Parish Mission Statement

Jesus said to his disciples: “. . . Do you think that I have come to establish peace on the earth? No, I tell you, but rather division. From now on a household of five will be divided, three against two and two against three; a father will be divided against his son and a son against his father, a mother against her daughter and a daughter against her mother, a mother-in-law against her daughter-in-law and a daughter-in-law against her mother-in-law” (Luke 12:51-53).

These “divisive” words of this weekend’s gospel passage are not so much a prediction as they are a reflection of real events in the lives of first century Christians. At the time the gospel was being written, faith in Christ was tearing up families and communities. The evangelist puts on the lips of Jesus words that can shock us even now: “I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing!” (verse 50).


In the twenty-first century, we could ask ourselves if there is anything about Jesus, the Gospel, or our Catholic/Christian faith that is so important that it could affect our lives as it did in the time of the apostles and the young Church. Do we experience faith in Jesus as the anchor of our lives, or as something peripheral, on the margins?

As schools reopen these weeks, we prepare to welcome the students of our parish school and pray that the year will be a time of growth and joy and good health for all. And may all students – wherever they go – be safe and, as Jesus did, “grow in knowledge and wisdom.”

De Monseñor Fran Cilia

"¿Creen ustedes que he venido para establecer la paz en la tierra? Les digo que no; más bien he venido a traer división. 52. Pues de ahora en adelante hasta en una casa de cinco personas habrá división: tres contra dos y dos contra tres. 53. El padre estará contra del hijo y el hijo contra el padre; la madre contra la hija y la hija contra la madre; la suegra contra la nuera y la nuera contra la suegra" (Lucas 12:51-53).

Estas palabras "divisivas" del pasaje evangélico de este fin de semana no son tanto una predicción como un reflejo de eventos reales en la vida de los cristianos del primer siglo. En el momento en que se escribía el evangelio, la fe en Cristo estaba desgarrando familias y comunidades. El evangelista pone en los labios de Jesús palabras que pueden estremecernos incluso ahora: "¡He venido a prender fuego a la tierra, y cómo quisiera que ya estuviera ardiendo!" (versículo 50).

En el siglo XXI, podríamos preguntarnos si hay algo sobre Jesús, el Evangelio o nuestra fe católica/cristiana que sea tan importante que pudiera afectar nuestras vidas como lo hizo en el tiempo de los apóstoles y la Iglesia joven. ¿Experimentamos la fe en Jesús como el ancla de nuestra vida, o como algo periférico, en los márgenes?

A medida que las escuelas reabren estas semanas, nos preparamos para recibir a los estudiantes de nuestra escuela parroquial y rezamos para que el año sea un tiempo de crecimiento, alegría y buena salud para todos. Y que todos los estudiantes, dondequiera que vayan, estén seguros y, como lo hizo Jesús, "crezcan en conocimiento y sabiduría".

Diocesan Year of Prayer

A message from Bishop Oscar Cantú:

Not only will we participate in the universal synod in a few months, but in preparation for our 50th anniversary, I invite us all – laity, religious, and clergy – to participate in our first Diocesan Synod, which will begin in Advent 2022. In this Diocesan Synod, I will invite us to reflect on the question, “where does our local Church of San José need to be in 10 years to live and proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ effectively in Silicon Valley into the future? Moreover, to be faithful to the mission of Jesus Christ, what do we need to do differently? What strengths can we leverage? What obstacles must we overcome? Do we need to pivot from old ministries to new ones? These are all broad questions, and I’m sure, with thoughtful prayer, there will be various and creative ideas to offer. We will surface those ideas and then enter a process of discerning the voice of the Holy Spirit amid the many voices.

To begin to prepare ourselves and our Diocese for our 50th Jubilee, I invite us all – laity, religious, and clergy – to participate in a **Year of Prayer** to convolve the **Holy Spirit** in our discernment process. The Holy Spirit inspires, strengthens, and guides the Church, and we need to listen prayerfully to the Spirit’s promptings so that our Diocese might embark on a journey of faith that is “ever ancient, ever new.” Pope Francis reminds us that God is God of surprises. It is in the spirit of prayer that we can prepare our hearts and our “spiritual ears” to hear his voice and to respond with courage, wonder, faith, and zeal.


For the young entrusted to our care,

Does Your Parish Have an Evangelization Plan for Young Adults?

Few issues resonate more with Catholics today than the evangelization of the young Church. How is your parish prepared to reach out to young adults and respond to their pastoral needs? This vital question will be explored at the 2022 International Catholic Stewardship Council's conference in Anaheim, California, from October 2 to 5. Pope Francis, in *Evangelii Gaudium* (The Joy of the Gospel), captured the importance of the young in sharing the Good News: "How beautiful it is to see that young people are 'street preachers,' joyfully bringing Jesus to every street, every town square and every corner of the earth! ... Young people call us to renewed and expansive hope."



Yet, as Christian stewards, we are concerned about how to engage young adults, who often see the Church with cynicism and disappointment. How can we bring forth from them the enthusiasm and devotion of which Pope Francis speaks? How do we involve them and support them pastorally so that our pews – and our street corners – are filled with young adults committed to Jesus?

History shows us that young adults are inspired by Catholic leaders who step forward in social justice causes and in service to the poor. Some parishes are finding that an effective way to reach unchurched young adults is to give them the opportunity to work with young Catholics who are committed to work in service and justice projects. Relationship building is key to evangelizing young adults. There is a renewed interest in Scripture studies among young adults both inside and outside of the Church. How can a parish committed to studying Scripture in an engaging and transformative way help to demonstrate to young adults the relevance of the Gospel to modern life? At this year's ICSC conference, a host of inspirational speakers will address topics related to evangelizing young adults in your parish today. To explore these important questions, join us in October at the annual ICSC conference in Anaheim.
