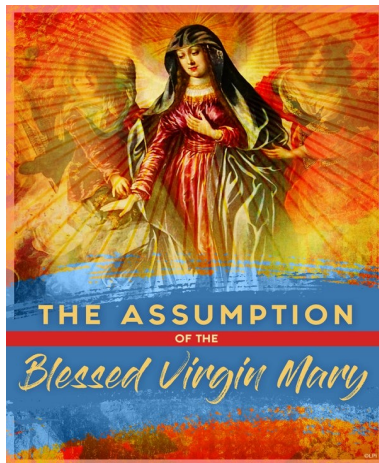

Therefore, dearly beloved, may you too always rejoice in the Lord (Phil 4:4). And may neither bitterness nor a cloud of sadness overwhelm you, O dearly beloved Lady in Christ, joy of the angels and crown of your sisters! Place your mind before the mirror of eternity! Place your soul in the brilliance of glory! Place your heart in the figure of the divine substance! And transform your whole being into the image of the Godhead itself through contemplation! So that you too may feel what His friends feel as they taste the hidden sweetness which God Himself has reserved from the beginning for those who love Him. (Saint Clare of Assisi)

These words of Saint Clare are an invitation to each of us toward unit (“communion”) with the Lord. As we observe the Feast of our Patroness this weekend, we focus at the Eucharist on her great devotion to the Eucharistic Mystery. Remembering that “Eucharist” means “thanksgiving,” we consider these words of Saint John Paul II:

Her whole life was a Eucharist because. . . from her cloister she raised up a continual “thanksgiving” to God in her prayer, praise, supplication, intercession, weeping, offering and sacrifice. She accepted everything from the Father in union with the infinite “thanks” of the only begotten Son.

May our celebration this weekend of our Patroness, Saint Clare, lead each of us – and all of us together – to a deeper appreciation of the gifts that God gives us. May this help us to join our lives with hers in giving thanks to God in all that we are.

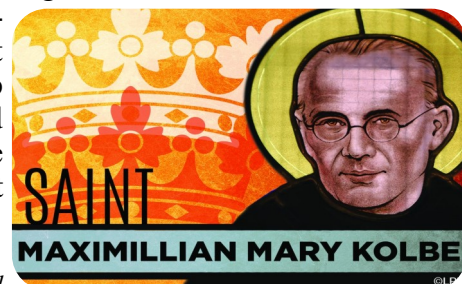
Creation Care Tips

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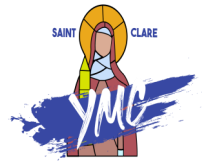

Ideas for Celebrating the Assumption of Mary with your Family:

Attend Mass

Many families may still have children on school summer vacation, presenting an opportunity of attending daily Mass on August 15. When a Solemnity falls on a Monday (or a Saturday) the obligation to attend Mass is abrogated (temporarily waived). However, that should not dissuade you and your family from attending Mass to mark this beautiful Marian feast day.

Pray the Glorious Mysteries

Although the Joyful Mysteries of the Rosary are typically prayed on Mondays, consider instead praying the Glorious Mysteries, which include the *Assumption of Mary* as well as the *Coronation of Mary*, which the Church celebrates every year on August 22. Take a moment to truly reflect on the gloriousness of this moment in Mary's life, and the life of the Church. If you are praying with others, share your thoughts; consider repeating this step for the Coronation as well.

Plant a Mary Garden, Visit One, or Plan Yours for Next Year

Plan a garden based on the many flowers associated with Mary, such as, roses, marigolds, lily, iris, periwinkle, and lady slipper. You don't have to have your own garden to include flowers in your Assumption décor; visit a florist and make a "Mary Bouquet." Your family may wish to present this bouquet to Mary after Mass or visit a Marian Shrine to bring your offering.

Create a wreath of flowers to crown a Mary statue, either in your home, garden, or parish. The sweet tradition of crowning Mary is typically done in May, but certainly, honoring Mary in this simple, yet beautiful, way should not be kept to just one month a year.

Boletim Paroquial Português

13 de Agosto de 2023; Domingo XIX do Tempo Comum / Festa de Santo António
Reflexão por João Pereira Arruda

As leituras deste Domingo levam-nos a ponderar a valorizar o dom da fé. Pedro quando perdeu a sua concentração em Jesus e que desfocou a sua visão no Senhor correu o risco de afundar-se nas ondas enormes criadas pelos ventos fortes, que desfocaram a sua visão no Senhor. Assim também nos nossos dias e donde vivemos se nos desviamos do plano de amor do nosso Deus, ficamos emaranhados nas distrações que o mundo nos oferece. Dete modo a fé que devíamos de cultivar para o crescimento voltado para Deus desaparece para nos concentrarmos nas políticas enganadoras enraizadas na mentira, nas notícias criadas para projectar o que há de mau n mundo que nos rodeia e quando assim o Deus que nos ama e nos quer tanto fica desfocado da nossa concentração ne quando assim nos afundamos no vácuo criado pelo malino para ns perder.

