

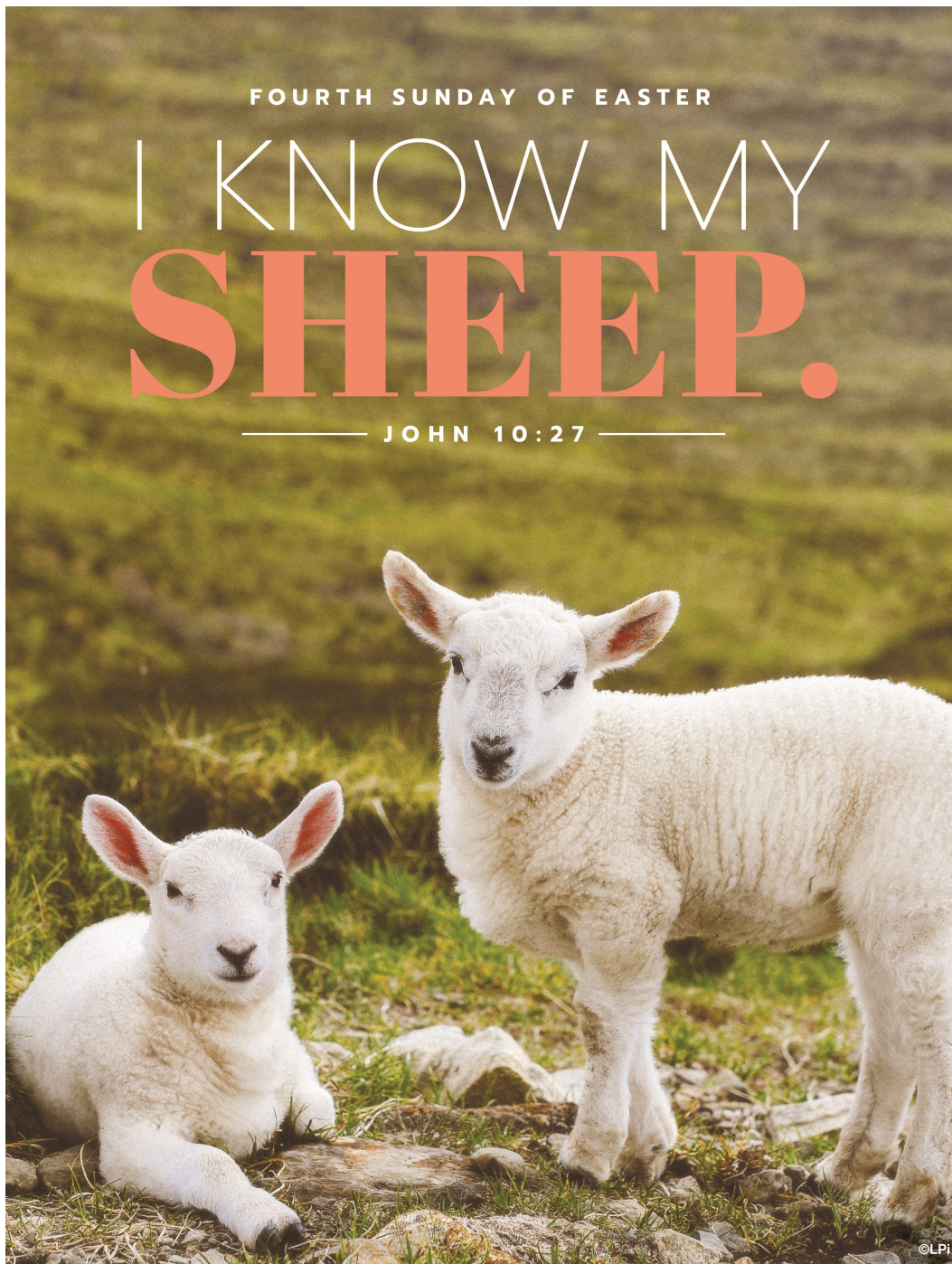

From Monsignor Fran

In the tenth chapter of the Gospel of John, Jesus describes Himself as the Good Shepherd:

I am the good shepherd, and I know mine and mine know me,
just as the Father knows me and I know the Father;
and I will lay down my life for the sheep (John 10:14-15).

