## **From Monsignor Fran Cilia**

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“And who is my neighbor?” This question was posed to Jesus by the legal expert who “wished to justify himself.” I am certain that the man did not go away feeling good about himself, because he had wanted to use the law to narrow the definition of who had to be counted as his neighbor. Instead, Jesus shows the foreigner, the Samaritan, to be neighbor to the man who was robbed on the road to Jerusalem. In the end, one’s neighbor is the person in need and, at the same time, the person who has the ability to address the other’s situation. Truly loving one’s neighbor as oneself opens to us a sense of relationship, belonging and connection with all people.

Jesus’s words to the scholar of the law are also spoken to each of us: “Go and do likewise [treat others with mercy].”

## **New Budget Year**

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*From Msgr. Fran. . .*

As mentioned in last week’s Bulletin, to cover anticipated expenses for the new budget/fiscal year, we will be looking for an increase in Sunday collections to a weekly average of \$8400. I know that these are uncertain times in terms of the economy and that inflation has slammed many of us. I am also aware that for some of you, just maintaining your current level of support for Saint Clare is not easy. At the same time, if you can make any increase in your weekly or monthly gift to the parish, it will go a long way to helping us meet our expenses. 59% of anticipated parish income is from Sunday, Easter, Christmas and Holy Day collections. The remainder of our income is from various other sources, including around 25% from rent (JVC House, Chinese Communities, resident priests). We have raised rent by 7% for this coming year.

Again, if you are able to increase your level of support for the parish, it would be a great help. I will commit to increasing my monthly gift by \$50, beginning today. Join me, if you are able. Together, we will succeed in this.

Finance Chair, Jerome Alabado, will be making his annual report to the parish a little later in the summer.

## **Church Roof**

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Work on the new roof for the church began this past week. It is estimated that tearing off the old roof will take between one and two weeks and about two additional weeks to install the new roof. During this work, we will not have access to the church during weekdays and the parking lot behind the hall will be used for heavy equipment. Masses (Mondays through Fridays) will be celebrated in the tent.

## Second Collection for Saint Clare School

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Next weekend, we will have our quarterly collection to benefit our parish school. Thank you for supporting Saint Clare School, which has been educating minds and forming hearts since 1856.

## Eucharistic Renewal

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Saint Clare Parish is participating in the national program, “Eucharistic Revival,” to encourage us and all Catholics to deepen our understanding and appreciation of the Eucharist, which began on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (*Corpus Christi*).

As Bishop Cantú announced in December 2021, the Diocese of San José seeks spiritual renewal of our local church at all levels. The Eucharistic Revival is the heart of this renewal, which also includes the 2023 Diocesan Synod to discern the direction of the mission and ministry of the local church in Santa Clara County. Over the next three years, every Catholic parish, school, apostolate, and family is invited to be a part of renewing the Church by enkindling a living relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ in the Eucharist and going out in mission “for the life of the world.”

## Diocesan Prayer for Eucharistic Renewal

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Heavenly Father,  
In your loving mercy, you sent your Son, Jesus Christ, anointed by the Spirit, to redeem the world through his Paschal Mystery. The disciples on the road to Emmaus pleaded with the Lord, “Stay with us.”

## De Monseñor Fran Cilia

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“¿Y quién es mi prójimo?” Esta pregunta se la hizo a Jesús el experto legal que “deseaba justificarse”. Estoy seguro de que el hombre no se fue sintiéndose bien consigo mismo, porque había querido usar la ley para estrechar la definición de quién debía ser contado como su prójimo. En cambio, Jesús muestra al extranjero, al samaritano, como prójimo del hombre que fue asaltado en el camino a Jerusalén. Al final, el prójimo es la persona necesitada y, al mismo tiempo, la persona que tiene la capacidad de atender la situación del otro. Amar verdaderamente al prójimo como a uno mismo nos abre un sentido de relación, pertenencia y conexión con todas las personas.

Las palabras de Jesús al estudioso de la ley también se dirigen a cada uno de nosotros: “Ve y haz lo mismo [trata a los demás con misericordia]”.

## Presupuesto para el Año Nuevo Fiscal

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*De Mons. Fran. . .*

Como se mencionó en el Boletín de la semana pasada, para cubrir los gastos anticipados para el nuevo presupuesto/año fiscal, buscaremos un aumento en las recaudaciones dominicales a un promedio semanal de \$8400. Sé que son tiempos inciertos en cuanto a la economía y que la inflación nos ha golpeado a muchos. También soy consciente de que para algunos de ustedes, simplemente mantener su nivel actual de apoyo a Santa Clara no es fácil. Al mismo tiempo, si puede hacer algún aumento en su donación semanal o mensual a la parroquia, contribuirá en gran medida a ayudarnos a cubrir nuestros gastos. El 59% de los ingresos anticipados de la parroquia provienen de las colectas de los domingos, Pascuas, Navidad y Días Santos. El resto de nuestros ingresos proviene de varias otras fuentes, incluido alrededor del 25% del alquiler (*JVC House*, Comunidades Chinas, sacerdotes residentes). Hemos aumentado el alquiler en un 7 % para este próximo año.

Una vez más, si puede aumentar su nivel de apoyo a la parroquia, sería de gran ayuda. Me comprometeré a aumentar mi donación mensual \$50 mas, a partir de hoy. Únase a mí, si puede. Juntos, lo lograremos.

