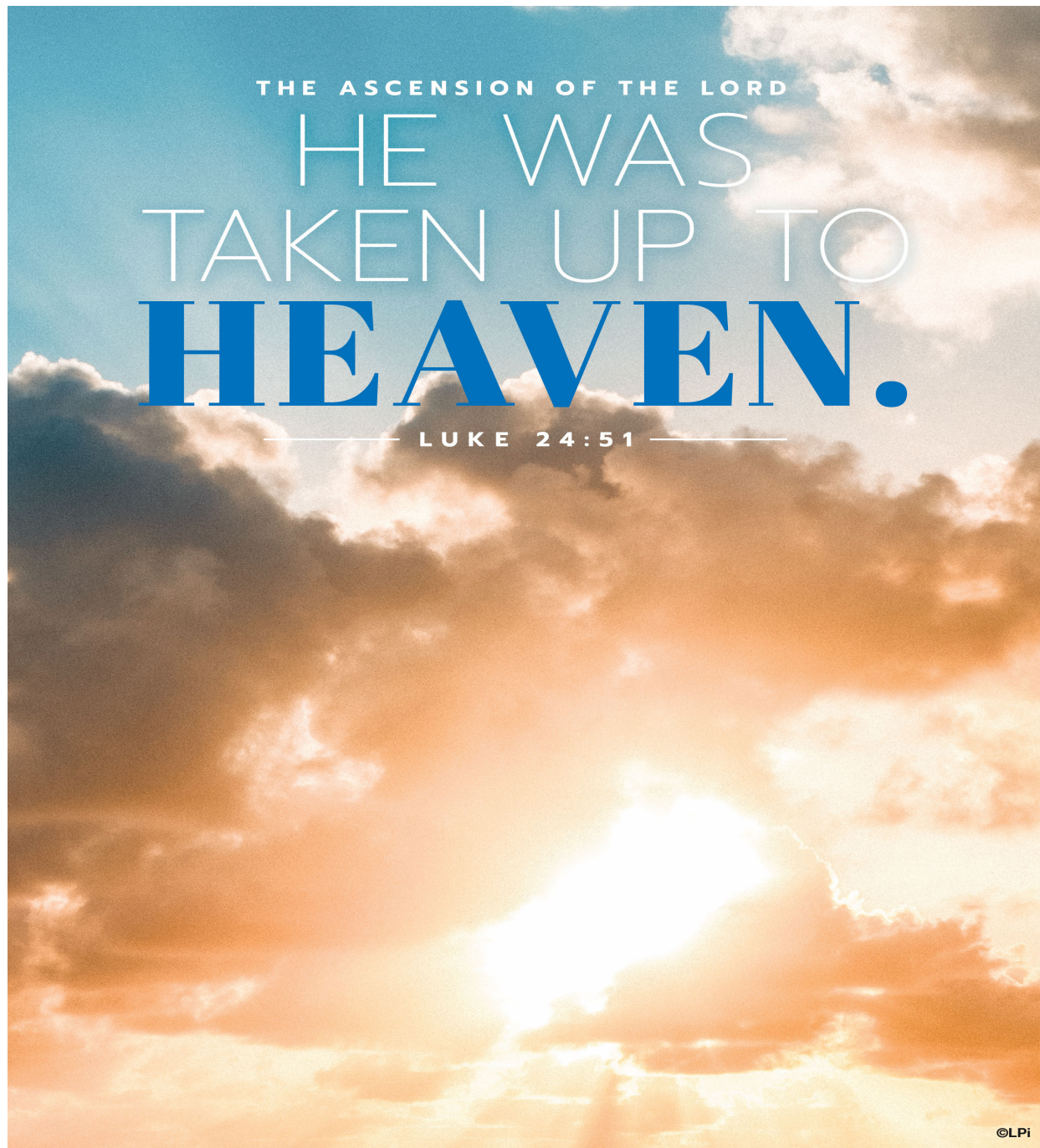

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From Monsignor Fran

Traditionally, we celebrate the Ascension of the Lord 40 days after Easter, as recounted in the Synoptic Gospels (Matthew, Mark and Luke). The Gospel of John, however, situates the Ascension on Easter morning, when Jesus says this to Mary Magdalene: “Stop holding on to me, for I have not yet ascended to the Father. But go to my brothers and tell them, ‘I am going to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God’” (John 20:17).

A footnote in the New American Bible offers this explanation: “The ascension after forty days described in Acts 1:1–11 would be simply a termination of earthly appearances or, perhaps better, an introduction to the conferral of the Spirit upon the early Church.”

Today’s feast recounts a time of transition in the relationship of Jesus to His followers and to the world. During those days, the Lord appeared “in the flesh,” and, afterwards – and even until now, through the power of the Spirit.

In a week, we will celebrate Pentecost, the great feast of the Holy Spirit, giving us an opportunity to reflect upon the many ways the Spirit enlivens us, the Church and the world.

