

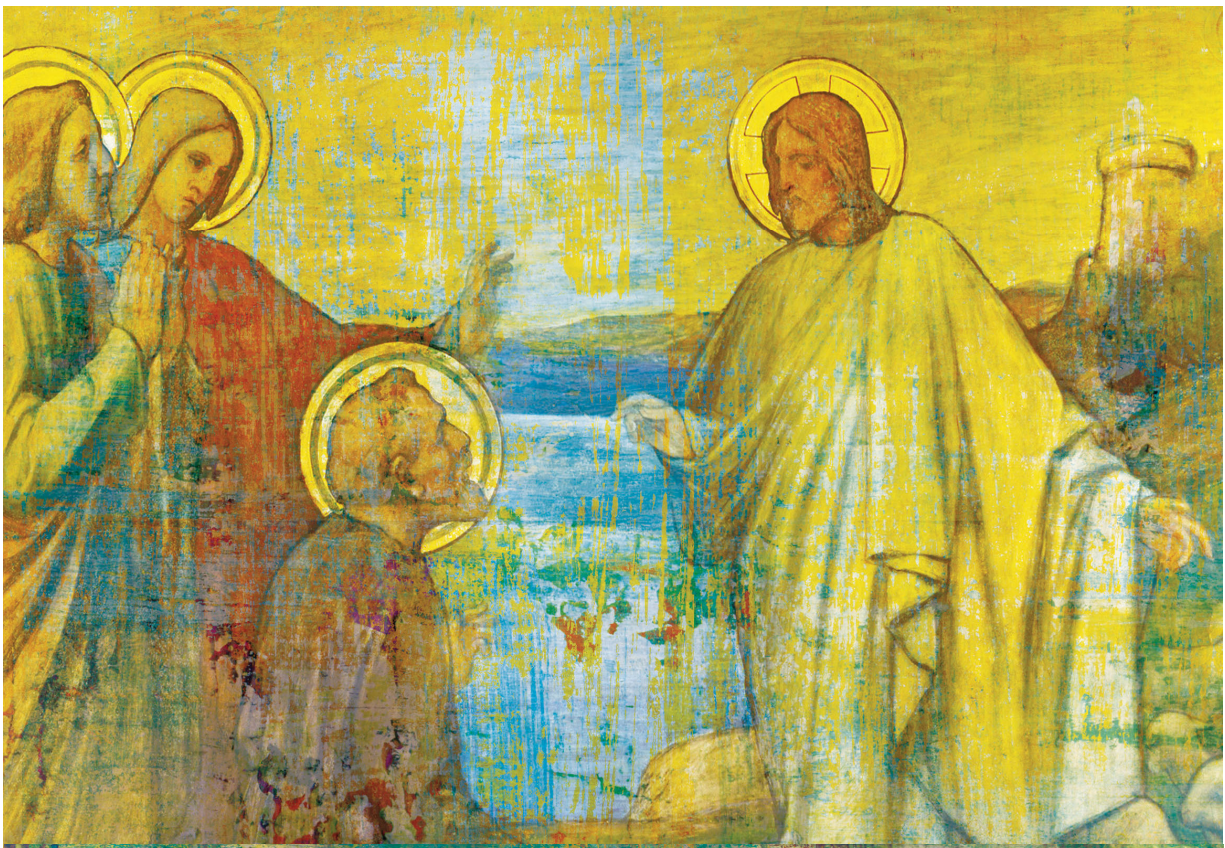

Jesus' three questions to Simon Peter, asking him, "Do you love me?" must have been painful for Peter to hear. But, in fact, the Lord was giving but another example of God's tremendous willingness to forgive, no matter how many times we stray. Three times, Peter had denied knowing Jesus. And after Peter declares the third time, "Yes Lord, you know that I love you," Jesus called to him again, "Follow me."

For us, to know that "God's mercy is without end" is one of the foundations of our lives. It gives us hope and should endow us with a willingness to forgive those who have offended or hurt us. Being part of a reconciling community of faith demands no less of us. That Christ is victorious over sin and death allows us, in Him, to do the same. Then we can share the joy of the Resurrection.

Congratulations to the children who will receive Holy Communion for the first time this weekend and next. We pray that you will remain as close to the Lord in the years to come as you are with him on this special day.

Communion for Celiac/Gluten-Intolerant Individuals

A number of people have been diagnosed as gluten-intolerant. For them even the amount of gluten in a regular host poses a health risk. The Church allows us to consecrate low-gluten hosts, that contain only trace amounts of gluten. If this is a concern to you or a family member, please approach Msgr. Fran. We can determine if the low-gluten option would work for you. Since we have a supply of low-gluten hosts, it is only a matter of letting us know which Mass you would be at, so that the proper host could be consecrated for you.

Church discipline does not allow us to consecrate "no-gluten" hosts. For those who cannot tolerate even the smallest amount of gluten, there are other options for receiving Holy Communion, which we are happy to explore with you.

Clergy Study Week – No Daily Masses

The priests of our Diocese will be in San Juan Bautista from May 9 through May 12, for this year's Clergy Study Week. During that week, there will be no Mass on Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday. There will be Masses, however, on Monday and Friday mornings.

ADA Wrap-Up – Final Report

With the completion of the active phase of this year's Annual Diocesan Appeal, we have received 256 pledges and gifts, totaling \$146,830 (as of April 25). Our diocesan goal this year is \$85,674, so the parish stands to receive more than \$60,000 in rebate, which is dedicated to the new roof for the church, to be installed this summer. Thank you to all who participated in this year's Appeal. If you have not and would still like to do so, your gifts, too, would be most welcome.

