This is the announcement made at the Masses last weekend. . .

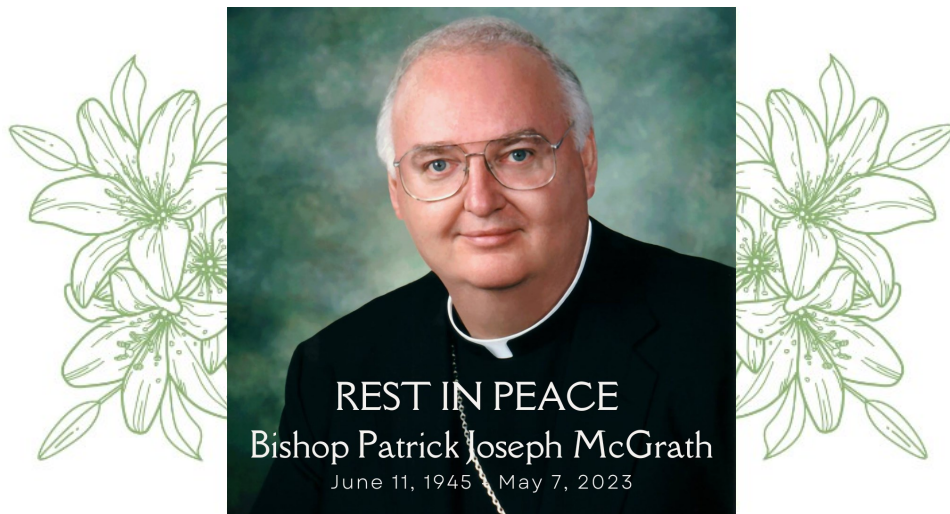

The meeting, which will be held in the Rectory, is intended to help with your understanding of the work of the Council and aid with your discernment about serving on the Council. Our hope is that this meeting will help us with our goal to establish a Council before Memorial Day, with the group beginning its work at the end of the summer.

STRATEGIC PLAN: A PATH FORWARD

On May 3rd, Meitler consultants Jackie Lichter, Ph.D. and Michael Taylor presented a hopeful path forward for Saint Clare School. The Strategic Plan outlines the path forward from shareholder input: survey results from current parents, input from interviews and listening sessions with students, families, the faculty and staff, the administration, Msgr. Fran, and the Dept. of Catholic Schools Finance Director. In the next few weeks, tasks will be prioritized and key stakeholders will be identified. Aligned with the benchmarks set by the National Catholic Education Association (NCEA) through the Standards for Excellence (SE) protocol of the Western Catholic Education Association (WCEA accreditation), the Strategic Plan identifies goals in each of the four key components of the National Standards and Benchmarks for Effective Catholic Schools (NSBECS). They are: Mission and Catholic Identity, Academic Excellence, Governance and Leadership, and Operational Vitality.

