

From Monsignor Fran Cilia

In describing His own ministry, Jesus stated that "The Son of Man came not to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for the many" (*Matthew 20:8*). It must be the same for the Lord's followers: "The greatest among you must be your servant. Whoever exalts oneself will be humbled, and whoever humbles oneself will be exalted" (*Matthew 23:11-12*).

For many, this is a difficult lesson. Those who know success, achievement, and greatness usually expect their lofty status to accord them great privilege. For the Christian, the privilege is to serve others as did Jesus, the Master Who washed the disciples' feet.

We do not need to look far to find these opportunities. Whether husbands or wives, children, sisters or brothers, each of us has the choice. . .to expect others to do whatever we want them to, or to be the ones who reach out to them. What Jesus did not say, but is implied in the example He gave, was that our service needs to be done in love, not grudgingly or under coercion.

That is the real test of discipleship.


End of Daylight Savings Time - This Sunday



GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE


We all want to feel special and be noticed. We see it in Adam and Eve's decision to eat the fruit in the garden after the snake promises "your eyes will be opened and you will be like gods." (Gen 3:5) The scribes and the Pharisees in today's Gospel certainly appear to fall into this category of wanting to be noticed: "All their works are performed to be seen," Jesus says. To be clear, we ARE each unique children of God: chosen by him and called by name. We are "wonderfully made" by the Lord (Ps 139:14), and that alone makes us valuable beyond measure. The problem arises when we begin to see our value as something we are responsible for on our own. We no longer give glory to God and acknowledge him as the fount of all good things. Instead, we are tempted to take credit for ourselves – that was the error of the scribes and the Pharisees, and it is one against which we should guard ourselves.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Today's readings are instructive and, frankly, a good reminder that as God's beloved children baptized into Christ, we are called to a higher standard. What is this higher standard? First, it entails "[giving] thanks to God unceasingly," as St. Paul said in today's reading. It also involves practicing what we preach in a way the Pharisees do not. At the heart of Jesus' message today is telling us, his followers, how we are meant to live. We are to follow Jesus' words and strive to imitate his actions with humility and love. Does this mean loving unconditionally? It does. Does this mean not seeking places of honor but rather having a servant's attitude? It does. Are these postures and attitudes that come naturally to us as human beings? As descendants of Adam and Eve? Perhaps not. But if we wish to make Jesus the master of our lives, let us discern where we can be serving others better and putting our energy into the work of building God's kingdom.

PRAY The Catechism calls humility the "foundation of prayer."
(CCC 2559) Let us pray this week for the humility to do God's will
without any praise or recognition. Let us ask the Holy Spirit for
wisdom to know what the Lord wants from us and to joyfully fulfill
that call even if it means working in the shadows where no one
will notice.



5 de Novembro de 2023 – Domingo XXXI do Tempo Comum -A Reflexão por: João Pereira Arruda

Jesus Cristo, cabeça da Igreja, Sacerdote por excelência, um de nós, mas Filho único de Deus, viveu sempre em união íntima com os mais fracos, pecadores e humildes. Aos soberbos comparou-os a víboras venenosas. Cristo será tanto mais nosso modelo e mestre, quanto mais soubermos dar a mão ao vizinho ou colega, despojando-nos de nós mesmos. A fidelidade á vocação cristã e sacerdotal a que fomos chamados pelo Baptismo, ou pela ordenação não se realizará por outro caminho. Concentrando-nos na palavra fidelidade vem de imediato o sacramento do matrimónio e de ser a fidelidade a vitamina que alimenta o amr entre os esposos. Porém a fidelidade vai além do casamento, e é, também vidamina no sacerdócio e da entrega dos sacerdotes em servir o Senhor no seu povo. Mateus diz " Aquele que for o maior entre vós, será o vosso servo. Quem se exalta será humilhado e quem se humilha será exaltado". Vai esta filosofia, este modo de pensar contra a corrente que se vive neste mundo. Vai contra Que não sejamos como os doutores da lei, os escribas e fariseus, que no tempo, requeriam os melhores lugares nos banquetes, que gostavam de ser "incenssados" nas praças públicas, gostam que os chamem mestres ou doutores; e or eles serem deste mdo que Jesus os chama de víboras. Se era assim no tempo de Jesus, nos nossos dias, existe uma "pandemia" de se elevar ao cimo dos valores sociais, os ricos, os poderosos, os políticos, as estrelas de cinema e do desporto, etc. As pessoas vão a grandes extremos para lhes serem agradáveis. O nosso Pai ama-nos a todos em distinção de: cor, sexo, posição social, raça....devemos fazer o mesmo.






Faith and Racial Equity: Exploring Power and Privilege