Inserida na celebração deste Domingo celebramos a festa de Santo António de Lisboa, também conhecido pelo Santo mais português. Esqueçamos da festa que se faz no 13 de Junho em Lisboa, Portugal, com as bonitas marchas, os mangericões, os casamentos com as noivas de Santo António e as sardinhas assadas. Tudo isso pode não ser mau, mas nada tem a ver com a vida missionária e evangelizadora do Santo António. Por mais milagres atribuídos a Santo António todos eles foram feitos em nome de Deus e por Deus, Santo António não se deixou distrair; antes pelo contrário, cultivou e alimentou a sua fé no Senhor. Quando se encontrou no meio do naufrágio, este o mudou de rumo, mas levou-o para o sítio que Deus queria que ele fosse pregar o Evangelho. Quando as pessoas não vieram escutar a Palavra de Deus, ele foi transmitir-la aos peixes. Para Santo António a importância de evangelizar o amor de Deus por todo o lado era uma fé abrasadora e um dom lhe ado pelo Espírito Santo que o impelia a pregar aos povos por onde ele andava. Deste modo Santo António não tinha tempo para se distrair com os acontecimentos mundanos do seu tempo, que também os havia tal como agora os temos. O comodismo, o individualismo que alimenta o “meu eu” ou “eu primeiro”, o não tirar tempo para orar e pedir discernimento para escolhas importantes que causam mudanças de impacto nas nossas vidas...tudo isso são distrações dos nossos dias, tudo isso podem criar fossos que impedem de vivermos em áreas e no meio de famílias, de comunidades que aspiram á paz á unidade e á concórdia.

O Evangelho nos diz para não nos distrairmos com o que nos separa de Jesus mas que nos concentremos, pela fé, n’Ele e deste modo nem os ventos, nem a grandeza das ondas podem fazer algo que nos separe do amor de Deus. Sejamos, pois, mais como Santo António que em todo o lado via oportunidades para espalhar o amor de Deus através da Sua Palavra.

Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

1 Kgs 19:9a, 11-13a | Rom 9:1-5 | Mt 14:22-33

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Unlike with our other important relationships, God isn't exactly someone we can meet for coffee and look into his eyes while having a conversation. Whether we talk to God in our mind or out loud, we recognize that even with a good prayer life it can sometimes be difficult to cultivate and maintain a relationship with God. Doubters and unbelievers are quick to remind us how impossible it is to believe what we cannot see or hear, but today's readings also remind us that God doesn't speak to us as another human being would. Maybe he doesn't speak with the booming voice of a preacher or a politician, and maybe he doesn't write direct messages for us in the sky or sand, but God does speak. Perhaps, like Elijah, we tend to expect God to communicate with huge gestures, such as strong wind that crushes rocks, or earthquakes or fires; but we hear today that God spoke to Elijah in a "tiny whispering sound." It's not unlike a very good teacher who doesn't need to raise her voice to get her students' attention when they lose focus - she has their respect and simply needs to speak normally and calmly and the students quiet down, pay attention, and listen. When we still our hearts and minds and listen, in prayer, let us be confident we will hear God's voice.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Perhaps in order to hear God's voice in our lives we need to fine-tune our "hearing." First, how can we hear if we do not have faith? Jesus called Peter out of the boat and into stormy waters, and though he was able to walk on water for a time, Peter began to sink because he became afraid. Doubt or fear can hamper our ability to listen to the Lord clearly; don't let it cloud your love for Christ! Second, we must keep in mind the many ways God speaks to us: his Word (the Bible), the writings of the saints and Church Fathers, our Catholic Tradition, other people God has placed in our lives, and the "tiny whispering sound" we might hear only within our heart. Stay attuned to God's voice; the rewards are heavenly.

INVITATION Ignatian spirituality - meditations, prayers, and contemplative practices - may help us recognize and truly hear the still small voice of God in our lives. The Daily Examen is a prayerful reflection on the events of the day which might help us identify the movement of the Holy Spirit in those moments. Give it a try.

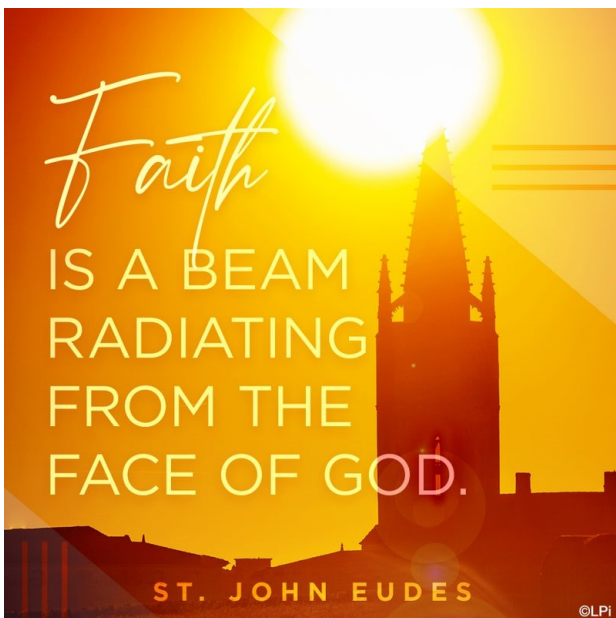

Blessed Fr. Michael Joseph McGivney was a diocesan priest from Connecticut born to an Irish immigrant family. Together with men from his church, St. Mary's in New Haven, he founded what is now the world's largest Catholic fraternal service organization — the Knights of Columbus.
