Clergy Study Week – This Week

Clergy Study Week begins Monday afternoon at Saint Francis Retreat in San Juan Bautista. There will be no daily Masses at the parish on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday. Please pray for all of our priests and deacons that this week will enrich our diocesan clergy and all the people they serve.

Communion for Celiac/Gluten-Intolerant Individuals

A number of people have been diagnosed as gluten-intolerant. For them even the amount of gluten in a regular host poses a health risk. The Church allows us to consecrate low-gluten hosts, that contain only trace amounts of gluten. If this is a concern to you or a family member, please approach Msgr. Fran. We can determine if the low-gluten option would work for you. Since we have a supply of low-gluten hosts, it is only a matter of letting us know which Mass you would be at, so that the proper host could be consecrated for you.

Church discipline does not allow us to consecrate “no-gluten” hosts. For those who cannot tolerate even the smallest amount of gluten, there are other options for receiving Holy Communion, which we are happy to explore with you.

Collection for Diocesan Priests' Retirement Fund

Today, Good Shepherd Sunday, May 8, not only will we be observing Mother's Day, but also taking up our annual collection to benefit the Retirement Fund for the priests of the Diocese of San José. Due to the aging of our priests and underperforming investments over many years, there is currently a considerable "unfunded liability." This has resulted in annual increases in the amount that parishes are charged for each active priest. This year, it will increase more than 25% to \$32,033. Last year, Saint Clare collected more than \$3700 for the Retirement Fund. This was truly amazing. All of the pastors who served here since 2000, including Fathers Rick Rodoni, Paolo Gobbo, George Aranha and Tad Terembula and Msgr. Fran, as well as priests who have been parochial vicars - Fathers Sergio Ovando, Dan Urcia, Prosper Molengi, Pedro Perez, and many more - will eventually benefit from this fund, some much sooner than others! Thanks for your prayerful consideration of what you will be able to contribute on May 8.







La disciplina de la Iglesia no nos permite consagrar hostias “sin gluten”. Para aquellos que no pueden tolerar ni la más mínima cantidad de gluten, existen otras opciones para recibir la Sagrada Comunión, que nos complace explorar con usted.

IV Domingo da Páscoa – Dia da Mãe e Dia Mundial das Vocações

“Dou-vos um mandamento novo: que vos ameis uns aos outros, Como Eu vos amei, amai-vos também uns aos outros. Nisto conhacerão todos que sois meus discípulos; se vos amardes uns aos outros”. É com este dizer que S. João termina o Evangelho deste Domingo, Tão significativo porque em igreja celebramos o “Dia Mundial de oração para as Vocações Sacerdotais e religiosas” e o Dia dedicado ás MÃES”. Meditemos pois nestes dois temas de interesse para a igreja de Cristo no mundo. A Ressurreição de Jesus que recentemente celebramos na Páscoa não acabou com o mal no mundo, mas os homens e mulheres que optam por dedicar as suas vidas a servir o Senhor Deus a servir o Seu Povo cumprem com o “Mandamento Novo”. Do mesmo modo as “MÃES” vivem o Mandamento Novo nos filhos; ora vejamos:

Dia Mundial de Oração, pelas Vocações Sacerdotais e Religiosas




