





Boletim Paroquial Português
2 de Julho de 2023 – Domingo XIII do Tempo Comum
Reflexão pelo Padre Francisco Rodrigues SJ
Mat. 10, 37-42

Quem ama o pai ou a mãe mais do que a mim, não é digno de mim!

O evangelho deste 13º domingo do tempo comum confronta-nos e toca-nos num dos aspetos mais afetivos das nossas vidas: quem ama o pai, a mãe, o filho, a filha, qualquer pessoa ou realidade mais do que Jesus, não é digno do amor de Deus! Será que Deus é ‘ciumento’ ao pôr as relações familiares e de amizade nestes termos? Ao pensarmos em alguém que amamos sobre todas as coisas e por quem nos sentimos incondicionalmente amados, como nos podemos sentir ao ouvir esta frase de Jesus? Temos mesmo que escolher entre Deus e aqueles que mais amamos? Alguém tem que ficar de fora? Será que o amor que somos convidados a termos uns pelos outros é competitivo, seletivo ou complementar?

Nestas reflexões, há um princípio de fundo que nos pode ajudar: nunca duvidar do amor de Jesus por cada um de nós. O único amor que nunca falha, totalmente incondicional, é o amor de Jesus. Os nossos amores só ganham se forem cheios do amor de Jesus. Jesus é Aquele que nos convida a que nos amemos uns aos outros com amor verdadeiro, divino, dedicado e gratuito. No texto, o que Ele nos recorda é o primeiro mandamento: amar a Deus de todo o coração e aos outros como a nós mesmos. Assim, até nos mandamentos parece haver uma ordem interna que dá veracidade e consistência ao amor: amar a Deus com todas as forças, de todo o coração, amarmos os outros e recebermos o amor dos outros à luz do amor de Deus. Qual é a diferença? Se amarmos os outros sem Deus este amor pelos outros será limitado, insuficiente, principalmente em momentos mais difíceis. Noutros termos, o amor sem Deus é sempre um amor incompleto. O amor uns pelos outros a partir de Deus é sempre um amor à prova das dificuldades. Daí que Jesus na defesa do nosso maior bem, quer amores consistentes, resistentes, sólidos, verdadeiros, divinos, humanos, não competitivos. Jesus não quer que ponhamos em segundo plano aqueles que amamos. Jesus quer que O amemos em cada pessoa que amamos. Deste modo, ainda que nos zanguemos uns com os outros, se nos amamos uns aos outros com o amor de Jesus, teremos como primeira prioridade fazer as pazes. Se amamos as pessoas sem o amor de Jesus, as nossas relações de amor, afeto e amizade estão sujeitos a um enorme risco e vulnerabilidade. Peçamos a Deus a graça de pôr sempre em primeiro lugar o amor a Deus manifesto nas pessoas que desejamos amar. Se assim for, e na sequência deste primeiro amor, amaremos os outros com o amor de Jesus, amar-nos-emos a nós mesmos, com o amor de Deus e relacionar-nos-emos com todos os bens e com a reação, com o olhar, o coração e os valores de Jesus. Tenho amado a Deus mais do que aqueles que muito amo? E sei porquê?





