

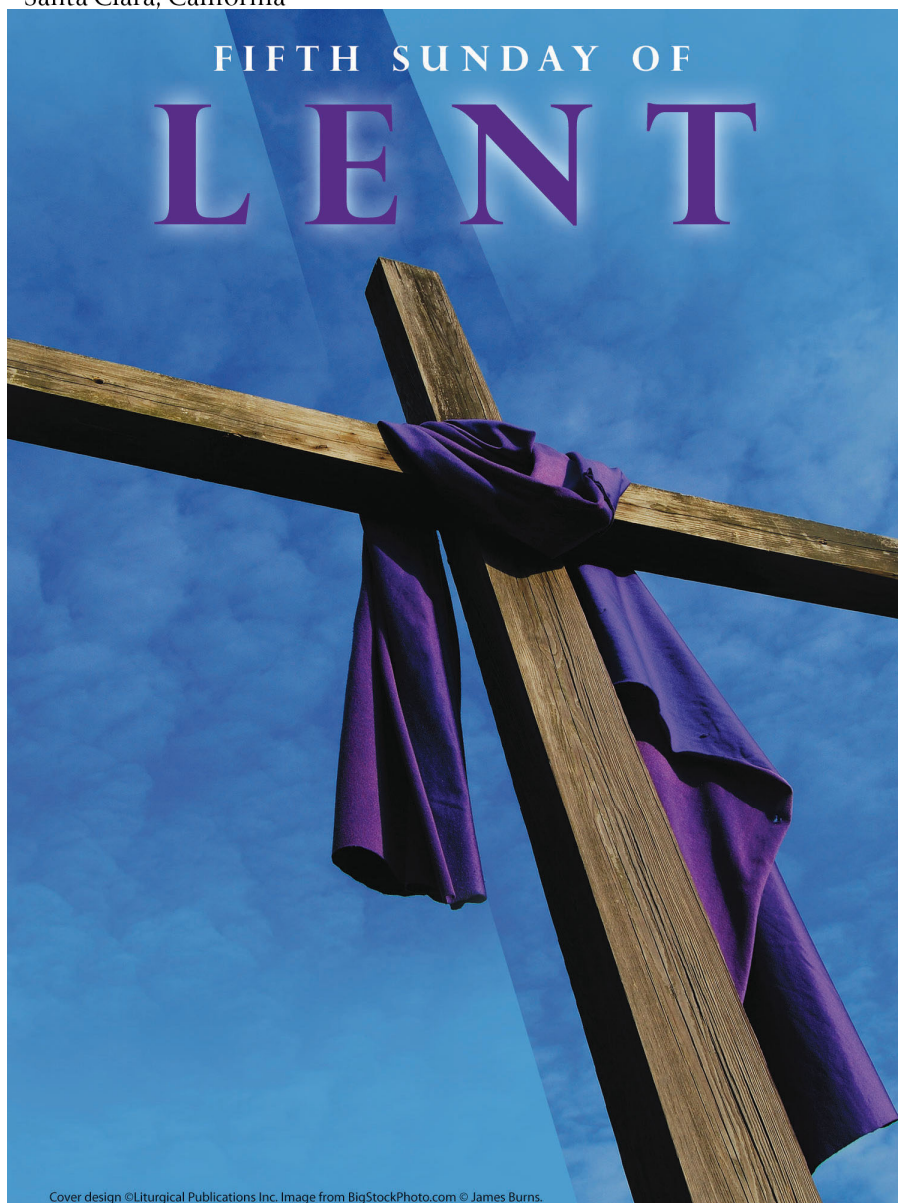

## **From Monsignor Fran Cilia**

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The “water in the desert and rivers in the wasteland” that God promised through the prophet Isaiah was referring to forgiving the forsaken, the lost, and the hopeless. This is borne out in Jesus’ treatment of the woman caught in adultery, whom the scribes and Pharisees wanted to stone to death: “Has no one condemned you? . . . Neither do I condemn you.”

In rejecting the penalty prescribed by the Law, Jesus chooses mercy . . . for the woman and for each of us. If we had been in the crowd that day, could any of us claim to be sinless, to be able to cast the first stone? Only in recognizing our own sins and failings can we also recognize God’s limitless forgiveness. . . and become that same for- giveness for one another.

