It has been said that “prayer is conversation with God.”

If this was our experience, it is likely that many of us would pray more often and more heartfelt. Our Catholic Tradition has handed on to us many formal prayers; one could fill a library with compilations of prayers and litanies. While these may all be helpful to us when we cannot give voice to our own prayers, reliance on formal prayer can also become a crutch, serving as a buffer between our minds and our hearts.

The story of Abraham’s bargaining with God (“What if there are no more than twenty [innocent people]?) and Jesus’ instruction to “ask, seek and knock” give us the pattern for the prayer of our lives. The Lord’s Prayer, on the other hand, gives us the broad outline for our prayer: It is directed to the Father of Jesus, tries to align our will with God’s and seeks forgiveness that is rooted in our willingness to forgive others.

Sometimes, our prayer might express frustration and sadness; and at other times, joy and thanksgiving. But isn’t this the way between friends? Yet that is what God, in Jesus, has become for us: “I shall no longer call you servants” . . . but friends (John 15:15). Let us speak to our friend, the Lord and, like Mary in last week’s gospel reading, listen to the words He speaks to us.

We welcome Sister Lisa Megaffin, SND, who will introduce us to the Global Ministries of the Notre Dame Sisters and invite us to be participants in that missionary work. Many parishes here and around the country do this on a Sunday each summer, giving us the opportunity to share in missionary activity without leaving home. We do this in our prayer and in the financial support we are able to give. Please be generous this year in support of the work of the Sisters of Notre Dame in our second collection.

Our New Roof Is Complete

The work on the new church roof was completed ahead of schedule. We bought a “40 year roof” that should now reflect the sun’s heat away from the church, making it easier to cool. Thank you for your support of our parish and the Annual Diocesan Appeal, which made this \$164,265 job possible. We have depleted our savings, but will begin work to replenish them over the next few years.


STEWARDSHIP SAINT *for July*

Saint Benedict

Saint Benedict, the father of Western monasticism, is considered a model of Christian stewardship. He authored the famous Rule of St. Benedict, a handbook of daily Christian living that emphasizes exercising stewardship over prayer, work, and community.

Born in central Italy in the town of Nursia around 480, Benedict studied in Rome as a young man. He was so distressed by the chaos and incivility he found there that he left the city and traveled to Subiaco, Italy to become a hermit. He soon attracted followers who wanted to join him in his simple way of living; imitating his style of prayer and work while respecting the rhythms of the day. Benedict stayed there for 25 years before taking a small group of his monks to Monte Cassino, near Naples, where he wrote the final version of his Rule.

The Rule of St. Benedict started a simple, spiritual tradition that exists to this day. It was meant to "...establish a school for the Lord's service." It is a set of Christian principles around which the members of the community were to organize their daily lives, focusing on the most


important Christian values that would direct their daily actions and help them cultivate habits that would ensure good stewardship of their physical, emotional and spiritual well-being.

A hallmark of Christian stewardship is hospitality, making room for others. St. Benedict found this aspect of the Christian life especially important for his communities. In his Rule, St. Benedict writes:

"Let all guests who arrive be received like Christ, for he is going to say: 'I was a stranger and you welcomed me (Mt. 25:35).' 'And to all let due honor be shown, especially to those who share our faith' (Gal. 6:10) and to pilgrims...In welcoming the poor and pilgrims the greatest care and solicitude should be shown, because it is especially in them that Christ is received" (Rule of St. Benedict 53:1-2, 15).

The Rule of St. Benedict was meant to stand on the shoulders of the Gospels and many spiritual writers throughout the ages attest to its transforming power to change lives. It teaches the principles of stewardship, shows one how to live in a way that is uniquely countercultural and invites its adherents to enter into a deeper and more joyful relationship with the Lord.

St. Benedict died in approximately 550. He is the patron saint of monks and farm workers. In 1964 Pope Paul VI declared him to be the patron saint of Europe. His feast day is July 11.



Stewards of Our Neighbors: Jesus' Parable of the Good Samaritan

After many centuries of recounting Jesus' Parable of the Good Samaritan (Luke 10:25-37) the story seems to have lost the "sting" Jesus intended for it. At the weekend Masses of July 9 and 10, we will once again hear the proclamation of this Gospel story which reveals Jesus' encounter with the legal scholar and his response to the question: Who is my neighbor? Perhaps now is a good time to reflect more deeply on Jesus' teaching and its practical implications for our lives today.



The Samaritan in Jesus' story did not see a stranger, alien or foreigner. He simply saw a suffering human being who needed help.

In the Gospel story Jesus affirms the legal scholar: "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your being, with all your strength, with all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself." But the lawyer asks:

Se ha dicho que “la oración es conversación con Dios”.

Si esta fuera nuestra experiencia, es probable que muchos de nosotros oráramos más a menudo y con más sinceridad. Nuestra Tradición Católica nos ha transmitido muchas oraciones formales; uno podría llenar una biblioteca con compilaciones de oraciones y letanías. Si bien todos estos pueden ser útiles para nosotros cuando no podemos dar voz a nuestras propias oraciones, la confianza en la oración formal también puede convertirse en una muleta, sirviendo como un amortiguador entre nuestra mente y nuestro corazón.

La historia de la negociación de Abraham con Dios (“¿Qué pasa si no hay más de veinte [personas inocentes]?”) y la instrucción de Jesús de “pedir, buscar y llamar” nos dan el modelo para la oración de nuestras vidas. El Padrenuestro, por otro lado, nos da el esquema general de nuestra oración: se dirige al Padre de Jesús, trata de alinear nuestra voluntad con la de Dios y busca el perdón que está enraizado en nuestra disposición a perdonar a los demás.

A veces, nuestra oración puede expresar frustración y tristeza; y en otras veces, alegría y acción de gracias. ¿Pero no es este el camino entre amigos? Sin embargo, eso es lo que Dios, en Jesús, se ha hecho para nosotros: “Ya no los llamaré siervos”. . . pero amigos (Juan 15:15). Hablemos con nuestro amigo, el Señor y, como María en la lectura del evangelio de la semana pasada, escuchemos las palabras que Él nos dirige.

Damos la bienvenida a la Hermana Lisa Megaffin, SND, quien nos presentará los Ministerios Globales de las Hermanas de *Notre Dame* y nos invitará a ser participantes en esa obra misionera. Muchas parroquias aquí y alrededor del país hacen esto un domingo cada verano, dándonos la oportunidad de participar en la actividad misionera sin salir de casa. A liturgia deste Domingo convida-nos a concentrar-nos na oração do Pai Nosso que Jesus ensinou aos seus discípulos. Façamos esta oração muito íntimamente tal e qual, Jesus o fazia sempre que se dirigia ao Pai. Do mesmo modo também que o façamos confiadamente porque os pais querem sempre o nosso bem. Os pais porque nos amam querem sempre o melhor para as nossas vidas e adentro do que é possível procuram aceder ao que é necessário e essencial para se viver. Que nos dirijamos ao Pai com a mesma disposição de Jesus no Monte das Oliveiras: *“Pai se é possível afasta de Mim este cálica; porém que não se faça a minha vontade mas a Tua”*. 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
