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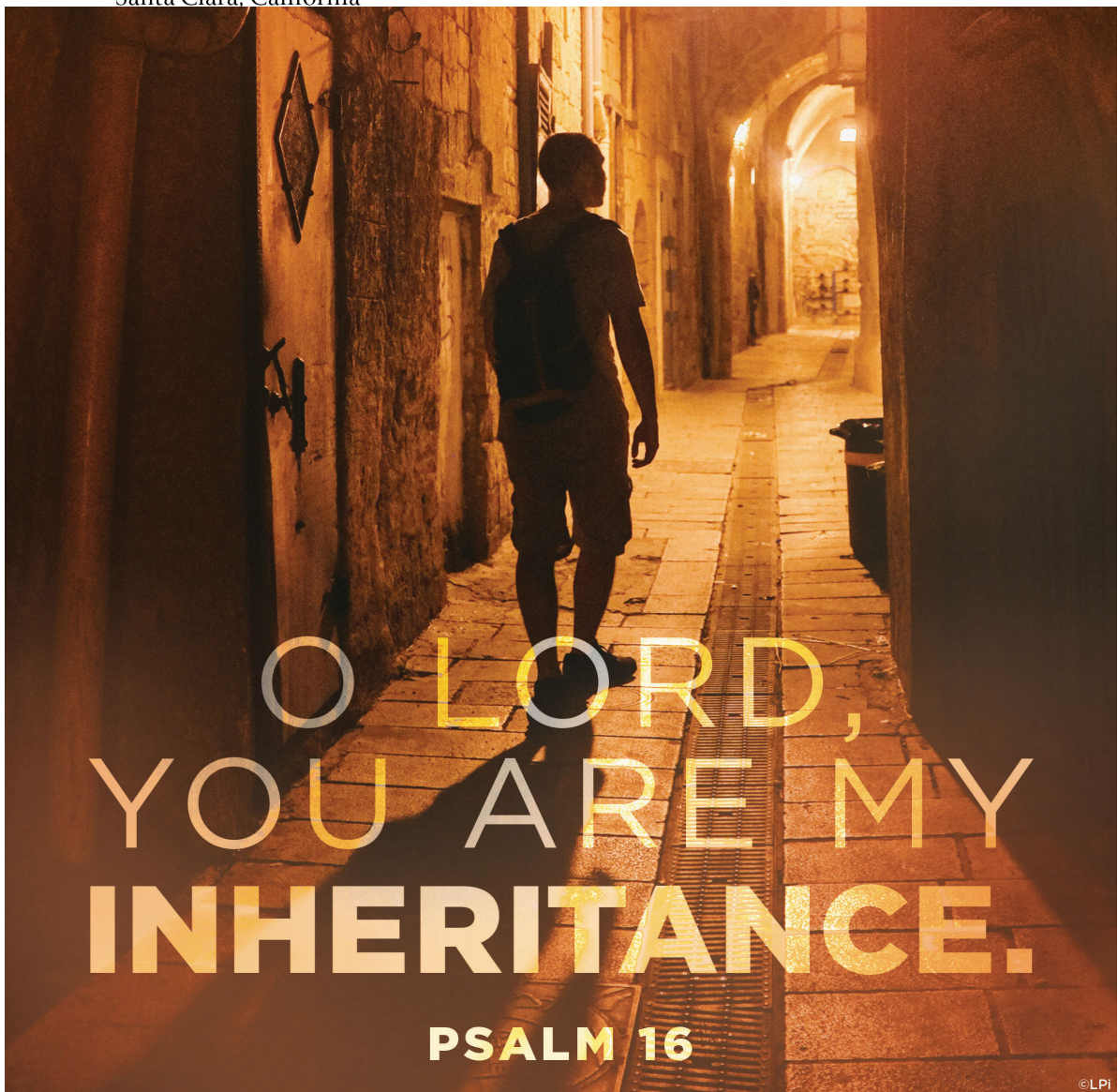

We resume the Sunday readings of Ordinary Time, which will continue this year until November 20.

“Ordinary” does not imply “regular” or “usual,” but an “ordered” presentation of the weeks, apart from the major seasons (Advent/Christmas and Lent/Easter). That is why the Sundays are known by a number, for example today is the Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time.

During the 33 or 34 Sundays of Ordinary Time, we read the gospel (this year from Saint Luke) in order, chapter by chapter; we do the same with the second reading, which usually comes from one of the letters of Saint Paul. The Old Testament reading, however, is chosen for its connection with the gospel reading each Sunday. Often it is from the first reading that one can get a sense of what can be emphasized in the gospel reading.

