



From Monsignor Fran Cilia

“Sir, we would like to see Jesus” was the request made to Philip.

This same request has been made for two millennia, by inquirers and believers alike. It is both the first step toward faith and the deepening of faith in those who already share that gift.

In the Gospel account this Sunday, Jesus responds to those who want to see Him with the stark reality of His fate: “Unless the grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a single grain, but if it dies, it produces much fruit.” Yet there is also the warning and invitation to believers: “Whoever loves one’s life loses it, and whoever hates one’s life in this world will preserve it for eternal life. Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there also will my servant be.”

The more we come to know Jesus, the more real is the challenge to join Him in “losing” life so that we may “preserve” it for eternal life. These final two weeks of Lent invite us to renew ourselves as disciples of the Lord; may our solemn commemoration of His Dying and Rising deepen our sharing in the mystery of the love God has for us, the same love we are privileged to have for one another.

Third Scrutiny

We celebrate the Third Scrutiny (penitential examination) with our Elect at the 5:00 pm Mass this Saturday. The readings for that Mass differ from the others. The Gospel Reading (John 11) tells the story of Lazarus, the friend of Jesus whom the Lord raised from the dead. This is the third of the great baptismal themes we hear these three Sundays. Two weeks ago, Jesus revealed Himself to the Samaritan woman at the well as “Living Water.” Last Sunday, we heard at the 10:30 Mass the story of the man who was born blind as we celebrated Jesus as the Light of the world and Light of our lives. These three baptismal themes (water, light and life) help to prepare our Elect for the Easter Sacraments. The invitation is also extended to us, who are already baptized, to deepen our sharing in these same gifts given to us by the Lord, to deepen our sharing in His life.

Easter Flowers for the Church and the Altar of Repose

Once again, we invite you to help prepare the church for Easter by bringing Easter Lilies and other Spring flowering plants (such as azaleas, etc.) for our celebrations of Easter and the whole Easter Season, which ends on May 19.

We also welcome Cala Lilies to decorate the Altar of Repose in the tent, after the Evening Mass of the Lord’s Supper on Holy Thursday. Perhaps you have some growing in your yard? We would be grateful if you are able to share these with the parish.



Annual Diocesan Appeal: Report #6

Thanks to so many of our parishioners, we continue to move toward our \$175,000 goal. As of Thursday, we have received 216 pledges and gifts, for a total of \$145,572. We still have \$29,428 to reach our goal. The good news is that we have far surpassed our diocesan-assigned goal of \$98,700 and that everything we raise now will return to Saint Clare to help balance our budget in the face of unexpected expenses and loss of rental income, approximately \$6500 per month.

LENT AT SAINT CLARE PARISH

The traditional works of Lent are Prayer, Penance and Care for the Poor. We began this season of 40 days in prayer together on Ash Wednesday, when we are invited to renew our faithfulness to Christian living, called to do penance and to begin a time of special care for those who do not share the goodness of creation as we do (almsgiving). On that day, we were marked with ashes.

Lent is a very special time for our Catechumens, our “Elect”, who approach the waters of Baptism at Easter. We hold them in our prayers and try to be examples of Christian living for them. This weekend, will celebrate the **Third Scrutiny** at the 5:00 pm Vigil Mass of the Fifth Sunday of Lent, hearing Scripture readings that highlight the raising of Lazarus (John 11).

Here in our parish, we hope that our Lenten offerings will continue to help all of us – individually and as a community – to deepen our baptismal sharing in the life of the Lord and the Church.

We will celebrate bilingual (English and Spanish) Stations of the Cross, this Friday evening, at 7:00 pm. This will be our last such celebration this Lent

We have scheduled two parish Communal Celebrations of the **Sacrament of Reconciliation**, at the following times:

Next Saturday, March 23 at 3:00 pm
Tuesday, March 26 at 7:00 pm

Confessions will be available in English, Spanish, Portuguese and a number of other languages.

If you have been filling your **Rice Bowls** from **Catholic Relief Services** (CRS), we ask you to bring them to Mass next weekend, as we celebrate Palm Sunday.



