Mission Statement

Founded in 1777, Saint Clare Parish is an ethnically diverse Catholic community of faith, united in worship, discipleship and service. In welcoming immigrants, newcomers and strangers, we strive to live the virtues of justice and love, so as to be the face of Christ in the world, becoming in Him a sign of unity and an instrument of God's peace.



Liturgical Ministry

In addition to helping our liturgies flow smoothly, these ministries offer an opportunity for members of our parish community to live out the call of the Baptism that we share. "Liturgy," which means "the work of the people," can only be successful when this work is shared by many. The following are opportunities for our parishioners, young and old, to share in this work.

Altar Servers

Service at the altar is open to all who are in fifth grade or older. For many years, this ministry was restricted to boys and men; now, however, it is open to all. Servers add solemnity to our liturgies and provide needed assistance to the celebrant. If you or your child is interested in helping in this way, please see Ryan Bao, our Youth Minister, or one of the priests.

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion assist the priest celebrant of Mass in the distribution of Communion. Since the dawn of the epidemic, reception of Communion by the faithful has been restricted to the Species of consecrated Bread. We look forward to the time when Holy Communion will be offered again under both Sacred Species. Until then, however, the happily growing number of those participating in Sunday Masses presents a need for additional Extraordinary Ministers. If you exercised this ministry in the past or would like to be prepared to do so now, please contact one of the priests.

Lectors

Lectors proclaim the Word of God at our liturgies. At least one – and often two – lectors at each Mass read from Sacred Scripture in a way that helps God's Word come alive in the minds and hearts of listeners. If you have the gift of effective public speaking and would like to be part of this ministry, please contact one of the priests who will refer you to one of the lector coordinators at our various Masses.

Ushers/Ministry of Hospitality

The first person people see when arriving for weekend Mass might be the one who greets them and shares a worship aid for the liturgy. Studies show that the kind of welcome people receive is as important to them as liturgical music or the homily. Parishioners who serve in this ministry offer hospitality, assistance to newcomers and the elderly, and have the responsibility to place the Sunday collection into tamper-proof bags. Would you or your family like to be the "face" of Saint Clare to all? If so, please see one of the priests.

Liturgy of the Word for Children

The Liturgy of the Word with Children ministry is an opportunity for children (grades K-6) to engage with each Sunday's readings with their peers led by a volunteer from the parish. Each Sunday at the 10:30 a.m. and

12 noon Masses, children are briefly dismissed to hear that day's readings at their grade level and participate in an interactive reflection on those readings. When they return to the community for the Eucharist they have a fuller, more age-appropriate understanding of what that Sunday's lessons were.

Please invite your children to join in when you come to the 10:30am Mass (English) and the 12 noon Mass (Spanish). No registration needed!



Liturgical Music

Do you sing or play an instrument? Are you looking to improve your skill in a supportive and fun environment? Are you between 2nd grade and retirement age? Come join St. Clare's choir! In addition to making great music weekly, we develop young people to be liturgical music leaders. Regularly, students starting out on a new instrument build their skill in the context of the ensemble, and we scale a song's difficulty according to each person's ability level. We've had violins, pianists (sometimes playing duets), cellos, trumpets, guitars, percussion...and we're always looking for more talent! Our director, who also serves as assistant director for the San Francisco Bach Choir and was the former director of liturgy and music for the diocese, strives to bring the best musical experience possible to this ensemble.

During rehearsals, we play music theory games, reflect on our experiences as liturgical music leaders, and nurture liturgical composers - including teens in our own ensemble - write new music for us to try. If you're looking for a fun, prayerful, strengths based space to deepen your music talents, this might be your new home!

Rehearsals are on Sundays from 11:45 - 12:45pm in the parish hall, immediately after the 10:30am English Mass. The ensemble mainly offers music at the 10:30am Mass, with some members also helping at the 7:30am Mass.

Faith Formation

Parish Catechetical Program

For Children:

Sunday Faith Formation (a two year preparation for the First Eucharist) serves TK through 7th Grade. Our sessions, follow the Liturgical Calendar in our teaching to enhance the potential learning of all children, especially those who attend Liturgy of the Word for children during Mass. This is our first year catechizing our TK children. It truly is a blessing to witness the happiness of our youngest group and the patient work of our Catechist. Also, in February of 2023, we began Liturgy of the Word for children during our



Spanish Mass at Noon, opening up additional opportunities for our children to expand their understanding of the Liturgy. Bilingual families and/or monolingual families can now attend either Mass to support our community and gather heart stickers for their child's Name Hearts. This gesture captures the commitment of attending Mass as part of their catechetical journey.



All grades take time to gather the parents and children with an experienced Catechist who will lead activities, lessons, and will provide resources for parent engagement during family time. Our books are bilingual to support the need of our families. It is important to us to journey together during this time of preparation of the Sacraments, First Eucharist and First Reconciliation. It is also important to recognize the children who come to us who

have not been baptized and we gladly meet with them for their preparation of Sacraments of Initiation, during our Rite of Christian Initiation for Children sessions that meet on Monday afternoons.

We work closely and collaborate with our school partners, especially the second-grade class, for those children preparing for their First Sacraments. We will be ready to celebrate together!

<u>Formation of Young Women (Quinceñera Preparation):</u>
For those young ladies preparing for their *Quinceñera* and in collaboration with Youth Ministry, we share the importance of understanding this beautiful tradition. This is not a sacrament, but a celebration of coming of age and enjoying the blessing of womanhood and family.

Adults:



Youth Ministry

What have we done in the last year? Thanks to so many of you, we have welcomed and engaged many young people through...

Our first group of Young Adults fundraised and made their trip to World Youth Day in Lisbon, Portugal, during the summer. There, we made friends with hundreds of thousands of other young people, saw Pope Francis, and made lasting memories to enrich our faith.



We soft-opened a youth center that is open on Tuesdays and Thursdays for young people to study in and hang out with friends. We continue to develop this space and are very thankful for generous donations that have already been given.

We took 11 youth to the annual Diocesan Youth Retreat in Lake Tahoe; Father Victor was the chaplain of the retreat. This would not have been possible without donations to our scholarship funds.

We hosted a four-week summer movie night for families and help in multiple parish events throughout the year.