Farewell to Fr. Victor

As he announced at Mass last weekend, Father Victor will be reassigned to Saint John the Baptist Parish in Milpitas, on July 1. We will miss Father Victor very much. This will be a great loss for us at Saint Clare, but it is the nature of priestly service to be moved according to the needs of the entire Diocese.

We are currently making plans for a celebration in Father Victor’s honor after the 5:00 pm Mass on Saturday, June 21. We hope that many will be able to join in this farewell; once details have been determined, we will share them with you.

We have also learned that Monsignor Francisco Rios, currently serving at the Cathedral Basilica of Saint Joseph, will be joining us in July. Monsignor Rios has served as pastor and parochial vicar in many parishes throughout the Diocese and will soon become a friend to all. We look forward to welcoming him to Saint Clare.

Quarterly Collection for our Parish School

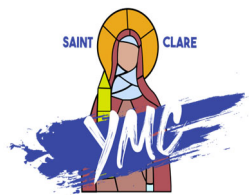

Esta Solenidade da Ascensão do Senhor, que em tempos idos era celebrada na Quinta – Feira- após a festa do Senhor Santo Cristo dos Milagres, era dia santo de guarda. Pela acção dos governos é hoje celebrada no Domingo precedente da festa do divino Espírito Santo. Jesus, mesmo na hora de subir aos Céus prometeu aos Apóstolos a vinda do Espírito Santo, e que eles se mantivessem unidos. Sendo assim não foi difícil encontrar todos os Apóstolos reunidos no Cenáculo com Maria noos Mãe na vinda do Espírito Santo. Com a Ascensão aos Céus, a visibilidade e Sua p-presença diminuiu consideravelmente nno cérebro dos Apóstolos, O medo de serem apanhados pelos judeus e serem vistos como testemunhas de Cristo e Seu Evangelho era tanto que os atolhava de medo, porque quando apanhados teriam o mesmo castigo que Jesus teve de morrer na Cruz. Peace & Justice Group

The Saint Clare Parish Peace & Justice group has re-emerged after a long hiatus with a renewed focus on several issues that call for attention in our time. Our first effort focused on peace and non-violence in order to follow up on Fr. John Dear's visit last fall. This Lent and Easter we invited parishioners to continue the conversation on non-violence by hosting a four-session discussion group led by Sigrid Jacobsen and Rosalyn Moorhouse. The discussions were anchored around readings from John Dear's book, *The Gospel of Peace*, and episodes of his podcast, [The Nonviolent Jesus](#). The conversations were spiritually nourishing for the dozen who gathered each Sunday.

For our second effort, three weeks ago we hosted a guest speaker who shared her story of being previously unhoused. In conversation, Ivy opened our eyes in a personal way to the difficult realities that unhoused neighbors confront daily, including health issues; access to care, food and water; the impact of policing policies regarding homelessness; and the lack of affordable housing. Ivy's story put a human face on a very complex issue of homelessness and reminded us of the human dignity of every person, regardless of where they live.

When asked how we can help unhoused folks, Ivy suggested keeping water bottles, toiletries or granola bars handy to give out when we see unhoused people on street corners. In response, the Peace & Justice group will be holding a toiletries collection drive. **Please consider donating to the drive by bringing travel size toiletries during the weekends of May 24, May 31 and June 7. We will be collecting the following items:**

- Bar soap (e.g. hotel bar soaps)
- Shampoo (e.g. hotel shampoos)
- Hand sanitizers
- Disinfectant wipes (small packets)
- Toothbrushes
- Toothpaste
- Combs
- Assorted bandages (e.g, Band-Aids)

Witnesses



Today's readings: Acts 1:1–11; Psalm 47:2–3, 6–7, 8–9; Ephesians 1:17–23 or Hebrews 9:24–28; 10:19–23; Luke 24: 46–53. Before ascending to heaven, Jesus points to Scripture: “It is written that the Christ would suffer and rise from the dead on the third day and that repentance, for the forgiveness of sins, would be preached in his name to all the nations.” He reminds his disciples that they are witnesses to these life-changing events. Being a witness requires recalling the event (or events) that one has seen. The disciples are called to share with all nations the news of the miraculous events that they have witnessed. You, too, are a witness to the paschal mystery and participate in it each time you attend Mass. As Mass ends, the priest dismisses the faithful

to spread the news. That we are sent forth becomes evident in the dismissals “Go and announce the Gospel of the Lord” and “Go In peace, glorifying the Lord by your life.”

Though preaching the Gospel may seem like an overwhelming task, God enables and accompanies us. Jesus tells the disciples to stay in Jerusalem until the Holy Spirit comes, and they “are clothed with the power from on high.” The Spirit strengthens them to joyfully accept the difficult yet transformative call to be followers of Christ. We, too, must lean on God for the tenacity to live as the hands and feet of Christ. Pray for the wisdom to see the Holy Spirit moving through you.



