

From Monsignor Fran Cilia

The readings we hear at Mass this weekend help us along our Lenten journey.

Exodus recounts the giving of the law to Israel through Moses; the commandments he received are the same that help guide us in our relationship with God and one another.

The gospel account of the cleansing of the temple presents Jesus as the new temple, that place where God lives, which would be destroyed and raised on the third day. Jesus shows the inadequacy of the old law and offers us, in Himself, the new law of love.

As we continue along the path to Easter, may we walk with the Lord in spirit and truth.

The First Scrutiny for our Elect

On Saturday evening, we are celebrating the first of three Scrutinies (penitential examinations) of the Elect, to assist them in uncovering sin in their lives so that they can prepare through the grace of God for Baptism at Easter. These celebrations invite the entire community to pray in support of the Elect and, at the same time, examine our own lives to consider our fidelity to the Sacrament of Baptism.

The readings for the Masses at which the Scrutinies occur differ from those at the other liturgies. This weekend, we hear the account of the Samaritan Woman at the Well; next weekend (at the 10:30 Mass), we focus on the Man Born Blind and at the Vigil Mass of the Fifth Sunday of Lent, we will hear the gospel reading of the Raising of Lazarus. Thus, Jesus is seen as Living Water, the Light of the World, and Resurrection and Life. These three baptismal themes also help the Elect on their way to Easter.



Annual Diocesan Appeal: Report #3

LENT AT SAINT CLARE PARISH

The traditional works of Lent are Prayer, Penance and Care for the Poor.

We began this season of 40 days in prayer together on Ash Wednesday, when we are invited to renew our faithfulness to Christian living, called to do penance and to begin a time of special care for those who do not share the goodness of creation as we do (almsgiving). On that day, we were marked with ashes.

Lent is a very special time for our Elect, who approach the waters of Baptism at Easter. We hold them in our prayers and try to be examples of Christian living for them. We will celebrate the Second Scrutiny at the 10:30 Mass on the Fourth Sunday in Lent and the final one, at the 5:00 pm Saturday Vigil Mass of the Fifth Sunday of Lent (March 16).

Here in our parish, we hope that our Lenten offerings will continue to help all of us – individually and as a community – to deepen our baptismal sharing the in the life of the Lord and the Church.

Continuing until March 22, we will celebrate bilingual (English and Spanish) **Stations of the Cross**, on Friday evenings at 7:00 pm.

We have scheduled two parish Communal Celebrations of the **Sacrament of Reconciliation**, at the following times:


Saturday, March 23 at 3:00 pm

Weekly Justice Challenges

In the First Reading (Exodus 20:1-17) for this Sunday, we hear the story of God giving the Ten Commandments to the Israelites. Did you know that many, if not most, of the justice teachings in the Catechism of the Catholic Church are found in the section on the commandments, particularly Commandment Seven — You Shall Not Steal? This is because the Seventh Commandment reminds us of how important it is to be other-centered and to respect their rights and property. Jesus' whole life was a witness to living for others. As disciples, we are called to follow Jesus' example. Your challenge this week is to choose one thing you can do each day which is totally other-centered, something which has no direct benefits for you. Do it, not because it makes you feel good or makes you proud, but simply because it's what God is calling you to do.

Renewed Temples



Today's readings: Exodus 20:1–17; Psalm 19:8, 9, 10, 11; 1 Corinthians 1:22–25; John 2:13–25. Lent is a time for interior and exterior cleansing. Jesus was outraged when he saw what was taking place in the temple. The moneychangers failed to show reverence for the house of God when they used it as a marketplace. While some could not understand Jesus' overturning of the moneychangers' tables, the disciples recalled the words of Scripture, "Zeal for your house will consume me." Jesus' reaction to the sales in the temple make it apparent that such zeal was missing from others.

In baptism, we become a temple of the Holy Spirit. Our consideration of Christ's care for the temple in Jerusalem is an opportunity to reflect on how we care for all human beings, who are made in the image and likeness of

God. Do we treat them with the dignity that a child of God deserves, remembering each person is sacred?

