to Emmaus, the Risen Lord continues to make Himself present to us – in His word, the Eucharist, and the Christian Community, especially when gathered for the celebration of the Eucharist. As He lives “forever and ever,” He sends us forth, as disciples, to announce the good news (“gospel”) that the Lord is risen and, even more, that we also will rise.

Our parish Easter celebrations were the cause of great joy last weekend. It was the first time since the pandemic that we experienced a full church. I pray that this continues, even when it is not Easter Sunday. It was so good to see all of you!!

The priests of our Diocese will be in San Juan Bautista **from May 9 through May 12**, for this year's Clergy Study Week. During that week, there will be no Mass on Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday. There will be Masses, however, on Monday and Friday mornings.

Collection for Diocesan Priests' Retirement Fund

In two weeks, Good Shepherd Sunday, May 8, not only will we be observing Mother's Day, but also taking up our annual collection to benefit the Retirement Fund for the priests of the Diocese of San José. Due to the aging of our priests and underperforming investments over many years, there is currently a considerable "unfunded liability." This has resulted in annual increases in the amount that parishes are charged for each active priest. This year, it will increase more than 25% to \$32,033. Last year, Saint Clare collected more than \$3700 for the Retirement Fund. This was truly amazing. Thanks for your prayerful consideration of what you will be able to contribute on May 8.

THIS WEEK AT HOME

Monday, April 25

Gospel Boldness

What does it mean today to speak the Word of God with boldness? To embrace a life that is based on Gospel values? Living out Gospel values can bring a beacon of hope to others. In the face of anger and hatred, such a way of living means to choose to love; in the face of weariness and sickness, it means to be a healing presence. Whenever we choose to hope, to love, and to heal, our faith is lived out loud. Such a faith alerts others to the presence of God. *Today's readings: 1 Peter 5:5b–14; Psalm 89:2–3, 6–7, 16–17; Mark 16:15–20.*

Tuesday, April 26

Creating a Community of Love

“The community of believers was of one heart and mind,” we hear in the reading from Acts. Imagine the Church acting with “one heart and mind.” The possibilities are limitless. The poor among us would be cared for, those in need of comfort and healing would find a place to rest, there would be no one marginalized because everyone would be welcomed. Pay attention to those who enter your life and how you welcome them. Your welcome reveals God’s love. *Today's readings: Acts 4:32–37; Psalm 93:1ab, 1cd–2, 5; John 3:7b–15.*

Wednesday, April 27

God So Loved the World

“For God so loved the world that he gave his only-begotten Son” has been heralded on posters, billboards, and T-shirts. As today’s Gospel states, it is up to believers to live out the truth of God’s love. Keep in mind that you reflect God’s light and love in how you greet others, show compassion, and offer encouragement. *Today's readings: Acts 5:17–26; Psalm 34:2–3, 4–5, 6–7, 8–9; John 3:16–21.*

Thursday, April 28

Open to the Spirit

In the first reading, the apostles tell the Sanhedrin of the witness of the Holy Spirit; in the Gospel, Jesus says that the gift of the Spirit is not rationed. This Holy Spirit surrounds us in every moment, energizing us to offer to our world mercy and compassion. Pray to the Spirit for courage to live the Gospel in word and action. *Today's readings: Acts 5:27–33; Psalm 34:2 and 9, 17–18, 19–20; John 3:31–36.*

Friday, April 29

Grace in Abundance

Many people worry about scarcity. They are concerned that they do not have enough and even that they do not love enough. God’s grace, though, is available in abundance. In today’s Gospel, we hear of the apostles’ concern that there was not enough food for the crowd. Jesus, however, provides more than enough for all to have their fill. He takes precious little food and transforms it into a feast that yielded twelve baskets of food when all had eaten. Imagine what God can do with our lives when we are open to transformation. *Today's readings: Acts 5:34–42; Psalm 27:1, 4, 13–14; John 6:1–15.*

Saturday, April 30

A Simple Prayer

Any parent or guardian stays constantly alert to the well-being of their children. Why is it so hard to imagine that God does the same with us? As God’s children, we are not unlike the disciples in the boat: sometimes we get tossed about by life and feel anxious. As the disciples discovered, Jesus was not far away. Just as Jesus calls out and reassures the disciples, he does so with us. When you are facing a moment of fear, pray, “Jesus, I trust in you!” *Today's readings: Acts 6:1–7; Psalm 33:1–2, 4–5, 18–19; John 6:16–21.*

Sábado, 30 de abril

Oración simple

Todo padre o tutor se mantiene siempre alerta cuando se trata del bienestar de sus hijos. ¿Por qué es tan difícil imaginar que Dios haga lo mismo con nosotros? Los hijos de Dios no somos diferentes de los discípulos en la barca: a veces la vida nos golpea y nos sentimos ansiosos. Como descubrieron los discípulos, Jesús no estaba lejos. Así como Jesús llama y tranquiliza a los discípulos, lo hace con nosotros. Cuando usted experimente un momento de miedo, ore: “¡Jesús, en tí confío!” *Lecturas de hoy: Hechos 6:1-7; Salmo 33:1-2, 4-5, 18-19; Juan 6:16-21.*

Para la Iglesia, la gran fiesta pascual se extiende por 50 días, hasta Pentecostés, este año el 5 de junio. Pero el "día" de la Pascua misma dura hasta este domingo, que llamamos segundo domingo de Pascua. Este es el más grande de nuestros días santos. Incluso el día de Navidad es solo un día, pero el día de Pascua es de ocho días. De hecho, nos toma todo ese tiempo en nuestras Misas diarias escuchar todas las apariciones pascuales del Señor.

Esto ha resultado en aumentos anuales en la cantidad que se cobra a las parroquias por cada sacerdote activo. Este año, aumentará más del 25% a \$32,033. El año pasado, Saint Clare recaudó más de \$3700 para el Fondo de Jubilación. Esto fue realmente asombroso. Gracias por su consideración en oración de lo que podrá contribuir el 8 de mayo.

Domingo II da Páscoa – C e da Divina Misericórdia

Celebração do 44º Aniversário da Sociedade Filarmónica União Portuguesa de Santa Clara

Neste Domingo os cristãos recebem uma mensagem clara de Jesus Cristo depois da Festa da Sua Ressurreição: *“Não sejas incrédulo mas crente”*. É este um apelo aos cristãos para acreditarem na vida eterna, para acreditarem no Ressuscitado que vive entre nós na Sagrada Eucaristia. Ter fé é acreditar naquilo que não se vê e Tomé só

acreditou quando viu Jesus com o sinal das escoriações e chagas da Sua morte. E exclamou: *“Meu Senhor e meu Deus!”*. Infelizmente muitos cristãos deixam de ter fé, desanimam sempre que a vida não lhes é favorecida aos seus caprichos carnisais ou sonhos de poder e riqueza. Neste Domingo meditemos na importância da saudação de Jesus aos seus Apóstolos e Discípulos: *“A paz esteja convosco”* Tal como Jesus o Sacerdote usa no Santo Sacrifício da missa essa mesma saudação várias vezes todas elas para nos sugerir de viver em paz com Deus e os irmãos. Para nos advertir que só na paz Deus está connosco. É uma advertência para escolhermos a dar valor á paz e á concórdia e a paz só acontece quando a partir dos governantes advém canais que promovam a justiça e a equidade aos seus povos. 