Weather permitting, our Palm Sunday Masses will begin in the Grotto area, where we will distribute and bless the palms. Unless you cannot do so because of mobility issues, we ask all to gather at the Grotto. Masses will begin on-time, so as not to impede the following Masses.



PONTIFICAL GOOD FRIDAY COLLECTION

Pope Francis has asked our parish to support the Pontifical Good Friday Collection, which helps Christians in the Holy Land. Your support helps the church minister in parishes, provide Catholic schools and offer religious education. The Pontifical Good Friday Collection helps to preserve the sacred shrines.

The Pandemic hit particularly hard the Christians in the Holy Land. Most of them depend on pilgrimages to work. In these times of crisis, the Pontifical Good Friday Collection is also necessary to meet the basic needs of the people of God still living in this land where the Church was born.

When you contribute to the Pontifical Good Friday Collection, you become an instrument of peace and join with Catholics around the world in solidarity with the Church in the Holy Land.

Creation Care Tips

March 22nd is World Water Day. The average household in the United States uses more than 333 gallons of water a day, 70 percent for indoor use. This week, decrease your water usage. Covenant of Love



Today's readings: Jeremiah 31:31–34; Psalm 51:3–4, 12–13, 14–15, (12a); Hebrews 5:7–9; John 12:20–33. On this Fifth Sunday of Lent, the readings begin by recalling the covenant God made with the chosen people. The Lord tells the prophet Jeremiah, “I will place my law within them and write it upon their hearts; I will be their God, and they shall be my people.” In the covenant that God keeps with us today, he offers us eternal life. Jesus refers to that life in the Gospel reading, saying, “Whoever loves his life loses it, and whoever hates his life in this world will preserve it for eternal life.”

The first reading explains that all shall know God, for he “will forgive their evildoing and remember their sin no more.” In the second cove-

nant, Jesus lays down his life for us on the cross, erasing our sins and reconciling us with God. The Letter to the Hebrews explains that Christ “became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey him.”

To obey God, to have a place for him in our hearts, we seek a pure heart, praying from Psalm 51, “Create a clean heart in me, O God.” In this psalm, we ask not only that our souls be cleansed of sin but for a steadfast and willing spirit. How will you carry this psalm with you through this week so that you can be true to the love God offers? How can this psalm turn you to God’s presence so that you might be a walking testimony of his love?

Boletim Paroquial Português

17 de Março de 2024 – Domingo V da Quaresma -B
Reflexão Por: João Pereira Arruda

Estamos a celebrar neste Quinto Domingo da Quaresma o penúltimo Domingo da nossa preparação para a Festa da Páscoa. As leituras que iremos escutar nos convidam a meditar sobre o tema da aliança. As propriedades do sacramento matrimonial que a Santa Igreja nos ensina são: unidade e indissolubilidade. O sacramento matrimonial é a celebração e o compromisso de amor entre um homem e uma mulher, com o objectivo de estarem unidos e formarem família cristã. No Antigo Testamento, Deus fez uma Aliança com o seu povo. Esta aliança expressa que Des será sempre fiel a seu povo e vice-versa. No Novo Testamento, a Aliança se realiza em Cristo com a sua Igreja. Concede aos esposos a graça de se amarem com o mesmo amor com que Cristo amou a sua Igreja. A graça do Sacramento leva à perfeição o amor humano dos esposos, consolida sua unidade indissolúvel tal como o que Deus uniu o homem não separa. Aqui a palavra Testamento, significa acordo, aliança, pacto ou promessa. O Antigo Testamento no apresenta tr alianças que Deus fez com a humanidade: a Aliança que Deus fez com Abraão, com Noé e com Moisés. Na Segunda Leitura S. Paulo nos apresenta Jesus Cristo, o Sumo Sacerdote da Nova Aliança. Com um coração transformado, o homem é capaz de: pensar, decidir e agir segundo os esquemas e instruções de Deus, no qual é necessário ser fiel a esta nova aliança, em obediência aos mandamentos, no respeito às leis, e no amor a Deus. Daí resulta um relacionamento pessoal de proximidade, de intimidade, precisamente, um relacionamento de maneira mais familiar. Deus anuncia o perdão pelas faltas do seu povo, um perdão total e sem reservas. Este é um dos resultados deste novo relacionamento que será estabelecido entre Deus e seu povo.. Antes de morrer, Jesus instituiu um memorial desta Nova Aliança com seus discípulos na última ceia, que é a Eucaristia. Nmais pelo sangue de um cordeiro ou de um bode mas o do próprio Filho de Deus. Assim, sempre ouvimos as palavras repetidas pelo sacerdote na hora da consagração ‘tomai e bebei este é o cálice de Meu sangue, o sangue da nova e eterna aliança’; professamos a nossa fidelidade à Nova Aliança de Deus conosco.