Just as you show concern for others, you need to care for yourself. How do you care for your interior life? Do you seek reconciliation with God through the sacrament of penance? Do you take to heart that God's mercy is for you as well as for others? In the remaining weeks of Lent, be especially attentive to the words of the penitential act. During this part of the Mass, the faithful may pray the Confiteor, after which the priest calls on God's mercy. The other option is for the faithful to pray the Kyrie, saying, "Lord, have mercy / Christ have mercy" to the priest's invocations. Seeking mercy, our zeal for God is apparent.

REVEAL Christ's LOVE



After years of tension between Ukraine and the Russian Federation, Russian forces began a devastating war in February 2022 by invading Ukraine. In addition to killing and wounding many, the conflict has forced millions of Ukrainians to flee the country. Many refugees went to neighboring countries in Europe, but many others came to the United States. For decades, the Migration and Refugee Services (MRS) department of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) has assisted refugees fleeing wars and persecution, and in 2022 it responded to the Ukrainian refugee crisis with two initiatives to help local communities welcome refugees.

The first initiative, Welcome Circles, is a community-led program that helps local groups work together to provide financial support and connect refugees to services such as health care and education. Although Welcome Circles are locally led, they are certified, vetted, and given ongoing guidance by MRS staff or local affiliate experts. MRS's support and guidance help each Welcome Circle accompany refugees effectively during the resettlement process. As of early 2023, the Welcome Circles program already had 25 circles engaging more than 200 volunteers and had expanded to welcome refugees from Haiti, Cuba, Nicaragua, and Venezuela in addition to Ukraine.

Since 2010, MRS has led the second initiative, Parishes Organized to Welcome Immigrants and Refugees (POWIR), a program that works with select diocesan resettlement programs to empower parishes and local Catholic institutions so they can welcome and assist immigrants and refugees at the diocesan level. From May 2021 to January 2023, this diocesan support helped nearly 10,000 local volunteers, working in Catholic communities in 23 active POWIR

programs nationwide, to spend more than 100,000 volunteer hours working with and on behalf of about 24,000 clients.

Funds received through The Catholic Relief Services Collection allow MRS to help victims of war and oppression begin new lives in welcoming, supportive communities through innovative initiatives like Welcome Circles and POWIR. In addition to MRS, the collection supports other Catholic organizations that aid victims of persecution and natural disasters, provide legal services to poor immigrants, and advocate for the powerless.



Reflexão Por: João Pereira Arruda

As leituras deste Domingo apresentam-nos duas componentes para cada um de nós reflectir. A primeira; Em que nível está a minha fé em relação á de Abraão? A segunda é; que nível se situa a minha confiança em Jesus Cristo ao saber que Ele morreu e ressuscitou pela salvação da humanidade e nos prometeu estar no meio de nós até ao fim dos tempos! Que ingredientes nos falta para que a fé e a confiança em Deus cresça em cada um de nós? A Oração é o canal pelo qual nos comunicamos com Deus. Quando nos comunicamos pela Oração com Deus; será que criamos, preparamos um meio ambiental pela qual temos o coração aberto para que a voz do Senhor chegue até nós? Quando a voz do Senhor chegando até nós tomamos uma atitude resoluta; tal e qual; Abraão teve, ao ponto de executar a ordem do Senhor e ir em holocausto imolar Isac, seu único filho? Se vêmos o impossível neste gesto ou resolução de Abraão de impossível, a partir do princípio ficamos incapazes da fé crescer em nós. Por outro lado se estamos tolhidos, amarrados a preconceitos, nunca mais teremos uma confiança total em Deus. 3. Confissões: Este ano estão programados dois serviços penitenciais: o primeiro no Sábado dia 23 de Março ás 3 horas da tarde e o outro na Terça Feira dia 26 de Março ás 7 horas da noite. As confissões serão feitas nas línguas: Inglês, Português e Espanhol.
4. Programa tigela de arroz. Esse programa será feito nas mesmas normas dos anos anteriores a este. O producto recolhido nesta campanha será depois distribuído pela Organização do “Católic Relif Serviços” 75 por cento para paizes muito pobres e 25 por cento pelos pobres da nossa paróquia.
5. Devocão da Via-Sacra: Esta devocão será feita todas as sextas feiras ás 7 horas da noite na nossa Igreja em Ingês e Espanhol.
6. Romaria Quaresmal, A Irmandade Familiar do Espírito Santo levará a efecto uma romaria ao estilo micaelense, fazendo oração nas igrejas da cidade de Santa Clara no Sábado dia 23 de Março.

