The Eucharist is God's greatest gift to humanity, "the Lord's presence in His absence." In this year of Eucharistic Renewal, Catholics are invited to focus and pray over the words, "My flesh is true food, my blood is true drink." The "living bread that came down from heaven" pledges eternal life. . . "unlike your ancestors who ate [manna] in the desert, whoever eats this bread and drinks this cup will live forever."

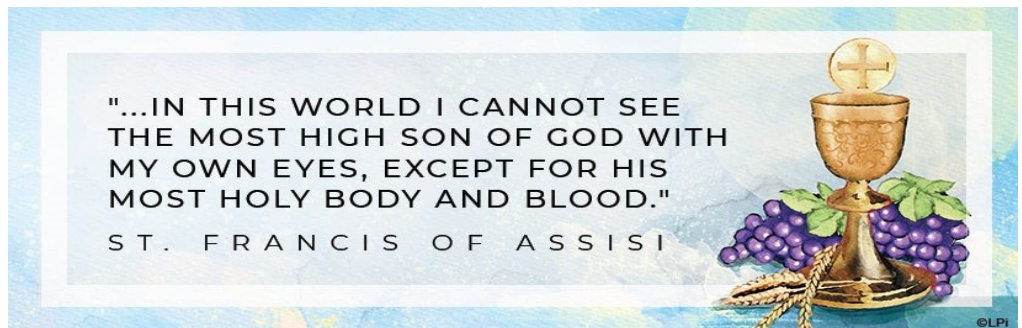
In the Sacrament of His Body and Blood, Jesus is really present. The Church has long described this in terms of the ancient term, "transubstantiation," which is not easily grasped by most of us. When we ask our young people who have been well-prepared to receive Holy Communion whether or not the Eucharist is the real Body and Blood of the Lord, the responses are generally split right down the middle.

A number of years, a survey of American Catholics came upon some ambivalence regarding the "Real Presence" of Christ in the Eucharist. Some decried this as a lack of faith on our part; it is probably fairer to state that there is a misunderstanding about how the consecrated Bread and Wine are signs and symbols of what they truly are and what they truly signify. To put it in the words of a class on liturgy that I took long ago at SCU, a symbol embodies that for which it is a symbol. It is not merely a sign that points to another reality. The symbol is the other reality.

As such, the bread and wine of the Eucharist are not only signs of the Body and Blood of Christ; through the power of the Holy Spirit and the prayer of the Church, they truly become what they signify. They become the Body and Blood of the Lord. That is how and why the consecrated Bread and Wine are in actuality the very realities of which they are signs: the Body and Blood of the Lord.

When we say our "Amen" to the minister who distributes the Host, our Amen is our assent to two dual realities: that which we receive into our hands and, at the very same time, the Body and Blood of Christ, which we are called to become!

Finally, it has been said often that "the Eucharist makes the Church." A corollary of this is that if there is no Eucharist, so goes the Church. That is why we are invited and challenged to celebrate the Eucharist every Sunday, or at least as often as our health allows.

Creation Care Tips

“He humbled you by letting you hunger, then by feeding you with manna, with which neither you nor your ancestors were acquainted.” —Deuteronomy 8:3

We have access to more varieties of food than ever before in human history, but the processing, packaging, and transportation of many of them are unsustainable. This week, seek out a farmer’s market to buy locally grown and in-season fruits, vegetables, and snacks. The “wrapper” that a peach or cherries come in (their skin) won’t pollute the environment, and no energy was used to process them into something different than what they started as. Stock your snack shelf with any colorful, beautiful fruits, vegetables, or nuts that appeal to you instead of buying pre-packaged, processed snacks this week.

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Weekly Justice Challenge

The Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ is a powerful reminder of Jesus’ life, death and resurrection. We celebrate the gift of the Eucharist, the sacrament in which each of us is nourished and sent forth. This day reminds us that we don’t do things on our own power – but from strength gained from the Eucharist. Before Jesus died, he asked his disciples if they could drink from the cup. He was asking if they were willing to endure what might come if they chose to feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, heal the sick and blind and set captives free. They said YES. The Body and Blood of Jesus is a gift to us, yet it is a challenge too. Ask yourself this week, “How does the Eucharist nourish and strengthen me? How am I being sent like the disciples? To whom am I being sent?” Reflect on how you have responded to these questions in the past. What will your response be from now on?