**This coming Saturday afternoon, we will celebrate our Lenten Reconciliation Liturgy. During the pandemic – and for a good number of years previous to it – many have neglected celebration of the sacrament. As we heard on Ash Wednesday, “Now is the acceptable time. . . Now is the day of salvation.” Join us next Saturday at 3:00 pm, in the Church. We will have a number of visiting priests to serve as confessors.**

## **Next Sunday – Palm Sunday**

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All of the Masses of Palm Sunday will begin with the Blessing of Palms and Procession into the Church. Please gather in the Grotto area as you arrive at church. Those who have issues of mobility should go directly to the church and be with us “in spirit” for the Blessing and Procession. Since our liturgies will last a little longer, due to these opening rites and the proclamation of the Passion, we will do our best to begin on time to allow some time between the Masses.

## **Annual Diocesan Appeal**

## Looking Ahead to the Easter Triduum. . .

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On **Holy Thursday, April 14**, the *Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper* will be celebrated at 7:30 pm. It will include the "Mandatum" (Washing of Feet) and the procession to the Altar of Repose in the Tent. This Mass will be tri-lingual (English, Spanish and Portuguese).

On **Good Friday, April 15**, we will celebrate the *Liturgy of the Lord's Passion* (Liturgy of the Word, Adoration of the

Cross and Holy Communion) at 12:00 noon and 5:30 pm in English and at 7:00 pm in Spanish.

The tri-lingual **Holy Saturday Easter Vigil Liturgy** (Service of Light, Liturgy of the Word, Liturgy of Baptism and Liturgy of the Eucharist) will begin outdoors with the Blessing of the New Fire at 8:30 pm.

On **Easter Sunday**, we will follow the usual Sunday Mass schedule. Masses will include the Renewal of Baptismal Promises and Sprinkling with Easter Water.

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It is not too early to be thinking about decorating the Altar of Repose on Holy Thursday. This year, the Altar will be in the Tent. ### Weekly Justice Challenge

Justice Challenge: What is the role of anger and rage in our lives? What purpose does it serve? We often think that when we feel anger, we need to express it... we need to get it out of our system. Perhaps anger has a different purpose as Jesus suggests to the angry crowd that is about to hurl stones at the guilty woman. Perhaps anger is a signal that there is something wrong inside of us, some pain that has surfaced because we have witnessed an injustice in the world and our consciences are feeling pricked. Anger can trick us into thinking that the injustice is outside of us or that we are above it. But Jesus suggests that when we seek justice with anger, rage, or revenge, we should use our anger to look within and hurl stones at our own sin. The challenge this week is to address the injustice that has root in our own souls.

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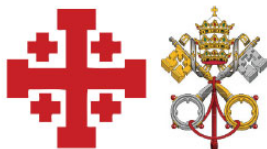

## WHAT HAS BEEN ACCOMPLISHED?

## De Monseñor Fran Cilia

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El “agua en el desierto y los ríos en la tierra baldía” que Dios prometido para el profeta Isaías se refería a perdonar a los desamparados, los perdidos y los desesperados. Esto se confirma en el trato de Jesús a mujer sorprendida en adulterio, a quien los escribas y fariseos querían apedrear hasta la muerte: “¿Nadie te ha condenado? . . . Yo tampoco te condeno.”

Al rechazar la pena prescrita por la Ley, Jesús elige la misericordia. . . para la mujer y para cada uno de nosotros. Si hubiéramos estado en la multitud ese día, ¿podría alguno de nosotros afirmar estar sin pecado, para poder tirar la primera piedra? Sólo reconociendo nuestros propios pecados y fallas podemos también reconocer el perdón ilimitado de Dios. . . y llegar a ser ese mismo perdón el uno para el otro.

**Este próximo sábado por la tarde, celebraremos nuestra Liturgia de Reconciliación de Cuaresma. Durante la pandemia, y por un buen número de años anteriores a ella – muchos han descuidado la celebración del sacramento. Como escuchamos el Miércoles de Ceniza, “Ahora es el tiempo aceptable. . . Ahora es el día de salvación.” Únase a nosotros el próximo Sábado a las 3:00 pm, en la Iglesia. Tendremos una serie de sacerdotes visitantes para servir como confesores.**

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Todas las Misas del Domingo de Ramos comenzarán con la Bendición de las Palmas y la Procesión hacia la Iglesia. Recomenda-se que a soma total colhida na tigela seja esse total convertido em cheque. (5) Estejam atentos que as celebrações do Tríduo Pascal podem se feitas em lugares diferentes tal como : a igreja, a tenda e até o Salão Paroquial. (6) Enquanto que em muitos locais o uso da máscara esteja retirado na nossa igreja e em qualquer celebração ou serviço litúrgico tem que se usar a máscara. Pelo que se sabe a pandemia não acabou e requiere-se cautela e boas práticas saudáveis são sugeridas pelo pastor da nossa paróquia.
