So often, this Sunday's gospel passage has been seen as Jesus expressing His preference for prayer over action, Mary over Martha, since Mary had "chosen the better part and it will not be taken from her." Based upon this, many believers have striven to be Mary, instead of Martha.

Yet if we consider this passage in light of our reading this weekend from the Book of Genesis, we hear of the value of hospitality, as shown by Abraham when the Lord appeared to him.

It seems that we should choose to be *either* Martha, the doer, or Mary, the listener; we must strive to be *both*, as we read in the Letter of Saint James: "Demonstrate your faith to me without works, and I will demonstrate my faith to you from my works" (James 2:18).

Prayer, contemplation and listening to the Lord's word must be accompanied by action, as inspired by Luke 11:28: "Blessed are those who hear the word of God and keep it."

May these weeks of summer give us opportunities to do both.

As mentioned previously, to cover anticipated expenses for the new budget/fiscal year, we will be looking for an increase in Sunday collections to a weekly average of \$8400. I know that these are uncertain times in terms of the economy and that inflation has slammed many of us. I am also aware that for some of you, just maintaining your current level of support for Saint Clare is not easy. At the same time, if you can make any increase in your weekly or monthly gift to the parish, it will go a long way to helping us meet our expenses. 59% of anticipated parish income is from Sunday, Easter, Christmas and Holy Day collections. The remainder of our income is from various other sources, including around 25% from rent (JVC House, Chinese Communities, resident priests). We have raised rent by 7% for this coming year. Again, if you are able to increase your level of support for the parish, it would be a great help. I have committed to increasing my monthly gift by \$50. Join me, if you are able. Together, we will succeed in this. Finance Chair, Jerome Alabado, will be making his annual report to the parish a little later in the summer.

Church Roof

Work on the new roof for the church continues. It is estimated that the entire project will take about a month. During this work, we will not have access to the church during weekdays and the parking lot behind the hall will be used for heavy equipment. Masses (Mondays through Fridays) will be celebrated in the tent.

Muy a menudo, el pasaje del evangelio de este domingo se ha visto como Jesús expresando su preferencia por la oración sobre la acción, María sobre Marta, ya que María había “elegido la mejor parte y no se la quitarán”. En base a esto, muchos creyentes se han esforzado por ser María, en lugar de Marta.

Sin embargo, si consideramos este pasaje a la luz de nuestra lectura de este fin de semana del Libro de Génesis, escuchamos sobre el valor de la hospitalidad, como lo mostró Abraham cuando el Señor se le apareció.

Parece que deberíamos elegir ser Marta, la hacedora, o María, la oyente; debemos esforzarnos por ser ambos, como leemos en la Carta de Santiago: “Demuéstrame tu fe sin obras, y yo te mostraré mi fe con mis obras” (Santiago 2:18).

La oración, la contemplación y la escucha de la palabra del Señor deben ir acompañadas de la acción, como se inspira en Lucas 11,28: “Bienaventurados los que oyen la palabra de Dios y la guardan”.

Que estas semanas de verano nos den oportunidades para hacer ambas cosas.

Como se mencionó anteriormente, para cubrir los gastos anticipados para el nuevo presupuesto/año fiscal, buscaremos un aumento en las recaudaciones dominicales a un promedio semanal de \$8400. Sé que son tiempos inciertos en cuanto a la economía y que la inflación nos ha golpeado a muchos. También soy consciente de que para algunos de ustedes, simplemente mantener su nivel actual de apoyo a Santa Clara no es fácil. Al mismo tiempo, si puede hacer algún aumento en su donación semanal o mensual a la parroquia, contribuirá en gran medida a ayudarnos a cubrir nuestros gastos. El 59% de los ingresos anticipados de la parroquia provienen de las colectas de los domingos, Semana Santa, Navidad y Días Santos. El resto de nuestros ingresos proviene de varias otras fuentes, incluido alrededor del 25% del alquiler (JVC House, Comunidades Chinas, sacerdotes residentes). Hemos aumentado el alquiler en un 7 % para este próximo año.

Una vez más, si puede aumentar su nivel de apoyo a la parroquia, sería de gran ayuda. Me he comprometido a aumentar \$50 mas a mi donación mensual . Únase a mí, si puede. Juntos, lo lograremos.

El presidente de finanzas, Jerome Alabado, hará su informe anual a la parroquia un poco más tarde en el verano.

El trabajo en el nuevo techo de la iglesia continúa. Se estima que todo el proyecto tomará alrededor de un mes. Durante este trabajo, no tendremos acceso a la iglesia durante los días de semana y el estacionamiento detrás del salón se usará para equipo pesado. Domingo XVI do Tempo Comum

Reflexão por: João Pereira Arruda

As leituras da liturgia deste Domingo falam-nos do dom da hospitalidade. Ser hospitaleiro é um dom que sendo ele bem cuidado no coração estamos a dar cumprimento ao que Jesus dizia: “*Ao que fizerdes ao mais pequeno dos meus irmãos, é a Mim que a fazeis*”. Através da Sagrada Escritura podemos ver muitos exemplos que ilustram o valor da hospitalidade, todos eles vem do princípio que parte de um coração generoso que se abre para acolher alguém que necessita abrigo, repouso, saciar a fome, equipar com o essencial para retomar a caminhada. Tanto Marta como Maria estavam a dar hospitalidade a Jesus e enquanto Marta se afadigava para providenciar Jesus com comida, Maria se sentava com Jesus a escutar-Lo e Jesus assim o disse que Maria havia escolhido a melhor parte. Escutar, fazer companhia é tão parte de ser hospitaleiro pois demonstra o interesse que se tem pela pessoa acolhida. A acção e a oração, são dois extremos da vida crstã. Marta e Maria são os exemplos que nos ilustram esses extremos. Tanto a acção como oração uma não invalida a outra as duas são importantes e se completam uma na outra. Os “Ushers” nas nossas missas praticam em todas elas o dom do seu ministério é a hospitalidade. A eles cabe a tarefa de manter um ambiente pacífico e acolhedor a todos que vêm participar na Santa Eucaristia. A eles cabe a tarefa de manter a ordem a fim de que a Missa possa ser celebrada sem interrupções seja que de índole for. Eles são as “Martas” que nos fala o Evangelho e que no total participativo de outros ministérios tais como: Acólitos, sacristãos, leitores ou músicos todos eles se completam uns nos outros na função do prover uma celebração pelo qual todos beneficiam das graças que a Santa Missa traz tanto os membros da congregação como os leigos que serviram nos seus ministérios. Assim dizia o fundador da Opus Dei: “*Ou sabemos encontrar o Senhor na nossa vida de todos os dias, ou não O encontraremos nunca. Por isso, posso afirmar que a nossa época precisa devolver á matéria e ás instituições, aparentemente vulgares o seu sentido nobre e original; pondo-as ao serviço do Reino de Deus, espiritualizando-as, fazendo delas meio e ocasião para o nosso encontro contínuo com Jesus Cristo*” Jesus não questiona a atitude de Marta, como não ajuiza todo o comportamento de Maria. Muda os termos do problema com toda a profundidade e aponta para um aspecto mais essencial; a atitude interna de Marta, que está absorvida no seu trabalho e tão preocupada com ele, que quase se esquece do mais importante: a presença de Cristo naquela casa. O trabalho é um grande meio de evangelização quando se testemunha com honestidade a Sua presença naquilo que se faz. O trabalho e a contemplação não se distinguem mas se completam sempre que estas tenham como prioridade concentrada na presença de Deus nas nossas vidas.


