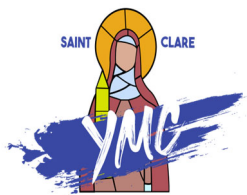
Communion Ministry to Mission Skilled Nursing on Winchester Boulevard

Creation Care Tips

*“When you send forth your spirit, they are created;
and you renew the face of the ground. —Psalms 104:30*

Take some deep breaths of fresh air on this day of Pentecost. This simple gesture has a great significance in our Christian tradition. Indeed, rhythmic breathing leads to deeper meditation, the grace of feeling God’s presence. Sadly, one child in five suffers from asthma which can be caused or exacerbated by poor air quality in our cities, heavy pesticide use in agricultural areas, coal burning plants, and wildfires. Elderly people are also more at risk for lung trouble when the air quality is poor too. Be thoughtful when the forecast calls for smog: avoid using your car if possible to reduce emissions especially on those days when the air quality is poor.

Weekly Justice Challenge

The spirit of Pentecost celebrates the power of forgiveness. The Scriptures say that Jesus breathed on the apostles and gave them the power to forgive and to bind. God wants no one to be bound by sin, and extends forgiveness to all who are sorry and seek God’s forgiveness. But forgiving others is really hard when we are the victim of injustice. The challenge this week is to forgive so that you and your enemy will not be bound by sin. Forgiveness is a power of the Spirit, not a human power. If you find it hard to forgive, go deeper by doing what Jesus taught: pray goodness upon your enemy and do good for him/her.

Reflexão Por: João Pereira Arruda

Veni Creator Spiritus mentes tuorum visita imple suprema gratia quae tu creasti pectora” Assim canta o sacerdote ao levantar a coroa do Divino Espírito Santo, para depois a colocar na criança, no idoso, no mordomo do império, perante os devotos que emocionados não podem conter as lágrimas. Assim é neste dia de Festa dedicada ao Espírito Santo que milhares de aoreanos vivem essa grande festa a do nascimento da Igreja de Cristo.

Por mais de cinco séculos os açoreanos celebram a Terceira Pessoa da Santíssima Trindade, porque é o Deus que defende os pobres, os injustiçados, os exilados, os emigrantes. É o Deus que distribui dons a todos mediante a Sua descrição e dá vigor à Igreja adormecida e temerosa. É o Deus que nos liberta de tudo que nos atolha e nos impede de sermos livres; despidos de qualquer malidicência que nos tira a paz que vem de Deus. É o Deus que nos inspira a sermos evangelizadores da Palavra de Deus. É o Deus que nos dá meios de contruirmos unidade e de fazermos um mundo mais justo e amoroso na fraternidade.

Adentro disto tudo a Irmandade Familiar do Espírito Santo apareceu em Santa Clara; fruto de uma promessa ao Espírito Santo preparada pelo casal Luis e Lurdes Jerónimo e que, juntamente com seus filhos: Luis, Mário e Carlos foram coroados na Missa Portuguesa em 1982 pelo então padre António Meira, Desse acontecimento e do entusiasmo geral que gerou, dezoito famílias reuniram-se para formar uma Irmandade e que esta celebrasse o Espírito Santo no dia do Pentecostes e na Missa em Português da Comunidade Paroquial Portuguesa. Não haveria conta bancária, a figura principal da Irmandade seria o mordomo que com o apoio dos irmãos cumpriram as poucas regras que uma simples coroação do divino Espírito Santo requer. Depois da coroação na missa os membros da Irmandade reúnem-se numa merenda constituídas pelas tradicionais sopas de pão e carne e neste dia depois da refeição, seguem-se as sortes; actividade esta que determina quais os irmãos que sairão as primeiras seis Domingas, fazendo o mesmo processo para a escolha do Mordomo para o Ano seguinte.

As Primeiras sortes desta Irmandade determinaram de que o primeiro Mordomo desta Irmandade seria Manuel e Cristina Jerónimo e que com suas filhas, Mariazinha, Venilde e Hilda fizeram a primeira coroação na nossa igreja de Saint Clare’s no Pentecostes de 1983 com a merenda tradicional das sopas de pão e carne na sua residência da Lincoln St, Todos os anos assim é quando é conhecido o novo mordomo, o mordomo cessante, emocionalmente toma a bandeira do Senhor Espírito Santo e cobre o novo casal mordomo que a leva aos irmãos para ser beijada. A partir da Páscoa as domingos são feitas nas casas dos irmãos em que a sorte designou, estes durante a semana abrem suas portas para irmãos e nem só virem rezar o terço. Conforme o orçamento dão-se esmolas de pão, carne, e vinho. Àqueles que são recomendados e é sabido terem suas vidas um pouco menos que os demais.