Today’s readings tell of the cost of discipleship: Elisha’s request that Elijah allow him to kiss his father and mother goodbye before he followed him is rejected. And Jesus declares that “No one who sets a hand to the plow and looks to what was left behind is fit for the kingdom of God” (Luke 9:62). We, who want to be disciples of the same Lord, need to consider its cost in our lives: what are we willing to give up? How committed are we to go where He leads us? As we walk with the Lord these next five months, let us, as the song says, “see Him more clearly, love Him more dearly, follow Him more nearly. . .Day by Day” (from *Godspell*).

Eucharistic Renewal

Saint Clare Parish will participate in the national program, “Eucharistic Revival,” to encourage us and all Catholics to deepen our understanding and appreciation of the Eucharist, which began last Sunday, as we celebrated the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (*Corpus Christi*).

As Bishop Cantú announced in December 2021, the Diocese of San José seeks spiritual renewal of our local church at all levels. The Eucharistic Revival is the heart of this renewal, which also includes the 2023 Diocesan Synod to discern the direction of the mission and ministry of the local church in Santa Clara County. Over the next three years, every Catholic parish, school, apostolate, and family are invited to be a part of renewing the Church by enkindling a living relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ in the Eucharist and going out in mission “for the life of the world.”

Diocesan Prayer for Eucharistic Renewal

Heavenly Father,

Creation Care Tips

We have just passed the summer solstice—the day with the most daylight hours in the northern hemisphere—and we will continue to enjoy long hours of sunlight for weeks to come. This is the perfect time to test out a new invention which has just hit the market. It's both ecological and economical. It replaces the dryer during the summer and is more gentle on clothing. It makes clothes smell fresh, like the outdoors. It's called lateral garment suspension...or more commonly known as "the clothesline." In addition to the ecological aspects, hanging out your laundry is good exercise for the arms, it's relaxing, and it's an opportunity to talk to the neighbors. When it's windy, the result is better than ironing. Look for a space to stretch a laundry line—something permanent or retractable—or get a simple, fold-up drying rack to set up in the sun. You may discover you enjoy the few quiet minutes of hanging laundry outside and the fresh smell so much that you find a way to do it at other times throughout the year, not just when the summer days are at their longest.

Summer is a great time to eat out with your family. How do you choose the restaurant? Have you tried that new ethnic restaurant which will introduce your family to new flavors and textures of food? When you decide on a restaurant, do you check to see if the restaurant uses locally-produced food instead of buying it from thousands of miles away? 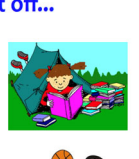
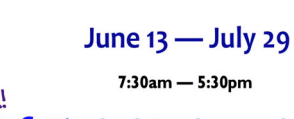

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Members of our family joke that saying goodbye after a family gathering needs to begin about an hour before we plan to leave. Goodbyes mean hugs for every family member, and there are many of us! We are aware of how precious our loved ones are to us, and so Jesus' response to the person who asks if he can first say farewell to his family may seem perplexing to us. But in this reading, Luke presents Jesus as "resolutely" headed to Jerusalem because "the days for Jesus' being taken up were fulfilled." Jesus is ready to complete the mission he came for and anyone who wants to follow him can't be distracted by indecision. His matter-of-fact answers are directed at newcomers who seem to hesitate when he invites them to follow him. He wants his disciples to know that being a disciple will have an impact on personal comfort, and that everything one does – for family, loved ones, or whomever – must flow from this discipleship *first*. It is not about ignoring other responsibilities, but carrying them out in light of who we are and whom we follow. Jesus calls us to make our relationship with him our highest priority. Doing so will bring life to all the relationships we value as we grow to live and love like him.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

How do we commit to answering God's call without hesitation? Like the first Apostles, the prosperous farmer Elisha in today's first reading willingly responded to the call from Elijah. But he didn't just leave everything and go: He first burned his plow as fuel in order to cook the oxen and leave it for his people to eat. In following the Lord, his first act was to ensure that those for whom he was responsible were not left without. Answering God's call is not often easy. But like Elisha and the Apostles, we are called to listen and respond to the ways God calls us and to trust in his Spirit to guide us. As Paul tells the Galatians, we are to "live by the Spirit." By trusting in the power of the Holy Spirit and turning to him for strength and guidance, we can be Christ's presence wherever he leads us – and doing whatever it entails.

INVITE Ask the Holy Spirit to help you discern who needs the gift of your presence in their life right now. Schedule time with this person, just listening, affirming their gifts, and assuring them of your belief in them and God's love for them.



