

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From Monsignor Fran Cilia

We resume Sundays in Ordinary Time this weekend. Since the beginning of Lent on Ash Wednesday (February 14), we have observed the seasons of Lent and Easter; in addition to this, the two Sundays following Pentecost are devoted to the Holy Trinity and the Body and Blood of the Lord.

Here is a concise description of Ordinary Time, found in the *Universal Norms of the Liturgy*, 43:

Besides the times of the year that have their own distinctive character, there remains in the yearly cycle thirty-three or thirty-four weeks in which no particular aspect of the mystery of Christ is celebrated, but rather the mystery of Christ himself is honored in its fullness, especially on Sundays.

These weeks are not called, “ordinary,” because they lack a special character, but because they are “ordered” by number, from 1 to 34. During this time, except on feast days and commemorations of the saints, the liturgical color is green.



Welcome, Seminarian Michael Silva

Our diocesan seminarian, Michael Silva, moved into the rectory earlier this week. He will be with us until the beginning of August. Michael's family is Portuguese and they are parishioners of Five Wounds Portuguese National Parish. During Michael's time with us, we will have the opportunity to come to know him and to support him as he continues responding to the Lord's call as he studies at Saint Mary of the Lake Seminary in Mundelein, Illinois, where he will be in his second year of philosophy, beginning in August.

Mission Co-Operative Plan at Saint Clare – Next Weekend

We will welcome Father Antonio Gutiérrez, SDB, a Salesian of Saint John Bosco, who will speak to us of the missionary activity of his congregation.

Fr. Antonio Gutiérrez hails from Spain and has been a missionary since 1987. His work has taken him to various countries, including Benin, Togo, Tunisia, and Sierra Leone. He has engaged directly with rural communities on agricultural endeavors and emphasizes its three key pillars:



WATER: Fr. Gutierrez has constructed around 200 wells around the world to provide clean water for vegetable gardens and for personal consumption.

FERTILIZER, particularly compost: Fr. Gutierrez not only produces organic fertilizer, but also teaches others how to produce it.

BEES: Fr. Gutierrez recognizes the vital role of bees in pollination for agriculture and has initiated projects despite local superstition and fears surrounding bees. He views bees as valuable allies in agricultural projects.

In addition to his pastoral duties as a priest, Fr. Gutierrez remains dedicated to these agricultural pursuits, which he considers integral to his mission.

Quarterly Stewardship Collection

This catch-all title of our collection this weekend is because of the general nature of the expenses that we are trying to cover. Various needs arise during the year, needs that were not expected. Our budget is so tight that we cannot put aside extra for the unexpected, such as the rectory/office boiler emergency repair (\$30,000), the new security cameras in and around the church and the gym (\$17,000), the loss of rental income from the JVC House and the little house (\$75,000) and last week's celebration for Father Victor's 5th Anniversary (a priceless celebration of great value to us all, but the total cost is still unknown).

All-told, this results in more than \$100,000 negative affect on the parish's finances.

That is why we are coming to you in this special quarterly collection, if you have any ability to help us try to cover this situation in any way, we are grateful.



GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

I know people who read the ending of a book before they are finished with it. I could never do that! I have to follow the story in every detail until the final page. When it comes to the story of our salvation history, however, we get to do a little of both: we know the end of the story in terms of Revelation and God's desire for us to live with him in eternity. We know of the heavenly kingdom to which we have been invited and in which we live. What we don't know is all the details that get us to our own, individual, final page in the great drama of our response to the gift of salvation. In the first reading today, we hear the story of the fall of humankind – about how our earliest parents rejected God's command and gave into temptation. However, the story doesn't end there. Adam and Eve may have been sent out of the Garden of Eden, but God didn't give up on them – or us. Instead, he sent a long line of prophets who paved the way for his Son, Jesus. With Jesus' sacrifice on the cross, the gates of heaven were opened so all have the opportunity to accept the gift of salvation. As St. Paul writes in his Letter to the Corinthians, we can know "that the one who raised the Lord Jesus will raise us also with Jesus."

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Paul's words give us great hope and encouragement, for we all know that living as God commands can be difficult. We are assured, however, that grace and strength are ours if we only ask the Holy Spirit for guidance. As Christians, we are part of the body of Christ and a community of believers. In today's Gospel, Jesus notes that a house divided against itself cannot stand. That's a reminder that we are all in this together. We need one another – and the grace of God – to bring us to everlasting life in heaven. In the Gospel Jesus asked, "Who are my mother and my brothers?" And we heard the answer: those who do the will of God. Let us open our hearts today to receive the promptings and grace of God, so we may follow him to the best of our ability each day. The story of salvation is our story, and we know what the ending is meant to be.

PRAY As members of the body of Christ, perhaps there are ways this week we could be praying alongside our brothers and sisters in our church or community. In addition to Mass, consider Eucharistic Adoration or a prayer group. Reflect on how God might be nudging your heart.

Reanudamos los domingos del Tiempo Ordinario este fin de semana. Desde el inicio de la Cuaresma el Miércoles de Ceniza (14 de febrero), hemos observado los tiempos de Cuaresma y Pascua; además de esto, los dos domingos siguientes a Pentecostés están dedicados a la Santísima Trinidad y al Cuerpo y Sangre del Señor.

He aquí una descripción concisa del Tiempo Ordinario, que se encuentra en las Normas Universales de la Liturgia, 43:

Además de los tiempos que tienen un carácter propio, quedan treinta y tres o treinta y cuatro semanas en el transcurso del año, en las que no se celebra ningún aspecto particular del misterio de Cristo; más bien este misterio se vive en toda su plenitud, particularmente los domingos.

Estas semanas no se llaman “ordinarias” porque carezcan de un carácter especial, sino porque están “ordenadas” por número, del 1 al 34. Durante este tiempo, excepto en las fiestas y conmemoraciones de los santos, el color litúrgico es verde.