El presidente de finanzas, Jerome Alabado, hará su informe anual a la parroquia un poco más tarde en el verano.

## Techo de la Iglesia

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El trabajo en el techo nuevo de la iglesia comenzó la semana pasada. Se estima que quitar el techo viejo tomará entre una y dos semanas y alrededor de dos semanas adicionales para instalar el techo nuevo. Durante este trabajo, no tendremos acceso a la iglesia durante los días de semana y el estacionamiento detrás del salón se usará para equipo pesado. Las misas (de lunes a viernes) se celebrarán en la carpa.

## Boletim Paroquial Português

Domingo XV do Tempo Comum -A

Reflexão por: João Pereira Arruda

“Procurai, pobes, o Senhor e encontrareis Vida”. Assim diz o refrão da liturgia deste Domingo, porque sem o Senhor, não há vida. Quando afincadamente procuramos o Senhor e O encontramos e O sentimos nas nossas vidas O saboreamos e então realizamos como o Senhor é bom. Moisés na Primeira Leitura deste Domingo Moisés impõe ao povo amar a Deus de todo o coração. Mas Deus não Se impõe Ele penetra suavemente em cada um de nós, e então quando assim, nossas vidas mudam radicalmente se correspondermos ao Seu Amor. Quando o nosso coração limpo de preconceitos; sejam estas de: bigotria, de classe social, de egocentrismo, etc Com Deus lá dentro ficamos a exercer o mandamento do Amor; “*Amarás o Senhor Deus com toda a tua alma e o teu coração, com todas as tuas forças e com todo o teu entendimento; e ao próximo como a ti mesmo*”. Tal como o sacerdote e o levita passaram pelo homem assaltado e ferido, sem o atender por seus corações estarem enlodados de interesses pessoais, em contrapartida o samaritano exerceu o seu amor no homem assaltado como gostaria que alguém fizesse por ele quando nas mesmas condições. Ajudando o homem assaltado o samaritano fê-lo por amor, porque Deus estava no homem assaltado. A parábola não diz se o samaritano era religioso, não diz ser este rico, mas que teve o suficiente para pagar ao estalajadeiro para providenciar os cuidados necessários para o homem recuperar a saúde e a sua vida. Questionemo-nos qual dos figurantes somos? O homem assaltado pode ser Deus na figura de um sem lar, sem abrigo, com fome; e o que fazemos quando nos encontramos com estes pelas bermas dos caminhos, andrajosos, esfomeados, drogados, abandonados e repudiados nos meios sociais? O Evangelho diz que o samaritano se encheu de **compaixão** e tratou o homem ferido das suas feridas. Compaixão é um sentimento quando exercido apropriadamente e no lugar ou pessoa certa é a extensão do amor. É o amor a funcionar na prática. Várias passagens do Evangelho usadas pelos quatro evangelistas retrata Jesus enchendo-se de compaixão; tal como quando ia com a cruz às costas a caminho do Calvário às mulheres que choravam a Sua injustiçada sentença. Era Jesus cheio de amor pelas mulheres que chorando por Ele, em torno Jesus amava-as na sua dor compadecida. Encher-nos de compaixão pelo outro (irmão) é exercermos o amor no seu máximo. Amar com paixão leva-nos á vida eterna! O doutor da lei para experimentar Jesus fez a pergunta a Jesus: “*Mestre! Que hei-de fazer para ganhar a vida eterna?*” A resposta de Jesus decerto que não o agradou, pois que este compreendeu que foi o samaritano que usando a sua compaixão exerceu o mandamento do amor. Jesus disse-lhe: “*Vai e faz o mesmo!*”. Na nossa compaixão, humanamente limitada, quando usada estamos a trabalhar para sermos participantes na vida eterna.

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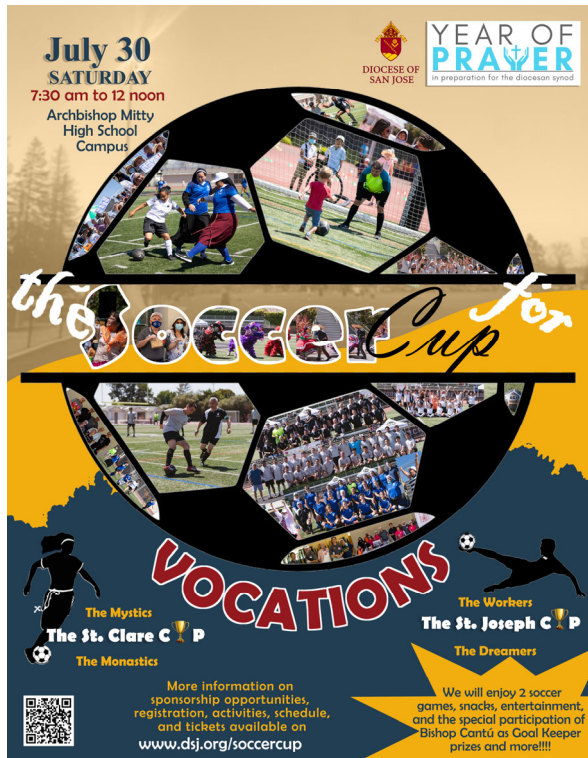
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## Soccer Cup for Vocations
