

What was Jesus’ “new teaching with authority” (Mark 1:27)?

While many speak eloquently, and their power is in their words, Jesus’ words had effect: “He commands even the unclean spirits and they obey him.”

This way of teaching and speaking can also be the way of the Lord’s disciples. Our faith, our words and our actions should be unified. It is the call and commission of the Baptism we share. The mark of being a follower is the Lord’s own authority: in speech and action. While most of us fail in this from time to time, the goal remains before us; we should not be discouraged.

Annual Diocesan Appeal 2024



This weekend, we renew our Annual Diocesan Appeal. Through the ADA, each parish is assigned its fair share of supporting the ministry of Bishop Cantú and the pastoral offices that carry out his work. Saint Clare’s diocesan goal is \$98,700 of the \$7.1 Million overall goal.

In addition to this, we have added a parish goal to bring the total for this year’s Appeal to \$175,000. Achieving our goal (as we did this past year) will help us to keep our budget balanced so we can continue to provide parish ministries and services at their current level, or better.

Next weekend is “Pledge Sunday.” We will be asking you to bring forward your pledges and gifts during the Offertory.

We are extremely grateful to donors in past years and hope that you will be in a position to participate in 2024. We are also reaching out to households who have not taken part in this work in recent years. We need all of you!! Please keep the success of the Annual Appeal in your prayers.



A Stewardship Moment

A central theme in today's Gospel reading is the nature and extent of Jesus' authority. The people were astonished, "for he taught them as one having authority and not as the scribes." Jesus' authority brought blessings to people including healing and comfort. His authority possessed an irresistible power that drew people not through manipulation, but simply by the person that he was and the gifts that he gave. Good stewards reveal the power and authority of Christ through the words they use and deeds they perform every day. At times their stewardship leaves them open to ridicule and scorn. But having the courage to imitate Jesus invites others to imagine a different world. What can we do this week to reveal Christ's authoritative presence in the world?

STEWARDSHIP SAINT for January Saint John Bosco



John Bosco was born in 1815 in a small town near Turin, Italy, now one of the great cultural, educational and manufacturing cities of Italy. He was the youngest of three sons of a family of farm workers. His father died when Bosco was 2 years old, leaving a widowed mother to support a family in her poverty. He was unable to afford an education but was given an opportunity to enter the seminary by a priest who saw promise in the young man. He did well and was ordained to the priesthood in 1841 at age 26. "Don" Bosco soon thereafter began a lifelong devotion to educating and caring for boys and young men who were poor, homeless or among the working class in the newly industrialized city of Turin. Bosco became a pioneer in vocational training. He opened workshops to train tailors, shoemakers, printers, bookbinders and metal workers. Other priests were attracted to his ministry and social outreach and a community began to form. Eventually Don Bosco established the Society of St. Francis de Sales after the saint who inspired him. The Salesians were formally approved as a religious community in 1884. Bosco had served for a time as chaplain to a Catholic shelter for young girls and in 1872 he collaborated with Mary Mazzarello to establish a community of women, the Daughters of Mary Help of Christians, or the Salesian Sisters. Mary Mazzarello was elevated to sainthood in 1951. Upon his death on January 31, 1888, approximately 40,000 mourners filed past his body as he lay in state in church and it is reported that most of the population of Turin lined the streets for his funeral. He was canonized on Easter Sunday 1934 by Pope Pius XI, who as a young priest had known Don Bosco. The next day a national holiday was observed in his honor throughout Italy. Saint John Bosco is the patron saint of Catholic editors and publishers. His feast day is January 31.


Youth Ministry

Weekly Justice Challenges

Very early on in his public career people were spellbound by Jesus' teachings and recognized that there was something unusually powerful about what he was teaching and how he was teaching. The listeners in the synagogue in Capernaum noticed that Jesus was using his power and authority only for good, in this case, to cast out a demon. They noted the contrast with the way the scribes taught and threw around their authority. This week, think about who in your life wields authority and/or speaks persuasively and moves people to action. Now, consider, are those charismatic people using their power for good, or are they using harmful or hateful words or moving people to do harm to others? Identify those voices in your life whom you trust are speaking with the love, compassion, and mercy of Jesus, and listen to them.

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Creation Care Tips



Two hundred thousand Guatemalans were killed between 1960-1996 in a war begun over access to a simple fruit... the banana. Not only has the production of bananas had a huge impact on the people of Guatemala and other Central and South American countries, but it has also negatively impacted the environment in the form of deforestation, soil degradation, erosion, and immense water usage. Consider giving up bananas this week and replacing them with local fruit from your region.

