In Jesus, all of the prohibitions of the “old” law were cast aside. His new commandment is simple: “Love one another as I have loved you.” While it is easy to state, it is far from easy to live.

It has been said that “Love is the only law, and that all the rest is commentary.” If we were completely and totally loving (God, neighbor and ourselves), there would be no need for any other rules or laws. That would be a perfect society; that would be heaven. But for now we depend upon laws to be able to live orderly lives and to protect our relationships between and among others and even with oneself.

After 2000 years of Christianity, it is sad that Jesus’ commandment is still new, and that our world has not yet discovered the peace that is the fruit of love. We continue to pray for the people of Ukraine, for an end to the brutal way being waged against them and the conversion of those who lead and direct the invading forces from Russia.

Communion for Celiac/Gluten-Intolerant Individuals

A number of people have been diagnosed as gluten-intolerant. For them even the amount of gluten in a regular host poses a health risk. The Church allows us to consecrate low-gluten hosts, that contain only trace amounts of gluten. If this is a concern to you or a family member, please approach Msgr. Fran. We can determine if the low-gluten option would work for you. Since we have a supply of low-gluten hosts, it is only a matter of letting us know which Mass you would be at, so that the proper host could be consecrated for you.

Church discipline does not allow us to consecrate “no-gluten” hosts. For those who cannot tolerate even the smallest amount of gluten, there are other options for receiving Holy Communion, which we are happy to explore with you.

THIS WEEK AT HOME

Monday, May 16 A Healing Love

Jesus tells his followers that those who keep his commandments love him. The love that Jesus proclaims is rooted in the reality that all of us are created in the image of God. This love recognizes our frailty and failures and our need for healing. This love also recognizes the best of who we can be for one another. Such love forgives and provides for healing. How will you show the love of God today? *Today's readings: Acts 14:5–18; Psalm 115:1–2, 3–4, 15–16; John 14:21–26.*

Tuesday, May 17 The Gift of Peace

What does it mean that Jesus offers the disciples peace? Peace doesn't mean the absence of challenges, conflicts, or worry; the power of peace is that it exists in the midst of all these things. The person who is at peace trusts that someone greater holds your life as precious in every moment. Peace can help you put matters in perspective so that, rather than worrying or being fearful, you remember, as Sr. Thea Bowman said, "who you are and whose you are." *Today's readings: Acts 14:19–28; Psalm 145:10–11, 12–13ab, 21; John 14:27–31a.*

Wednesday, May 18 Remain in Jesus

Jesus tells us that he is the true vine and we are the branches. Jesus' entire life and ministry was rooted in his relationship with his Father and his desire is to share that relationship with us so that we can nourish others. The simplest way to maintain our viability as a life-giving branch on the vine is to remain rooted in our relationship with Christ. Prayer and the sacraments, especially the Eucharist, are ways we can remain in Jesus. *Today's readings: Acts 15:1–6; Psalm 122:1–2, 3–4ab, 4cd–5; John 15:1–8.*

Thursday, May 19

Joy

"Joy is the infallible sign of the presence of God," said Teilhard de Chardin, *sj*. In today's Gospel, Jesus offers love as the simple ingredient for joy. This love is grounded in Christ. Consider how your life would be more joyful if you allowed yourself to rest in the love of God. Sometimes it is difficult to accept that God offers us his love unconditionally. When we accept that, it is easier to love ourselves and God. *Today's readings: Acts 15:7–21; Psalm 96:1–2a, 2b–3, 10; John 15:9–11.*

Friday, May 20 Loved and Chosen

The Gospels this week have focused on being rooted in our relationship with God. Love, peace, and joy are only possible because of that relationship. Today Jesus adds another layer: he sends his followers out to continue his mission. Today it would be good to pray for the grace to be courageous to accept that we are chosen and loved, and to share the love we have known through him. *Today's readings: Acts 15:22–31; Psalm 57:8–9, 10 and 12; John 15:12–17.*

Saturday, May 21 Reality Check

Today's Gospel offers a reality check regarding discipleship. Not everyone will appreciate the Christian message that you share, and some may rebuke you for spreading the Gospel. Living as a Christian can mean facing persecution. Jesus tells us to remember that he experienced these challenges. When discipleship is the hardest, take comfort in knowing that your witness provides a source of life and hope. *Today's readings: Acts 16:1–10; Psalm 100:1b–2, 3, 5; John 15:18–21.*

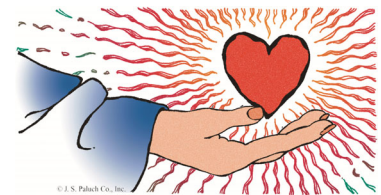

Dios habita entre nosotros



Lecturas de hoy: Hechos 14:21-27; Salmo 145:8-10, 10-11, 11-13; Apocalipsis 21:1-5a; Juan 13:31-33a, 34-35.
¿Alguna vez ha notado usted algo maravilloso por primera vez, pero luego se da cuenta de que había estado allí desde hacía mucho tiempo? Eso ocurre en nuestra relación con Dios y su obra en nuestra vida. A menudo, las personas están tan absortas en los muchos eventos de su vida que se pierden la bondad y el amor que Dios les envía.

En el Apocalipsis se nos dice que Dios ha hecho su hogar entre nosotros: “He aquí, la morada de Dios con la raza humana... Dios siempre estará con ella como su Dios”. En su habitar con nosotros, Dios está presente en los

momentos más difíciles. “Secará toda lágrima de sus ojos”, se nos dice. Pero hay más. “No habrá más muerte ni duelo, llanto ni dolor”.