- 5. Devoção da Via-Sacra: Esta devoção será feita todas as sextas feiras às 7 horas da noite na nossa Igreja em Inglês e Espanhol.*
- 6. Romaria Quaresmal, A Irmandade Familiar do Espírito Santo levará a efeito uma romaria ao estilo micalense, fazendo oração nas igrejas da cidade de Santa Clara no próximo Sábado dia 23 de Março. Todos são convidados a participar.*

En “Señor, nos gustaría ver a Jesús” fue el pedido que le hicieron a Felipe.

Esta misma petición ha sido hecha durante dos milenios, tanto por investigadores como por creyentes. Es a la vez el primer paso hacia la fe y la profundización de la fe en aquellos que ya comparten ese don.

En el relato del Evangelio de este domingo, Jesús responde a quienes quieren verlo con la cruda realidad de su destino: “Si el grano de trigo no cae en la tierra y muere, queda solo un grano; pero si muere, produce mucho fruto”. Sin embargo, también está la advertencia y la invitación a los creyentes: “El que ama su vida, la perderá, y el que aborrece su vida en este mundo, para vida eterna la conservará. El que me sirve debe seguirme, y donde yo esté, allí también estará mi siervo”.

Cuanto más conocemos a Jesús, más real es el desafío de unirnos a Él en “perder” la vida para poder “preservarla” para la vida eterna. Estas dos últimas semanas de Cuaresma nos invitan a renovarnos como discípulos del Señor; que nuestra solemne conmemoración de Su muerte y resurrección profundice nuestra participación en el misterio del amor que Dios tiene por nosotros, el mismo amor que tenemos el privilegio de tener unos por otros.

Tercer Escrutinio

Celebramos el Tercer Escrutinio (examen penitencial) con nuestros Elegidos en la Misa de las 5:00 pm este sábado. Las lecturas de esa Misa difieren de las demás. La lectura del Evangelio (Juan 11) cuenta la historia de Lázaro, el amigo de Jesús a quien el Señor resucitó de entre los muertos. Este es el tercero de los grandes temas bautismales que escuchamos estos tres domingos. Hace dos semanas, Jesús se reveló a la mujer samaritana junto al pozo como “Agua Viva”. El domingo pasado escuchamos en la Misa de las 10:30 la historia del hombre que nació ciego mientras celebramos a Jesús como la Luz del mundo y Luz de nuestras vidas. Estos tres temas bautismales (agua, luz y vida) ayudan a preparar a nuestros Elegidos para los Sacramentos Pascuales. La invitación se extiende también a nosotros, que ya estamos bautizados, a profundizar nuestra participación en estos mismos dones que nos ha dado el Señor, a profundizar nuestra participación en su vida.

Todavía nos quedan \$29,428 para alcanzar nuestra meta. La buena noticia es que hemos superado con creces nuestra meta diocesana asignada de \$98,700 y que todo lo que recaudemos ahora regresará a Saint Clare para ayudar a equilibrar nuestro presupuesto ante gastos inesperados y pérdida de ingresos por alquiler, aproximadamente \$6500 por mes.

Si hay una llave de agua que gotea en tu casa, llama a un plomero o tómate un tiempo para reparar la pérdida de agua esta semana.


