

From Monsignor Fran Cilia

As we enter the final weeks of the liturgical year, the Church provides us with “apocalyptic” readings, those that deal with the end times.

From the prophet Daniel, we hear of the rise of the Archangel Michael, “guardian of [God’s] people.” At that time [“a time unsurpassed in distress since nations began until that time”], “the wise shall shine brightly like the splendor of the firmament, and those who lead the many to justice shall be like the stars forever” (Daniel 12).

In the gospel reading, Jesus addresses the time when “the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light, and the stars will be falling from the sky, and the powers in the heavens will be shaken” (Mark 13).

Whether we welcome or fear those times depends upon how prepared we are – by the manner of our lives – to meet the Lord. Responding to the grace of God – God’s living presence within each of us – the choice is ours. May each of us choose wisely!

Thanksgiving Day Mass



On Thursday, November 28, Thanksgiving Day, our parish Mass will be at 10:00 am. Gathering as a parish family, this is our first celebration of the day, to be followed by our coming together around the tables of our families and friends.

Our trilingual (English/Spanish/Portuguese) celebration of Mass will include a collection to benefit the work of the Saint Vincent de Paul Society in our own parish, as well as a collection of non-perishable foods. These will be part of our procession of gifts, along with the bread and wine that will be offered at the liturgy. Please bring canned and other non-perishable with you to Mass and keep them with you until the Offertory procession.

We look forward to our coming together on what is known as an “American Feast.”

No próximo Domingo celebraremos a solenidade de Jesus Cristo Rei do Universo e com ela encerraremos o Ano Litúrgico do Ano -B para depois darmos início ao Advento com o Ano C. Neste Domingo porém a Igreja recomenda-nos para este Domingo termos em consideração o pobre. Sempre que os pobres são mencionados imediatamente nos vem ao juizo os lázaros dos nossos dias, carentes de tudo incluindo o essencial para viver. Antes de Lázaro, amigo de Jesus. Já antes havia pobres tão pobres como os lázaros dos nossos dias que vagueiam por todos os lados sem lar vivendo das esmolas de gente rica; que muito bem, podem ser, tu e eu que lutando pelo pão nosso de cada dia pelo menos vai dando por manter um lar com comida e roupa para vestir. Pobres assim, são tão lázaros como os lázaros que nos são mais visíveis pelas ruas, praças ou centros comerciais.. 




Dn 12:1-3 | Heb 10:11-14, 18 | Mk 13:24-32

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

My brother-in-law inherited his father's company. Although he studied business in college, he knew years before receiving his degree that, provided he was faithful to his studies, he would have a comfortable job waiting for him after graduation. We may not all inherit the same economic opportunities as my brother-in-law, but, as Christians, we are heirs of infinitely greater spiritual ones. *You are my inheritance, O Lord*, the psalmist says. This phrase reveals the tremendous goodness of God who not only created us but who, in baptism, extended to us an invitation and a promise: provided we are faithful to him, we are heirs of eternal life. Nothing short of eternity will be sufficient to express our thanksgiving to him for this gift.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Daniel's words in today's first reading remind us not only of the gratitude we owe to God but also of our responsibility to help souls who have gone astray from following him.

Some shall live forever, the prophet says, but *others shall be an everlasting horror and disgrace*. The reality is that eternal life is not guaranteed us – not because God does not offer it freely, but because we are free to reject his offer. My brother-in-law, if he had neglected his studies in college, would never have equipped himself to run the family business. His father may have wholeheartedly desired to give the company to him, but doing so would have been irresponsible if his son did not want to take the helm. Likewise, God's mercy is abundant; but we can nevertheless say "no" to God by choosing not to follow him. As Christians seeking (although imperfectly) to follow the Lord, we have the dignity of cooperating with God in order to draw the souls who have gone astray back to him. By word, example, prayer, and sacrifice, we can help others experience the joy of knowing God in this life and of living forever with him in the next.

PRAY The Church especially devotes the month of November to praying for the souls in Purgatory. These individuals died in a state of friendship with God but are still in need of purification. God is indeed their *inheritance*, but they experience pain because they do not possess him yet. One way to remember to pray for the Holy Souls is to conclude grace before meals in this way: "Bless us, O Lord ... May the souls of the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace."

Al entrar en las últimas semanas del año litúrgico, la Iglesia nos ofrece lecturas “apocalípticas”, aquellas que tratan sobre el fin de los tiempos.

Del profeta Daniel, escuchamos sobre el ascenso del Arcángel Miguel, “guardián del pueblo [de Dios]”. En ese tiempo [“un tiempo de angustia sin igual desde que las naciones comenzaron hasta ese tiempo”], “los sabios brillarán como el esplendor del firmamento, y los que conducen a la multitud a la justicia serán como las estrellas por siempre” (Daniel 12).

En la lectura del evangelio, Jesús se refiere al tiempo en que “el sol se oscurecerá y la luna no dará su luz, y las estrellas caerán del cielo y las potencias de los cielos serán sacudidas” (Marcos 13).

Que recibamos o temamos esos tiempos depende de cuán preparados estemos –por la manera en que vivamos– para encontrarnos con el Señor. Respondiendo a la gracia de Dios – la presencia viva de Dios dentro de cada uno de nosotros – la elección es nuestra. ¡Que cada uno de nosotros elija sabiamente!


Calendarios Parroquiales 2025