En el Evangelio, Jesús nos asegura que es por el amor recíproco que seremos reconocidos como discípulos suyos. Por nuestro amor, la presencia de Dios se irradia a la familia, los amigos y la comunidad. ¿Quién en su vida manifiesta notablemente el amor de Dios? Esta semana dedique un momento a apreciar la presencia de Dios en su vida. Ore pidiendo la gracia de tener la conciencia viva de ser la presencia de Dios para los que más necesitan saberse amados.

Por medio de Jesús, todas las prohibiciones de la ley “antigua” fueron descartadas. Su nuevo mandamiento es sencillo: “Amánse como yo les he amado.” Lo cual es fácil de decir, sin embargo no es tan fácil de vivir.

Se ha dicho que “Amar es la única ley, y que todo lo demás es comentario.” Si amáramos de una manera completa y plena (a Dios, a nuestro prójimo, y a sí mismo), no fuera necesario ninguna otra regla o ley. Sería una sociedad perfecta; sería el cielo. Pero, por ahora dependemos de leyes para poder vivir vidas con orden y para proteger nuestras relaciones con y entre uno y el otro y hasta con uno mismo.

Después de 2000 años de cristiandad, es triste que el mandamiento de Jesús todavía es nuevo, y que nuestro mundo todavía no ha descubierto la paz del fruto del amor. Continuamos orando por el pueblo de Ucrania, por el fin de esta guerra brutal contra ellos y la conversión de los que guían e dirigen las fuerzas desde Rusa.

Comunión para Celíacos/Intolerantes al Gluten

Varias personas han sido diagnosticadas con intolerancia al gluten. Para ellos, incluso la cantidad de gluten en una hostia regular representa un riesgo para la salud. La Iglesia nos permite consagrar hostias bajas en gluten, que contienen solo cantidades mínimas de gluten. Si esto le preocupa a usted o a un miembro de su familia, comuníquese con Monseñor Fran. Podemos determinar si la opción baja en gluten funcionaría para usted. Ya que tenemos un suministro de hostias bajas en gluten, solo es cuestión de que nos informe en qué misa asistirá, para que podamos consagrarle la hostia adecuada.

La disciplina de la Iglesia no nos permite consagrar hostias “sin gluten”. Para aquellos que no pueden tolerar ni la más mínima cantidad de gluten, existen otras opciones para recibir la Sagrada Comunión, que nos complace explorar con usted.

Uma vez mais a igreja escolhe este Domingo no Tempo Pascal para dar relevo á família. Deus na Santíssima Trindade se revela ao mundo e ás suas culturas na Família. Nas famílias está em cada uma a célula construtiva de qualquer sociedade, seja ela de qual índole for...seja ela cristã ou de qualquer outra religião, tribo ou qualquer outra organizada cultura. Hoje vemos uma família nuclear como o pai (homem), mãe (mulher) e filhos como a célula mais importante na construção e manutenção da igreja. Fora deste modelo de família são remendos criados pelas sociedades para “remendar” buracos de carencias criadas pelas próprias sociedades. Nesta frase está o núcleo da mensagem de Jesus Cristo para todos os baptizados cristãos . É o próprio Jesus Cristo que dá o verdadeiro modelo de como o mundo pode viver em paz e harmonia uns com os outros: seja ela para as famílias, casais, solteiros ou outra qualquer posição social; a meta é amar de forma de dentro para fora. A família nuclear cristã é o modelo mais visível neste mundo que se aproxima desse modelo de amar, pois no amor relacionado do casal, este se estende aos filhos e aí está o amor de Deus estendido a todos.

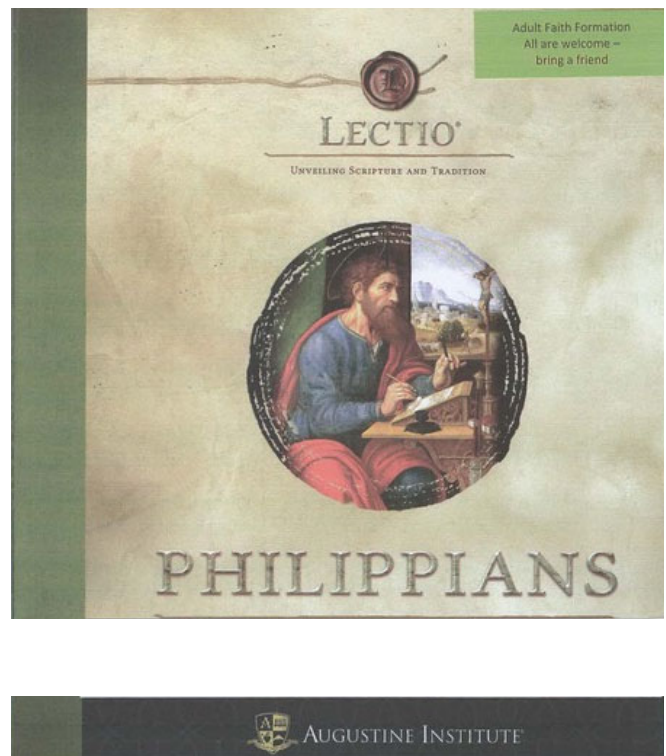