Las lecturas que escuchamos en la Misa este fin de semana, nos ayudan en nuestro camino cuaresmal.



Consejos para el Cuidado de la Creación

“No te harás una imagen, figura alguna de lo que hay arriba en el cielo, abajo en la tierra o en el agua bajo tierra”. – Éxodo 20:4. El Papa Francisco habló de los nuevos ídolos de la humanidad: el dinero y las ganancias. “Ya no es el hombre quien manda sino el dinero; dinero, el poder del dinero... hombres y mujeres son sacrificados a los ídolos de la ganancia y del consumo: es la 'cultura del desperdicio'" (Plaza de San Pedro, 2013). Esta semana, confronta la cultura del desperdicio en tu vida y en tu hogar. Reduce los artículos de un solo uso (platos de papel, vasos de plástico, etc.) y no compres nada nuevo que no sea imprescindible. Dona dinero y artículos y ropa poco usados a organizaciones locales que apoyan a las personas sin hogar y a los necesitados.



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Desafío Semanal de Justicia

En la primera lectura (Éxodo 20:1-17) para este domingo, escuchamos la historia de Dios dando los Diez Mandamientos a los israelitas. ¿Sabías que muchas de las enseñanzas de justicia en el Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica se encuentran en la sección sobre los mandamientos, en particular el mandamiento siete, que no robarás? Esto se debe a que el Séptimo Mandamiento nos recuerda lo importante que es estar centrados en los demás y respetar sus derechos y propiedades. Toda la vida de Jesús fue un testimonio de vivir para los demás. Como discípulos, estamos llamados a seguir el ejemplo de Jesús. Tu reto esta semana es elegir una cosa que puedas hacer cada día que esté totalmente centrada en el otro, algo que no tenga beneficios directos para ti. Hazlo no porque te haga sentir bien o te haga sentir orgulloso, sino simplemente porque es lo que Dios te está llamando a hacer.

Lecturas del día: Éxodo 20:1-17; Salmo 19:8, 9, 10, 11; 1 Corintios 1:22-25; Juan 2:13-25. La Cuaresma es el tiempo para la limpieza interna y externa. Jesús se indignó ante lo que estaba sucediendo en el templo. Los cambistas no mostraron ningún respeto a la casa de Dios cuando la usaron de mercado. Si bien algunos alcanzaban a comprender por qué Jesús volteó las mesas de los cambistas, los discípulos recordaron las palabras de las Escrituras: “El celo por tu casa me devora”. La reacción de Jesús ante el mercado en el templo evidenció que ese celo estaba ausente en los demás.

En el bautismo nos convertimos en templo del Espíritu Santo. El aprecio que Cristo tiene por el templo de Jerusalén es una oportunidad para reflexionar cuánto cuidado le dispensamos al ser humano, hecho a imagen y semejanza

de Dios. ¿Lo tratamos con la dignidad con la que merece ser tratado un hijo de Dios?

Así como usted se preocupa por los demás, debe preocuparse por usted mismo. ¿Cómo cuida su vida interior? ¿Busca reconciliarse con Dios mediante el sacramento de la penitencia? ¿Se toma en serio que la misericordia de Dios es para usted y para los demás? En las semanas restantes de Cuaresma, preste atención especial a las palabras del acto penitencial. Durante esta parte de la misa, los fieles rezarán el *Confiteor* (el “yo pecador”) después de lo cual el sacerdote pide la misericordia de Dios. Aunque también podrían rezar el *Kyrie*, diciendo: “Señor, ten piedad / Cristo ten piedad” a las invocaciones del sacerdote. Mientras buscamos la misericordia de Dios, manifestamos nuestro celo por él.