Today's gospel passage (verses 27-30) tells us that the sheep hear Jesus' voice, they know Him and they follow Him, to eternal life.

As we reflect upon this on the Fourth Sunday of Easter, it is not a stretch to connect this image with the celebration of First Communion, as one of the primary tasks of the shepherd is to provide for the welfare of the sheep: either green pastures or other forms of nourishment. This same Jesus cares for, loves and feeds our young first communicants with His Body and His Blood, even as the Lord continues to give us the same nourishment.

We give thanks to the parents who have brought these children this far in their journey of faith, and we congratulate them on this most special day in their lives.

DIOCESE OF SAN JOSE Statement from Bishop Oscar Cantú

May 5, 2025

The AI-generated image of President Trump dressed in papal vestments, first shared on his personal Truth Social account and later reposted by the official White House X account, was inappropriate and offensive. Catholics, and many others, are still mourning Pope Francis, while the College of Cardinals prepares for the conclave that will choose his successor. Turning this solemn pause into a sight gag cheapens a sacred office and insults the faithful.

Humor has its place in civic life. So does reverence. When the nation's highest office circulates an image that mocks what more than a billion people around the world consider sacred, trust and mutual respect are undermined.

I invite the people of the Diocese of San José—and all who value civil discourse—to recommit to words and actions, online and off, that ennoble rather than diminish. Let us pray for a renewed respect for religion. We also pray for the cardinals at the Vatican, that the Holy Spirit guide them in electing the next Successor of Peter.

A liturgia deste Quarto Domingo traz-nos a figura de Jesus Cristo, o Bom Pastor, que dá a vida pelas suas ovelhas. Na sociedade em que vivemos tem alocado o segundo Domingo do mês de Maio para celebrar-mos o Dia da Mãe. As mães tal como os bons pastores dão a vida pelos seus filhos. Celebrar as mães em igreja é diferente do que as celebrar no mundo comercial: para celebrar a mãe neste dia desde o mês de Abril que os restaurantes, as floristas, as varadas lojas oferecem productos com um significado deste dia ser especial para ela; mostrar-lhe agradecimento pelo seu amor. E as mães aceitam praticamente tudo que os filho lhes dão e ficam felizes e contentes pelo mais insignificante cartões a dizerem Feliz Dia da Mãe. Celebrar a Mãe em Igreja se agradece a Deus pelos enormes sacrifícios que ela faz pelos filhos/as/. Por ser um número elevado de senhoras a contribuírem o Conselho Paroquial criou um sistema pelo qual formou três listas e deste modo não crescia tanto, isto porque as senhoras da nossa comunidade não se limitam a levar “pratinhos” tem que ser “Pratos” discretos. Sendo este convívio promovido uma vez por mês e quase sempre no primeiro Domingo do mês, sempre houve esforço para que este mudasse em Fevereiro para a comunidade conviver celebrando o matrimónio nos casais, incluindo os viúvos/as. No chamado Dia Mundial do Matrimónio o Conselho Paroquial esmera-se um pouco mais no planeamento da liturgia na missa oferecendo uma rosa por casal e às viúvas e incluindo uma bênção especial e no salão os enfeitos são de uma criatividade fabulosa apreciada por todos os participantes bem assim os membros de outras comunidades que admiram o dinamismo que a nossa comunidade tem. Em Maio e no segundo Domingo do mês fazemos este convívio dedicado às nossas mães e no mês de Junho é mudado para o terceiro Domingo para celebrar-mos os pais. É esta actividade inovadora no tempo que outras comunidades tentaram copiar e falharam. Também porque somos persistentes as actividades que promovemos tem de certo modo uma preponderância para durar.