Stewardship in the New Year: Making Commitments to the Lord

Stewardship is a commitment of mind and heart to the Lord; a way of life that needs constant renewal and transformation. This time of year has always been one of looking forward to a new year, reflecting on the changes we need to make in our lives and resolving to follow through on those changes. Perhaps those who seek to make resolutions to be better stewards might find inspiration in one or more of the following samples:

Stewardship of Prayer: Resolve to strengthen your relationship with the Lord through prayer. Notice how often you pray and what hinders you from praying. If you are a beginner, commit to short, daily prayer times.

Stewardship of Family: Resolve to set aside more time to stay connected with your family. Eat dinner together, schedule regular dates with your spouse, plan family outings, and go to Mass together. Practice patience and forgiveness.

Stewardship of Health: Resolve to get those medical and dental checkups. Adopt healthier eating habits. Add exercise and other physical activity to your daily routine.

Stewardship of Possessions: Resolve to possess a little more “lightly” this year. Consider ways you can reduce the amount of all that stuff you own. Distinguish between those items that are necessary and those that are considered luxurious and unnecessary.

Stewardship of the Parish Family: Resolve to serve your faith community in some way this year such as at liturgy, in the parish’s outreach or education and formation efforts. Is it time to enhance your generosity to the parish?

Stewardship of Money: Resolve to render sacred your annual budget. Reprioritize your financial goals to ensure that the Lord comes first in your spending. Take positive steps to improve your financial health.

Stewardship of Work: Resolve to be faithful to your daily, work-related tasks and offer them up to the Lord. Cultivate your skills. Deepen your knowledge. Be mindful of how you are building the Kingdom of God.

Stewardship of Mind: Resolve to keep your mind active. Commit to being more informed on the issues of the day. Read your bible. In this presidential election year in the United States, become even more familiar with Catholic social teaching.

Stewardship of Neighbor: Resolve to be a person of hospitality and mercy. Make time and space for others who enter your life. Be more aware of those times when a neighbor, co-worker, fellow parishioner or stranger, needs a moment of kindness, a little attention or an affirming gesture on your part.

Stewardship of the Poor: Resolve to live with more compassion and in solidarity with those less fortunate. Remember the poor in prayer, and commit to helping relieve in some way the plight of those who are impoverished or marginalized.



Identifica esas voces en tu vida en las que confías que están hablando con el amor, la compasión y la misericordia de Jesús, y escúchalas.

La Corresponsabilidad de la Oración: Propóngase fortalecer su relación con el Señor a través de la oración. Ponga atención en la frecuencia con la que usted hace oración y en lo que le impide orar. Si es principiante, comprométase a tiempos cortos de oración diaria.

La Corresponsabilidad de la Familia: Propóngase apartar más tiempo para reunirse con su familia. Cenen juntos, planee citas habituales con su esposa/o, organice paseos con la familia, y asistan a Misa juntos. Practique la paciencia y el perdón.

La Corresponsabilidad de la Salud: Propóngase llevar a cabo esos chequeos médicos y dentales. Adopte hábitos de alimentación saludable. Agregue ejercicio y otra actividad física a su rutina diaria.

La Corresponsabilidad de las Posesiones: Propóngase tener un poco menos este año. Considere las formas en las que pueda reducir la cantidad de todas esas cosas que tiene. Distinga entre aquellos artículos que son necesarios y los que son considerados de lujo e innecesarios.

La Corresponsabilidad de la Familia Parroquial: Propóngase servir a su comunidad de fe este año en alguna manera, como en la liturgia, en la extensión de la parroquia o en los esfuerzos de educación y de formación. ¿Es este un tiempo para incrementar su generosidad hacia la parroquia?

La Corresponsabilidad del Dinero: Propóngase hacer sagrado su presupuesto anual. Revise la prioridad de sus metas financieras para asegurarse de que el Señor está en primer lugar en sus gastos. Adopte medidas positivas para mejorar su salud financiera.

La Corresponsabilidad del Trabajo: Propóngase ser fiel a sus tareas diarias relacionadas con el trabajo y ofrézcalas al Señor. Cultive sus habilidades. Profundice su conocimiento. Sea consciente de cómo está usted construyendo el Reino de Dios.