THIS WEEK AT HOME

Monday, June 2

Sts. Marcellinus and Peter

Though little is known about Sts. Marcellinus and Peter, they were important enough to be included in one of our Eucharistic Prayers. Marcellinus and Peter were a priest and an exorcist, respectively, in the fourth century. Both were beheaded in 304. Today, their service to the Church is celebrated: those whose blood is shed in the name of their faith are joined closely to Christ and, thus, to us. Say a prayer in gratitude for the long tradition to which saints such as Marcellinus and Peter have dedicated themselves. *Today's readings: Acts 19:1-8; Psalm 68:2-3ab, 4-5acd, 6-7ab; John 16:29-33.*

Tuesday, June 3

St. Charles Lwanga and Companions

In various parts of Africa, St. Charles Lwanga is well known as the patron of youth and Catholic action. Charles and twenty-one other young Ugandans were burned to death for refusing to participate in immoral acts in 1886. The virtue of courage is exemplified in these martyrs. How can you courageously say yes to your faith in times of temptation? *Today's readings: Acts 20:17-27; Psalm 68:10-11, 20-21; John 17:1-11a.*

Wednesday, June 4

Tend the Church of God

Today we hear St. Paul address the presbyters. He is instructing them on the difficulties found in the community at Ephesus and surrounding areas. He warns them to guard the community against false prophets that are sure to emerge once he departs. He concludes his remarks by citing Jesus, who said, "It is more blessed to give than to receive." How are you giving to the Church? What is a way you can "tend the Church of God"? *Today's readings: Acts 20:28-38; Psalm 68:29-30, 33-35a, 35bc-36ab; John 17:11b-19.*

Thursday, June 5

St. Boniface

St. Boniface was an English Benedictine monk. He dedicated himself to the conversion of Germanic tribes. To reform the German Church, Boniface was guided by two principles: restoring the obedience of wayward clergy and establishing Benedictine monasteries (houses of prayer). He was massacred with more than fifty others while preparing converts for confirmation. *Today's readings: Acts 22:30, 23:6-11; Psalm 16:1-2a and 5, 7-8, 9-10, 11; John 17:20-26.*

Friday, June 6

St. Norbert

St. Norbert founded the Premonstratensians, or the Norbertines, (a religious order) in twelfth-century France. They were tasked with combating heresies, revitalizing the faithful, and aiding in reconciliation efforts among enemies. St. Norbert knew that none of that important work could be done without God and found much strength in his devotion to the Blessed Sacrament. If Eucharistic adoration is available in your area, schedule time to pray before the sacrament. If it is not available, spend time in silence praying near a tabernacle. Ask Jesus to strengthen your faith. *Today's readings: Acts 25:13b-21; Psalm 103:1-2, 11-12, 19-20ab; John 21:15-19.*

Saturday, June 7

Gazing on the Lord's Face

Joining the psalmist, we sing, "The just will gaze on your face, O Lord." What is a just deed to which you can commit yourself as the end of the Easter season nears? How have you gazed on the Lord's face? Regardless of whether you consider yourself artistic, consider drawing or painting the face of the Lord that you are gazing upon. Challenge yourself to think creatively. Allow the Lord to speak to you through this time spent creating. *Today's readings: Acts 28:16-20, 30-31; Psalm 11:4, 5 and 7; John 21:20-25.*

Tradicionalmente, celebramos la Ascensión del Señor 40 días después de Pascua, como se relata en los Evangelios Sinópticos (Mateo, Marcos y Lucas). Sin embargo, el Evangelio de Juan sitúa la Ascensión en la mañana de Pascua, cuando Jesús le dice a María Magdalena: “No me retengas, porque aún no he subido al Padre. Ve a mis hermanos y diles: ‘Voy a mi Padre y a vuestro Padre, a mi Dios y a vuestro Dios’” (Juan 20:17).

Una nota al pie en la Nueva Biblia Americana ofrece esta explicación: “La ascensión después de cuarenta días descrita en Hechos 1:1–11 sería simplemente una finalización de las apariciones terrenales o, mejor dicho, una introducción a la concesión del Espíritu a la Iglesia primitiva.”

La fiesta de hoy narra un tiempo de transición en la relación de Jesús con sus seguidores y con el mundo. Durante esos días, el Señor apareció “en la carne”, y, después, —e incluso hasta ahora, a través del poder del Espíritu.

Dentro de una semana, celebraremos Pentecostés, la gran fiesta del Espíritu Santo, que nos brinda la oportunidad de reflexionar sobre las muchas maneras en que el Espíritu nos anima, a la Iglesia y al mundo.

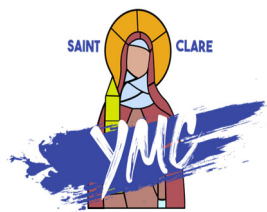