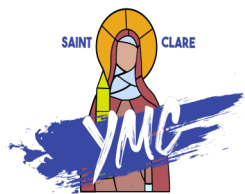
Parish Mission Statement

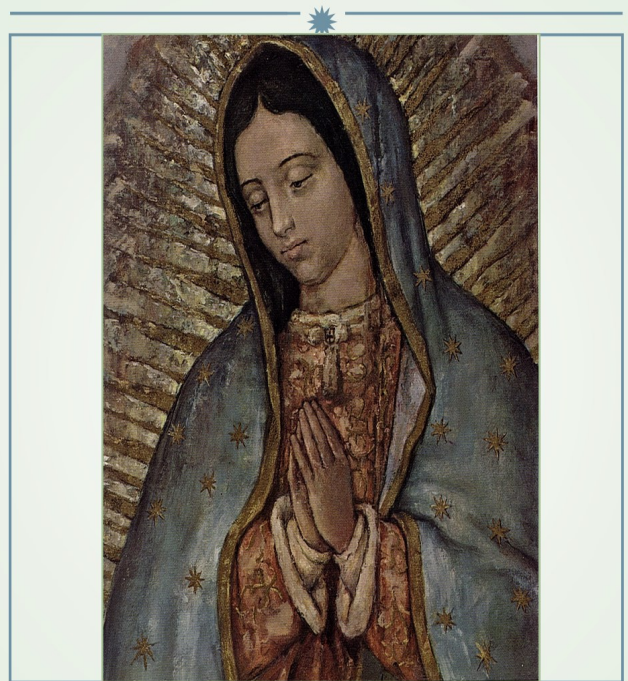

FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER



Instruments of Salvation

God our Light, your kindness endures forever. You know us and grant us eternal life. Help us remain faithful to you. When our sights waver from being set on you, guide us back to serve you with gladness. When we are persecuted, help us respond as instruments of salvation: give us strength to shake the dust from our feet and continue spreading your Word. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Shake the Dust from Your Feet

Today's readings: Acts 13:14, 43–52; Psalm 100:1–2, 3, 5; Revelation 7:9, 14b–17; John 10:27–30. Today, we hear that Paul and Barnabas reach Antioch. They proclaimed the Word of the Lord and exhorted many Jews and worshipers who were converts to Judaism “to

remain faithful to the grace of God.” A week later, the city gathers to hear the word of the Lord. Upon seeing the massive crowds gathered to listen to Paul and Barnabas, the Jews are “filled with jealousy and with violent abuse contradicted what Paul said.”

But Paul and Barnabas continue to speak out boldly. They turn to the Gentiles, who are delighted to know that they, too, are worthy of eternal life. The Jews continue to persecute Paul and Barnabas “and expelled them from their territory.” Paul and Barnabas shake the dust from their feet and resume their journey: filled with joy and the Holy Spirit, their mission to take the word of the Lord to the ends of the earth continues.

Paul and Barnabas teach an important lesson: despite being persecuted, they remain faithful to their call to share the new life that can be found in Christ's resurrection. They are filled with the Spirit and, thus, are strengthened to continue their mission. Where do you get your strength when you are feeling discouraged? How can you embrace the resurrection of our Lord and share that Good News with others?



THIS WEEK AT HOME

Monday, May 12 Athirst Is My Soul

We yearn to be in relationship with God. In today's responsorial psalm, words are put to our desire: "As the hind longs for the running waters, / so my soul longs for you, O God. / Athirst is my soul for God." As you enter this week, consider how you search for God in your day-to-day life. When and how shall you go and behold the face of God? When the shepherd calls you by name and leads you, how do you respond? *Today's readings: Acts 11:1–18; Psalm 42:2–3, 43:3, 4; John 10:1–10.*