Creation Care Tips



“When they had gone ashore, they saw a charcoal fire there, with fish on it, and bread. Jesus said to them, ‘Bring some of the fish that you have just caught.’” —John 21:9-10

Mmm! The enticing smell of a barbecue! This summer activity reminds us of how our ancestors cooked. Even though charcoal grills are not recommended for environmental reasons now, if you still want to cook out, its impact on the environment can be reduced. First, don't barbecue on days when there is a smog alert. Use a barbecue that suits your needs, buying a small one or lighting just one burner for smaller portions. One 20-liter bottle of propane emits about 25 kg of CO2. The type of fuel makes a big difference too. Avoid flammable liquids. Charcoal and wood create a lot of soot, and propane and natural gas aren't much better. Given the choices, an electric barbecue is the most ecological option.

Collection for Diocesan Priests' Retirement Fund

Next weekend, on Good Shepherd Sunday, May 8, not only will we be observing Mother's Day, but also taking up our annual collection to benefit the Retirement Fund for the priests of the Diocese of San José. Due to the aging of our priests and underperforming investments over many years, there is currently a considerable "unfunded liability." This has resulted in annual increases in the amount that parishes are charged for each active priest. This year, it will increase more than 25% to \$32,033. Last year, Saint Clare collected more than \$3700 for the Retirement Fund. This was truly amazing. All of the pastors who served here since 2000, including Fathers Rick Rodoni, Paolo Gobbo, George Aranha and Tad Terembula and Msgr. Fran, as well as priests who have been parochial vicars - Fathers Sergio Ovando, Dan Urcia, Prosper Molengi, Pedro Perez, and many more - will eventually benefit from this fund, some much sooner than others! Thanks for your prayerful consideration of what you will be able to contribute on May 8.

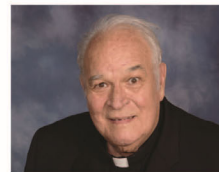

Comunión para Celíacos/Intolerantes al Gluten

Varias personas han sido diagnosticadas con intolerancia al gluten. Para ellos, incluso la cantidad de gluten en una hostia regular representa un riesgo para la salud. La Iglesia nos permite consagrar hostias bajas en gluten, que contienen solo cantidades mínimas de gluten. Si esto le preocupa a usted o a un miembro de su familia, comuníquese con Msgr. Fran. Podemos determinar si la opción baja en gluten funcionaría para usted. Ya que tenemos un suministro de hostias bajas en gluten, solo es cuestión de que nos informe en qué misa asistirá, para que podamos consagrarle la hostia adecuada.

La disciplina de la Iglesia no nos permite consagrar hostias “sin gluten”. Para aquellos que no pueden tolerar ni la más mínima cantidad de gluten, existen otras opciones para recibir la Sagrada Comunión, que nos complace explorar con usted.

Depois de ressuscitado Jesus continua a aparecer aos Apóstolos. Cada aparição é uma demonstração de que continua a funcionar no meio dos Apóstolos e animar-los a serem corajosos e a darem as suas vidas pela Igreja. Assim se vê na atitude destes ao serem maltratados pelas autoridades judaicas por defenderem Jesus Cristo e acusar-los da Sua morte “*Ao sairem do Sinédrio cheios de alegria, por terem merecido serem ultrajados por causa do nome de Jesus*”. O tratamento que então foi dado aos Apóstolos continua em vigor nos nossos dias a todos que lutam para que a Igreja de Cristo seja viva e eficaz na defesa e proteção dos seus seguidores ; sejam estes: homens, mulheres, crianças, jovens, sejam de que cor e ou cultura a que pertecem. A Igreja é a esposa de Jesus Cristo e consequentemente Mãe de todos os baptizados. A nossa fé leva-nos a acreditar que Jesus Cristo tal como aparecia aos Apóstolos depois da Sua ressurreição, Ele continua no meio de nós na Santa Eucaristia. Os maus tratos que receberam por este confronto valeu-lhes punição severa, a que eles tomaram como prémio por essa sua corajosa intervenção, eles reconheceram que defender Cristo é mais importante do que as suas vidas. 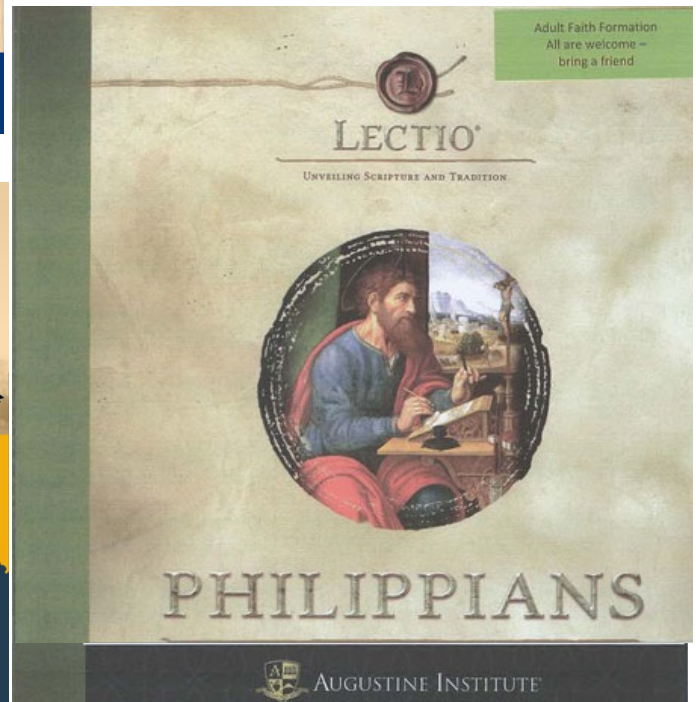
