Creation Care Tips

“When you send forth your spirit, they are created; and you renew the face of the ground. — Psalms 104:30

Take some deep breaths of fresh air on this day of Pentecost. This simple gesture has a great significance in our Christian tradition. Indeed, rhythmic breathing leads to deeper meditation, the grace of feeling God’s presence. Sadly, one child in five suffers from asthma which can be caused or exacerbated by poor air quality in our cities, heavy pesticide use in agricultural areas, coal burning plants, and wildfires. Elderly people are also more at risk for lung trouble when the air quality is poor too. Be thoughtful when the forecast calls for smog: avoid using your car if possible to reduce emissions especially on those days when the air quality is poor.

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Weekly Justice Challenge

The spirit of Pentecost celebrates the power of forgiveness. The Scriptures say that Jesus breathed on the apostles and gave them the power to forgive and to bind. God wants no one to be bound by sin, and extends forgiveness to all who are sorry and seek God’s forgiveness. But forgiving others is really hard when we are the victim of injustice. The challenge this week is to forgive so that you and your enemy will not be bound by sin. Forgiveness is a power of the Spirit, not a human power. If you find it hard to forgive, go deeper by doing what Jesus taught: pray goodness upon your enemy and do good for him/her.

Domingo do Pentecostes

“Vinde Espírito Santo, enchei os corações dos vossos fieis; acendei neles o fogo do Vosso Amor; tudo será criado e renovareis a face da terra! Está esta pequena oração no coração e nos lábios de cada

açoreano espalhado por todo o mundo. Está esta súplica na boca de cada açoriano que celebra o Paráclito com rituais estranhos e indicifráveis a qualquer outro povo que vê o Espírito Santo por outro prisma; que sendo diferente do povo açoriano pode ser mais correcto no significado que dá á Terceira Pessoa da Santíssima como: o Paráclito, O Vificador, O Distribuidor dos seus sete dons, o que dá vida á Igreja, o que Renova a face da terra, o Consolador das nossas almas; é Aquele que tranforma as nossas vidas pela renovação dos nossos corações. Para outro povo que não seja açoriano, não se percebe o Espírito Santo: nas massas sovadas e arroz doce, nas sopas e vivós ao Espírito, nas rainhas e paradas, etc. mas o povo açoriano exorta de alegria nesta gama de ritos e tradições “mutiladas” de longos anos de celebrar o Espírito Santo. Na cerimónia das coroações dos, mordomos, das rainhas ou dos imperadores, caiem lágrimas pesadas nos rostos deste povo sofrido pelo qual o Espírito Santo pesa enormemente nas suas aflições e de tempos difíceis de vida n’Ele se refugiam, n’Ele está toda a confiança pois sbem que o Espírito Santo de Deus é o Paráclito = Aquele que defende...mais propriamente Aquele que nos representa perante o Pai. Por mais estranha que sejam as tradições e ritos celebrativos do Espírito Santo pelo povo açoriano; este povo não anda alheio á significancia da Terceira Pessoa da Santíssima Trindade, esse povo vibra emocionadamente com os vivós ao Espírito Santo. Por todas as igrejas, neste Domingo e em cada missa; quando o sacerdote levanta a coroa cantando “Veni Creator Sancto Espiritu” nos corações do povo açoriano está esta crença que é o Divino a infundir a Sua graça nas; meninas escolhidas, nos Mordomos ou imperadores que prometeram fazer a festa do Divino, mas que ao mesmo tempo representam todo o povo da comunidade, da freguesia, vila ou cidade; porque o Espírito Santo é de todos e sómente o povo açoriano chama ao Espírito Santo de “SENHOR!”

Coroação dos Mordomos