Tuesday, May 13 Our Lady of Fatima

On the optional Memorial of Our Lady of Fatima, we remember that the Virgin Mary appeared to three impoverished shepherd children in Portugal in 1917, toward the end of the First World War. She asked them to pray for the conversion of sinners and for the end to the war. She appeared several other times, calling for penitence and prayers for peace. Today, pray the Rosary and say a prayer for peace in our world. *Today's readings: Acts 11:19–26; Psalm 87:1b–3, 4–5, 6–7; John 10:22–30.*

Wednesday, May 14 Feast of St. Matthias

After the ascension of Jesus, the first act of the apostles was to replace Judas as one of the twelve. Two men were suggested, and after praying about it in community, Matthias was chosen (Acts 1:21–26). Much like the other apostles (and like us, too), Matthias was chosen for what he would become as a follower of Christ. How can you enter into being a witness to the resurrection of the Lord? How has your community invited you to embrace your God-given gifts? *Today's readings: Acts 1:15–17, 20–26; Psalm; John 15:9–17.*

Thursday, May 15 St. Isidore the Farmer

When St. Isidore was young, he was destined to work on a wealthy landowner's farm. He was known to pray before and while he worked. To celebrate his feast today, say a prayer on your way to work: pray in gratitude for those who work on farms and cultivate the crops required to sustain us. Consider starting a new habit of praying before work every day, just as St. Isidore did. *Today's readings: Acts 13:13–25; Psalm 89:2–3, 21–22, 25 and 27; John 13:16–20.*

Friday, May 16 The Way, the Truth, the Life

Jesus tells the disciples that he is "the way and the truth and the life." Look for opportunities for Eucharistic adoration at a parish near you. Commit to praying before the Eucharist at least once in the coming week. While you are at Eucharistic adoration, look back on this Easter season. How have you responded to the joy of the resurrection? Say a prayer reflecting on the ways you and the resurrected Lord have encountered one another. *Today's readings: Acts 13:26–33; Psalm 2:6–7, 8–9, 10–11ab; John 14:1–6.*

Saturday, May 17 Doing the Lord's Work

Jesus says that whoever believes in him will do the works that he does. How have you dedicated yourself to healing and serving others this Easter season? Do you realize your baptismal call is to continue the Lord's work in the world? When you have fallen short on healing and serving others during Easter Time, make a commitment to visit the infirmed, the elderly, or someone who is homebound next week. *Today's readings: Acts 13:44–52; Psalm 98:1, 2–3ab, 3cd–4; John 14:7–14.*



De Monseñor Fran

En el décimo capítulo del Evangelio de Juan, Jesús se describe a sí mismo como el Buen Pastor:

Yo soy el buen pastor, y conozco a mis ovejas, y ellas me conocen a mí, así como el Padre me conoce a mí y yo conozco al Padre; y daré mi vida por las ovejas (Juan 10:14-15).

El pasaje del Evangelio de hoy (versículos 27-30) nos dice que las ovejas escuchan la voz de Jesús, lo conocen y lo siguen hasta la vida eterna.

Al reflexionar sobre esto en el Cuarto Domingo de Pascua, no es exagerado relacionar esta imagen con la celebración de la Primera Comunión, ya que una de las principales tareas del pastor es proveer para el bienestar de las ovejas, ya sea con pastos verdes u otras formas de alimento. Este mismo Jesús cuida, ama y alimenta a nuestros primeros comulgantes con Su Cuerpo y Su Sangre, así como el Señor continúa dándonos el mismo alimento.

Agradecemos a los padres que han traído a estos niños hasta aquí en su camino de fe y los felicitamos en este día tan especial de sus vidas.

Declaración del Obispo Oscar Cantú

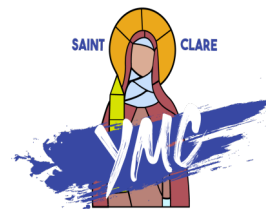

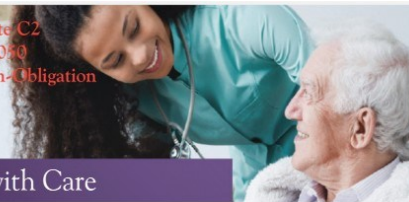
