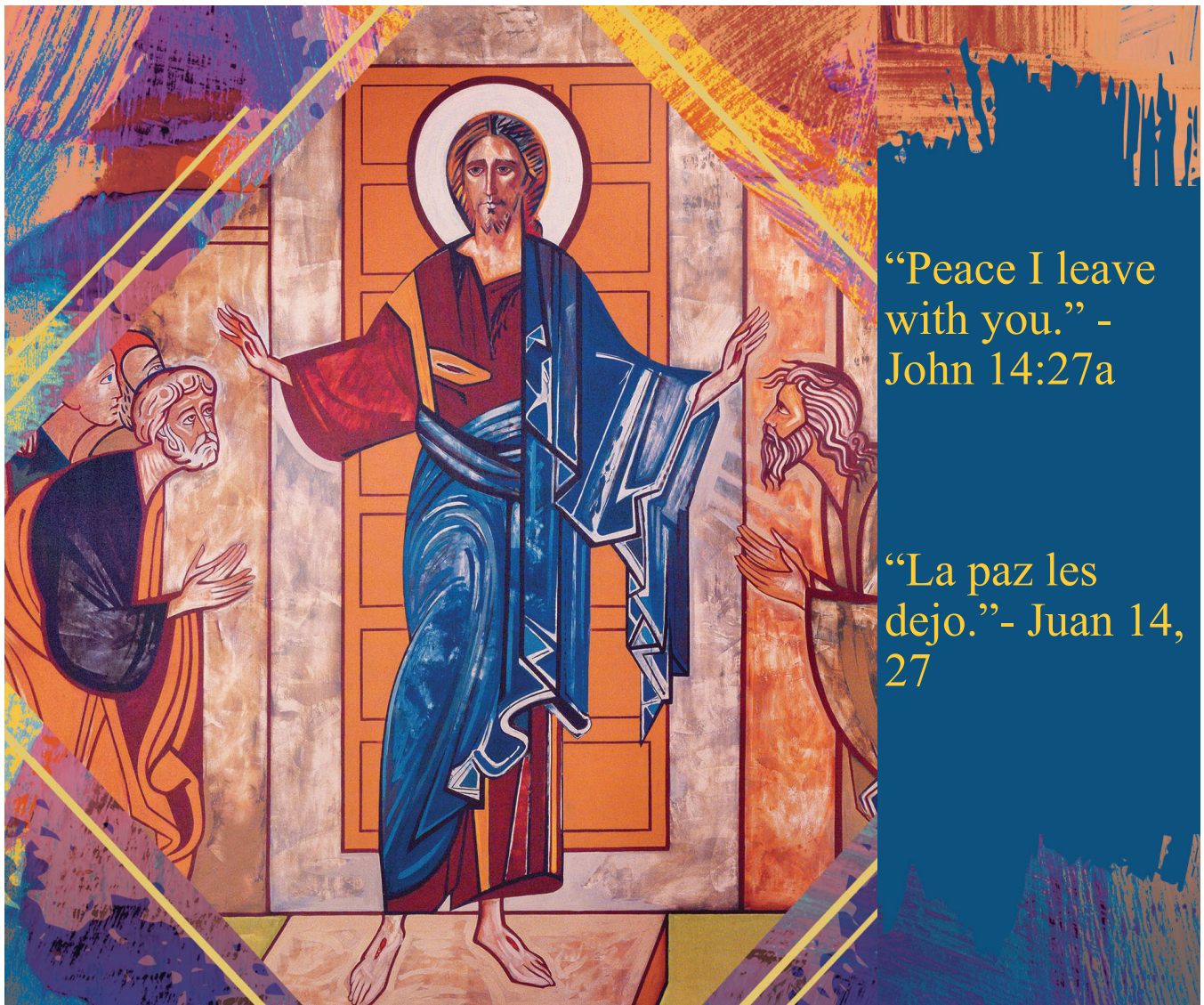

Just as love, the subject of last week's Gospel reading, is elusive, so is the peace of Jesus, that he left to the disciples during the Last Supper:

Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give it to you. Do not let your hearts be troubled or afraid (John 14).

But Jesus does believe that such peace is possible, because "The Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you."

The Lord knows that our world today is in need of a peace that is more than just the cessation of violence and war, though that would be a good start. According to Saint Pope John Paul II, "[Peace] involves mutual respect and confidence between peoples and nations. Like a cathedral, peace must be constructed patiently and with unshakable faith."

If the peace we seek for our lives and for the world is founded on Jesus, with Him as our Teacher and Guide, that peace may become real, but if we treat peace as though it is some temporary truce or cease-fire, we will fail. Paraphrasing the words of Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., quoted in my homily last weekend, if we allow ourselves to see the image of God in others, then peace has a chance. It must begin there.

Creation Care Tips



“For it has seemed good to the Holy Spirit and to us to impose on you no further burden than these essentials: that you abstain from what has been sacrificed to idols and from blood and from what is strangled...” —Acts 15:28-29

The Old Testament is filled with dozens of precise dietary laws, many for solid health or ethical reasons. Most of them were dispensed with when Gentiles converted to Christianity as in this story from the Acts of the Apostles today, but notice some laws about eating specific kinds of meat were retained. Our Christian faith doesn't require us to be vegetarians or vegans, but there are perhaps even more health and ethical reasons to reduce or eliminate our consumption of meat today than there were when Paul wrote this passage. This week, watch this 5 minute video about the carbon footprint of beef and make a commitment to reduce red meat in your diet:

PARISH COMMUNITY La paz os dejo; mi paz os doy. Yo no os la doy como el mundo la da. No dejen que sus corazones sean preocupado o asustado (Juan 14).