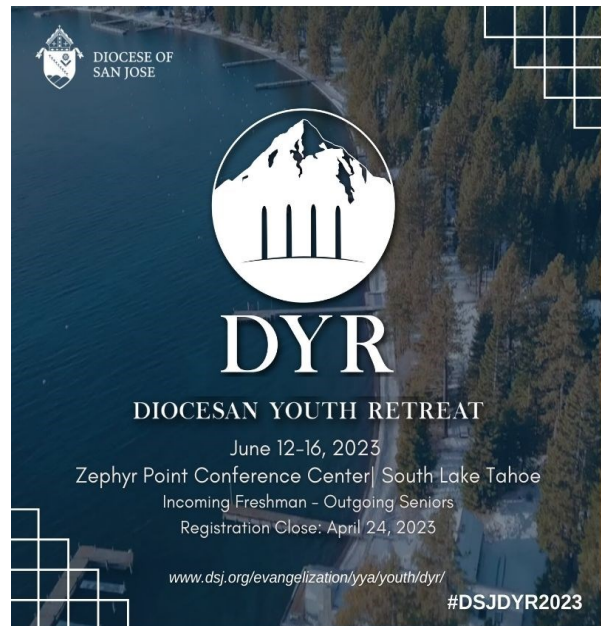

Reflexão pelo Padre Francisco Rodrigues SJ

Se me amardes, guardareis os meus mandamentos

O evangelho deste domingo recorda-nos que Jesus já está em modo de despedida. Gradualmente vai-se despedindo dos seus. A sua missão, entre nós, está a chegar ao seu termo. Nas palavras de Jesus, há três pontos que sobressaem: 1º Ele não deixará ninguém órfão. 2º Jesus recorda a importância de cumprirmos os mandamentos da lei de Deus. 3º Jesus fala continuamente do Pai.

Recomeçamos pelo primeiro ponto: Jesus parte e fica. Parte para junto da Trindade Santa mas fica connosco em Espírito e verdade e alimenta-nos através dos santos Sacramentos. Jesus não se ausenta, tem outro modo de estar connosco. No entanto, é preciso que também nós queiramos estar com Ele. Como fazemos para estarmos com Deus? Cumprindo os seus mandamentos com amor. Se olharmos para os mandamentos de Deus como um frete, uma carga, um castigo, não estamos a viver santamente os sacramentos. Se olharmos e vivermos os sacramentos com amor, por amor e para o amor, eles podem ser muito exigentes, mas nunca serão pesados, podem ser difíceis mas serão sempre libertadores. Deus quer o Nosso bem. Os mandamentos de Deus são como os sinais do código da estrada: libertam-nos dos perigos. Mas para que possamos viver libertos dos perigos, temos que cumprir os mandamentos, isto é, temos que observar os sinais dos códigos que nos permitem viver. Por último: Jesus fala continuamente do Pai, porquê? Porque fala continuamente com o Pai, mais ainda escuta o Pai. A oração não consiste só em falar e em cantar. A oração passa por, acima de tudo, escutarmos a Deus, não nos escutarmos a nós próprios. Seria bom no nosso dia-a-dia cultivarmos atitudes profundamente espirituais de escuta: o que é que Deus me quer comunicar quando eu lhe rezo? Como fazer para viver a vontade de Deus na família, na comunidade, na Igreja, no trabalho, onde me encontro? Levar tudo à oração. Levar a oração para a vida. Pedir a Deus a graça de ser uma pessoa espiritual para que possa receber o Espírito Santo. Acima de tudo, em tudo o que sou, faço, penso, transmito, nunca esquecer de que o amor nos há-de salvar. Cumprir os mandamentos com amor e por amor. Viver a minha vida cristã com amor e por amor. Servir a comunidade com amor e por amor. Se assim viver, cada um de nós terá a vida muito facilitada no momento do encontro com o Pai, pois Ele é fiel à sua palavra, saibamos nós, na nossa vida, corresponder-lhe.

Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

My dad was adopted as a baby. It's a big part of my family's story. His birth mother placed him in a Catholic orphanage not long after birth. A young couple longing for a baby strolled among the bassinets. My father, then only a few months old, looked at the husband and smiled. The man said, "That's my son." They took him home and the family grew. This moment of adoption was a wonderful truth they celebrated even when my dad was a young boy. They told him, "You're even more special than the other children, because we chose you to be our son." My dad's eyes well up with tears of gratitude whenever he tells the story, even eighty-three years later.

What is your story? Do we think or act like unwanted orphans? Who do we believe ourselves to be? As we continue to ponder Jesus' resurrection, we hear him say to us this Sunday, **"I will not leave you orphans."** God doesn't leave us alone like spiritual orphans. The power that raised Jesus from the dead is the Holy Spirit, who is also called the Spirit of Adoption. He chooses us to be His children, to share God's life forever. He gives us a future filled with hope.

We are not orphans anymore! This Easter, that's the story we should share with others. It's the true story we are living right now.