De Monseñor Fran Cilia

Reanudamos las lecturas dominicales del Tiempo Ordinario, que continuará este año hasta el 20 de noviembre.

“Ordinario” no implica “regular” o “usual”, sino una presentación “ordenada” de las semanas, aparte de las temporadas principales (Adviento/Navidad y Cuaresma/Pascua). Por eso los domingos se conocen con un número, por ejemplo hoy es el Decimotercer Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario.

Durante los 33 o 34 domingos del Tiempo Ordinario, leemos el evangelio (este año de San Lucas) en orden, capítulo por capítulo; hacemos lo mismo con la segunda lectura, que suele provenir de una de las cartas de San Pablo. Las lecturas del Antiguo Testamento, sin embargo, se eligen por su conexión con las lecturas del evangelio de cada domingo. A menudo es a partir de la primera lectura que uno puede tener una idea de lo que puede ser recalcado en la lectura del evangelio.

Las lecturas de hoy hablan del costo del discipulado: Eliseo le pide a Elías que le permitiera besar a su padre y a su madre antes de seguirlo y es rechazado. Y Jesús declara que “El que pone la mano en el arado y mira hacia atrás, no sirve para el Reino de Dios” (Lucas 9:62). Nosotros, que queremos ser discípulos del mismo Señor, necesitamos considerar su costo en nuestra vida: ¿a qué estamos dispuestos a renunciar? ¿Qué tan comprometidos estamos de ir a donde Él nos guíe? Mientras caminamos con el Señor estos próximos cinco meses, como dice la canción, “veámoslo más claramente, ámenlo más profundamente, síganlo más de cerca. . .Dia por Dia” (de *Godspell*).

Boletim Paroquial Português

Domingo XIII do Tempo Comum -A

Reflexão por: João Pereira Arruda

Depois da euforia pascal e do Pentecostes, as liturgias voltam a ser ricas de mensagens de vida cristã através da Boa Nova que nos traz as Leituras e o Evangelho de cada missa dominical. As leituras de hoje aparentemente mostram-nos um Jesus Cristo firme e intransigente que diz aos discípulos para deixarem tudo do interesse mundano porque o convite a evangelizar exige todo o despreendimento e concentração na sua proclamação. Mais ainda exige que os discípulos vivam na íntegra a mensagem que proclamam. Por assim ser, tudo o demais, por mais significância que tenha; seja de família ou emprego, ficam estes relegados para um segundo plano para dar resposta imediata ao chamamento de Deus e ao Seu serviço em função da criação de um mundo melhor: de paz, de unidade, de amor fraterno. Parece uma tarefa impossível, mas não o foi, para Jesus Cristo que seguiu á regra e até á morte e morte de cruz, a vontade do Pai, S. Paulo nos diz na sua carta aos Gálatas, que por Deus fomos todos chamados á liberdade. No entanto S. Paulo nos avisa que não usemos a liberdade dom de Deus para pretexto dos desejos da carne, mas para vivermos na caridade, em função de amrmos e servir -mos os outros – os irmãos. Esta libertação é uma luta diária e lenta, porque não é de um momento para o outro que um homem se deixa conduzir pelo Espírito de amor. Olhemos para as vidas de alguns santos, tal como: Santo António, São Francisco de Assis, Santo Inácio de Loiola, que apaixonando-se pelo chamamento do Espírito Santo, corresponderam em servir deixando os meios abastados com que viviam nas suas famílias para darem expansão da mensagem de Deus para o mundo. O mundo e o lugar que vivemos ficou nos anos recentes em crescente: criminalidade, corrupção, violência, guerra, ganância, injustiça. Ninguém está salvo: seja nas escolas, nos hospitais, nas igrejas, nos lugares de entretenimento, nos lugares de emprego; chegam-nos notícias de tragédias pelo qual pessoas e crianças são assassinadas violentemente. Todos somos culpados deste ambiente que vá contra a vontade de Deus, porque o nosso Deus é de amor. Sendo assim demos voz nas eeições em eleger pessoas e preposições que estão enquadradas na construção de um mundo melhor; num mundo mais cristã. Para seguir Jesus, há que envolver a família na nossa história de amor, reconhecendo que o grande imperativo é o amor. E uma vez lançado no caminho do amor, não se pode ficar agarrado ao que já foi, mas sim ao que há por amar. Há uma urgência na forma como Jesus nos chama a seguir-Lo que se sobrepõe sobre todas as outras prioridades. Seguir Jesus implica assumir o seu estilo, segundo as prioridadesdo amor, e não as próprias . É para esta liberdade que Jesus Cristo nos libertou.