Pero Jesús sí cree que tal paz es posible, porque “El Abogado, el Espíritu Santo, que el Padre enviará en mi nombre, os enseñará todo y os recordará todo lo que os he dicho”.

El Señor sabe que nuestro mundo de hoy necesita una paz que sea más que el cese de la violencia y la guerra, aunque eso sería un buen comienzo. Reflexão por: João Pereira Arruda

“ O Espírito Santo e nós decidimos não vos impor mais nenhuma obrigação, além destas que são contigo também” indispensáveis: abstervos da carne imolada aos ídolos e das relações imorais.” Assim

foi a nossa igreja nos seus primórdios quando assistida pelo Espírito Santo; que Se fez muito activamente presente no alicerçar a igreja assistindo os Apóstolos. Nos nossos dias e em muitas sociedades a “coleção” de pastores, ministros, evangelistas, padres e religiosos fazem também o mesmo. Impõem regras em nome de Deus, sugerem práticas religiosas e de vida que não são nem mandamentos nem sugestões vindos de Deus. Jesus Cristo várias vezes aparece nas escrituras a chamar de hipócritas aos fariseus e escribas que cumprem práticas da lei mas não vivem-nas nos seus corações. Os mandamentos de Deus são para serem sugestões de melhoramento nas nossas vidas e não para serem mandamentos para serem cumpridos para serem vistos pelos demais mas não vividos para se crescer no amar. Neste conflito entre o cumprir leis ou viver os mandamentos há a enorme diferença: entre o aparentar e o ser (viver). No Evangelho ouvimos aquela passagem em que Jesus Cristo diz aos Apóstolos: *“ Deixo-vos a paz, dou-vos a minha paz. Não vo-la dou como dá o mundo. Não se perturbe nem se intimide o vosso coração.”* Reparem bem que Jesus está a dizer-nos que a Sua paz é diferente que a que o mundo dá. Será que percebemos essa diferença? Será que deixamo-nos invadir pela ação vificadora do Espírito Santo e viver a vida da igreja em vez de praticarmos regras que nos aperra a liberdade de amar? Estas são questões que se nos apresenta neste Domingo; quando estamos indo ao encontro de celebrar-nos nas próximas semanas celebrar a Ascensão do Senhor e a vinda do Espírito Santo sobre Maria e os Apóstolos reunidos no Cenáculo. Nas nossas missas o sacerdote inicia o Santo sacrifício da missa abrindo os braços e dizendo: *“ A paz do Senhor esteja convosco”*. É o convite para que estejamos em paz nos nossos corações, para que possamos viver e participar na Palavra de Deus e participar e comungar a Santa Eucaristia. Quando respondemos ao sacerdote dizendo *“E contigo também”* Estamos a afirmar que queremos estar na paz de Deus. No mundo que vivemos de guerras e violência; aí não deve estar a paz de Deus, porque Deus não está na guerra. Daí nasce a questão: estou eu em Paz? Que faço pela paz no meu coração, na família, na comunidade, na paróquia, no mundo? Olhemos para S. Francisco de Assis que inicia a sua oração pedindo ao Senhor que faça dele instrumento da Sua paz. Assim também nós devemos querer ardentemente instrumentos da paz de Deus e não cooperadores com as leis de uso de armas, no contribuir para leis de armamento nuclear, de repúdio aos ataques aos países pequenos e mais fracos pelos governos dos países grandes e poderosos. O estado de paz, não é o ficar impassível às injustiças mas no ser intervenientes em nome de Deus pela paz, pela concórdia e harmonia.

Com a celebração da Festa do Espírito Santo, vem também o tempo de férias e das missas terem poucas pessoas a virem celebrar e participar na Santa Missa. Com o passar dos anos a nossa comunidade está mais idosa e com poucas pessoas a servirem nos vários ministérios todos eles necessários em servir o Senhor nas necessidades da comunidade. Faz-se um convite a toda a comunidade que peça ao Espírito Santo que sensibilize os corações dos membros da nossa comunidade a darem os seus nomes a João Arruda para servirem nos diversos ministérios necessários ao funcionamento das liturgias e actividades da nossa comunidade nesta paróquia, desde já os nossos agradecimentos.

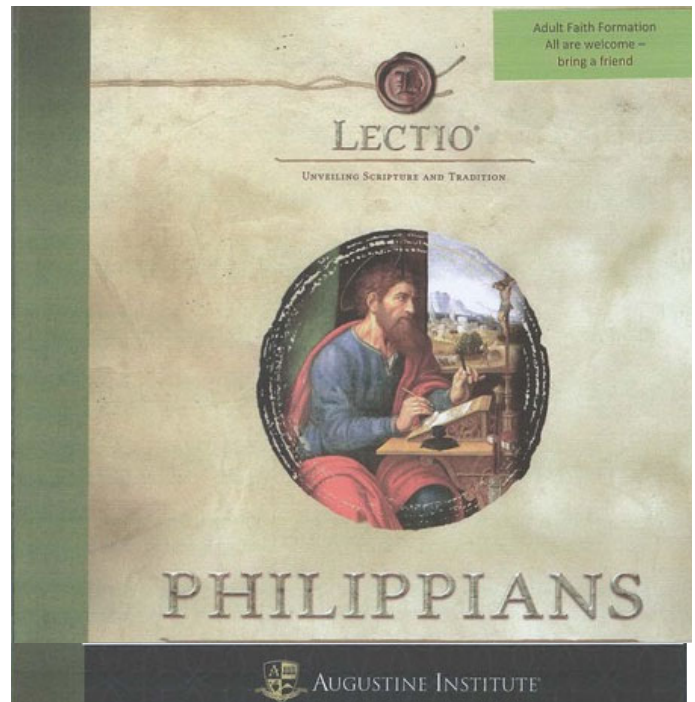
