As a result, in order to properly consult and engage key stakeholders in feedback on these key priorities, it would be prudent to defer the announcement of the Pastoral Plan from June to December to allow for the broad discernment and dialogue throughout the process as the Bishop desires. ### **Weekly Justice Challenge**

---

Justice Challenge: St. Damien of Molokai is honored on May 10.

Damien was canonized a saint because of his dedication and service to the lepers on the island of Molokai in Hawaii. Lepers were considered pariahs who were a threat to healthy people because of their contagious illness. Many of them were torn from their families when they were diagnosed with leprosy. They were taken to Molokai and never saw their loved ones again. (Lepers at the time of Jesus faced a similar alienation. They were often forced to wear a bell around their necks so that people could run from them when they heard the bell.) Damien ministered to the physical and emotional needs of the lepers on Molokai. He followed Jesus' example of reaching out to these rejected human beings, offering them the human contact—the simple touch—which they were denied. Your challenge this week is to look for a leper in your life, but not necessarily in the literal sense of a person with a skin disease. Rather, look for someone who craves human contact and human touch but is denied it. It might be someone who is lonely or angry, smelly or dirty, mentally ill or imprisoned in some way. Whatever the person's reality, reach out in love and compassion. Offer the human touch which every person on earth needs to survive and thrive.

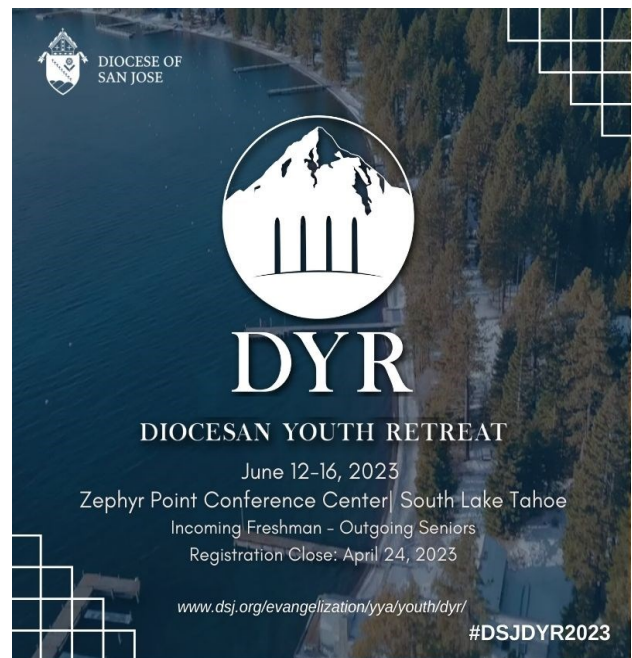

***Na Casa de Meu Pai há Muitas Moradas!***

Neste V domingo de Páscoa a Igreja recorda-nos a passagem do evangelho de Lucas na qual Jesus nos promete uma casa no Céu para vivermos para sempre. Todos nós sabemos que o sonho de qualquer pessoa ou casal é ter uma casa para viver e conviver em família. Pode ser uma casa simples, pobre, mas que seja digna e acima de tudo que seja a nossa casa. Jesus diz-nos que vai à nossa frente para preparar a nossa chegada. A promessa de Jesus é de que, quando chegarmos ao Céu, tenhamos a nossa habitação, o nosso quarto, as coisas que gostamos. No entanto todos nós sabemos por experiência própria que comprar uma casa, arrendar uma casa ou manter uma casa tem custos muito elevados. É natural que assim seja. No Céu não haverá custos. Mas para lá chegarmos, há custos e estes abrangem a vida toda. Se este exemplo nos ajuda, é caso para nos perguntarmos: Jesus promete preparar-nos uma casa no céu, mas, com que material? Com certeza que Jesus há-de preparar-nos a nossa casa com o material que para o Céu enviarmos. Não há outro caminho. Mas que tipo de material é que podemos enviar para o Céu? Estes são alguns dos materiais que na terra podemos fazer a pensar no bem que fazemos aos outros e que nos fará também bem a nós. Com isto não quero dizer que vamos ‘merecer o céu’. O céu ninguém o merece é dom gratuito de Deus. No entanto, Jesus é muito claro ao nos advertir que seremos julgados pelo bem que tivermos feito com amor. Jesus recordo-nos que no céu há muitas moradas. Promete preparar uma morada para cada um de nós. Neste fim-de-semana, valeria a pena pensarmos: que investimentos tenho eu feito na vida eterna? Que tipo de materiais tenho eu mandado para o céu através das boas obras vividas na terra? Como é que eu invisto no futuro, que não será transitório mas eterno? Que morada espero ter a partir do modo do meu viver? Jesus é fiel à sua promessa. A Igreja continuamente nos recorda as promessas de Jesus.