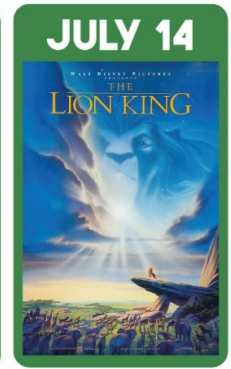
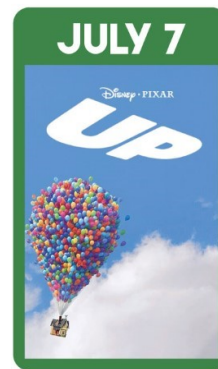
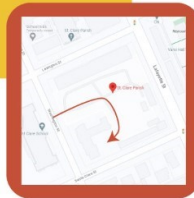

Boletim Paroquial Português

Reflexão pelo padre Francisco Rodrigues SJ

Os sãos não têm necessidade de médico

A leitura do evangelho deste domingo recorda-nos o que deveria ser claro para todos nós: Jesus diz que quem tem saúde não precisa de médico. Os doentes precisam de serem assistidos e acompanhados pelo médico. Mas há vários tipos de doenças: a doença do corpo e a doença do espírito, da alma e da mente. A doença do corpo é mais palpável. Os seus efeitos são mais imediatos e requerem soluções atentas. As doenças da alma, do espírito, da mente são mais lentas mas não menos perigosas para a qualidade de vida. Jesus chega a dar mais importância às doenças da alma do que do corpo físico. O evangelho de S. João recorda-nos a cura de um paralisado. Mais tarde quando Jesus reencontrou o paralisado curado disse-lhe sem reservas: “vejo que estás curado. Não voltes a pecar, para que não te aconteça coisa pior” (Jo. 5, 14). Afinal, este homem passou 38 anos estava na borda da piscina na ânsia de ser curado. Jesus curou-o e adverte-o de que há doenças piores do que viver 38 anos paralisado. Haverá pior do que isso? Jesus afirma que sim. Passar a eternidade na ausência de Deus é a pior doença. A doença de viver na ausência de Deus é das piores doenças a que podemos estar sujeitos se não abraçamos por inteiro o amor de Deus. Jesus não quer que vivamos doentes. Ele não quer que a nossa vida interior seja paralisada, atrofiada, presa, agarrada ao corpo sem vida espiritual. Por isso, Jesus apresenta-se como médico das almas e nos convida a sermos seus assistentes no cuidado a ter com a salvação de todos. Assim, não tenhamos medo de nos relacionarmos com quem está doente do espírito. No entanto, a nossa presença junto de quem está doente, deverá ser uma presença enraizada em Jesus. Os males mundanos deste mundo, estão a contagiar muita gente boa. Nós somos convidados a curar os enfermos e a nos curarmos a nós mesmos sem nos contagiarmos dos males nefastos do mundo mundano. Não é fácil mas é o convite de Jesus: estamos no mundo sem sermos mundanos. Que os nossos atos e oração sejam feitos como assistentes do médico divino, Jesus, que não desiste de cada um de nós, Ele opera continuamente no hospital que é a Igreja. Oxalá queiramos ser curados, sejamos e vejamos a Igreja como um hospital de campanha.

La Eucaristía es el mayor regalo de Dios a la humanidad, “la presencia del Señor en Su ausencia”. En este año de la Renovación Eucarística, se invita a los católicos a concentrarse y orar sobre las palabras: “Mi carne es verdadera comida, mi sangre es verdadera bebida”. El “pan vivo que descendió del cielo” promete la vida eterna...” a diferencia de vuestros antepasados que comieron [mañá] en el desierto, el que coma este pan y beba esta copa vivirá para siempre.”

En el Sacramento de su Cuerpo y Sangre, Jesús está realmente presente. La Iglesia ha descrito esto durante mucho tiempo en términos del término antiguo, “transubstanciación”, que la mayoría de nosotros no entendemos fácilmente. Cuando les preguntamos a nuestros jóvenes que han estado bien preparados para recibir la Sagrada Comunión si la Eucaristía es o no el verdadero Cuerpo y Sangre del Señor, las respuestas generalmente se dividen por la mitad.

Varios años, una encuesta de católicos estadounidenses encontró cierta ambivalencia con respecto a la “Presencia Real” de Cristo en la Eucaristía. Algunos denunciaron esto como una falta de fe de nuestra parte; probablemente sea más justo afirmar que existe un malentendido acerca de cómo el Pan y el Vino consagrados son signos y símbolos de lo que verdaderamente son y de lo que verdaderamente significan. Para ponerlo en palabras de una clase de liturgia que tomé hace mucho tiempo en SCU, un símbolo encarna aquello por lo que es un símbolo. No es simplemente un signo que apunta a otra realidad. El símbolo es la otra realidad.

Como tales, el pan y el vino de la Eucaristía no son sólo signos del Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo; por obra del Espíritu Santo y de la oración de la Iglesia, se convierten verdaderamente en lo que significan. Se convierten en el Cuerpo y la Sangre del Señor. Así es como y por qué el Pan y el Vino consagrados son en realidad las mismas realidades de las que son signos: el Cuerpo y la Sangre del Señor.

Cuando decimos nuestro “Amén” al ministro que reparte la Hostia, nuestro Amén es nuestro asentimiento a dos realidades duales: la que recibimos en nuestras manos y, al mismo tiempo, ¡el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo, que estamos llamados a ser!

Finalmente, se ha dicho muchas veces que “la Eucaristía hace a la Iglesia”. Un corolario de esto es que, si no hay Eucaristía, también se va la Iglesia. Es por eso por lo que estamos invitados y desafiados a celebrar la Eucaristía todos los domingos, o al menos con la frecuencia que nuestra salud lo permita.