Esta Irmandade que no tempo foi fundada com dezoito famílias, hoje tem 57 famílias, O número elevado de famílias não é essencialmente importante, mas. Sim o espírito como se vive esta tradição, ligada à Igreja, à devoção do terço nas Domingas e empenhamento na Romaria Quaresmal anual que se faz no Sábado de Ramos foi outra inovação tradicional que esta Irmandade todos os anos se empenha a promover e mesmo com idades avançadas esta actividade continua a acontecer,. Tem vindo ser tradição dar os bolinhos de massa doce aos paroquianos que à missa vêm e flores para as viúvas/os dos Irmãos falecidos desta Irmandade que desde o saudoso Luis Jerónimo falecido em 1983 ao Irmão José Gaspar Rocha faleceram um total de quarenta irmãos e irmãs. Hoje irá ser coroados a família do casal mordomo Ildefonso e Sandra Bettencourt e em nome do Conselho Paroquial que lhes deseja as maiores bênçãos do Espírito Santo nas suas vidas e dos seus familiares.

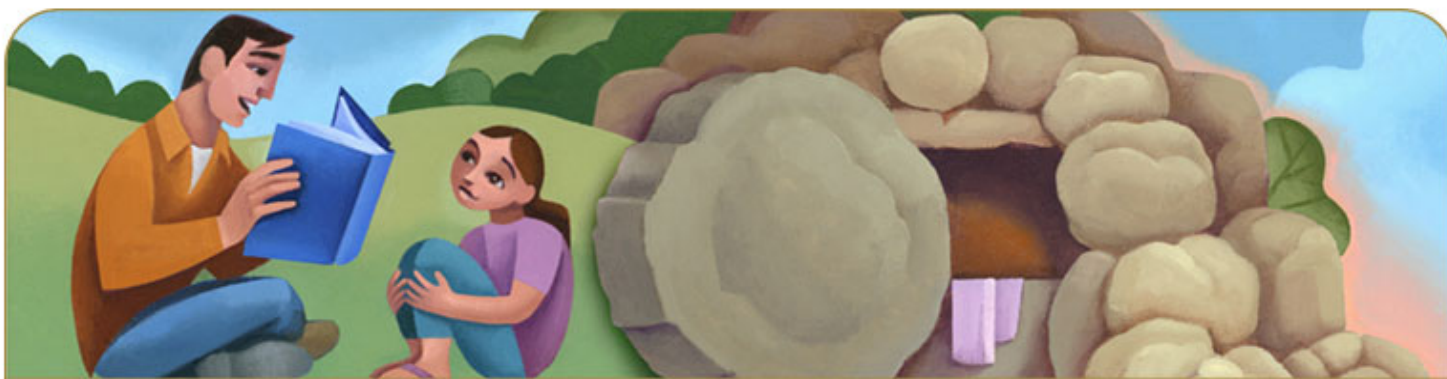

THIS WEEK AND BEYOND

Monday, June 9

Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church

The Memorial of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church, is celebrated the Monday after Pentecost. Mary has the title “Mother of the Church” because she gave birth to Jesus, who is the Head of the Church. This evening, pray the Rosary or the Magnificat. Ask Mary to intercede for you. *Today's readings: Genesis 3:9–15, 20 or Acts 1:12–14; Psalm 87:1–2, 3 and 5, 6–7; John 19:25–34.*

Monday, July 14

St. Kateri Tekakwitha

St. Kateri is the first North American native to be canonized. When she was four, her family died during a smallpox epidemic; she was left disfigured and half blind. Kateri was adopted by an uncle who did not approve of her interest in Catholicism, but she still converted to the faith at age nineteen. To celebrate St. Kateri, spend time learning about her dedication to her faith. How can you be a witness to her example? *Today's readings: Exodus 1:8–14, 22; Psalm 50:8–9, 16bc–17, 21 and 23; Matthew 10:34–11:1.*

Tuesday, July 22

St. Mary Magdalene

St. Mary Magdalene, one of Jesus' disciples, accompanied the Lord in his darkest time, during his crucifixion. Mary Magdalene was one of the witnesses chosen to announce the resurrection to the apostles; because of this, she is known as the “apostle to the apostles.” Today, prayerfully read John 20:1–2, 11–18. How are you, like Mary Magdalene, a witness to the resurrection of our Savior? How can you tell others that you have “seen the Lord?” *Today's readings: Song of Songs 3:1–4b or 2 Corinthians 5:14–17; Psalm 63:2, 3–4, 5–6, 8–9; John 20:1–2, 11–18.*

Tuesday, July 29

Martha, Mary, and Lazarus

Jesus visits Martha and Mary after Lazarus, their brother, died. Martha and Mary, at different times in John 11, approach Jesus and say to him: “Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died.” Later in John 11, we read that Jesus weeps when he sees Lazarus' body. Jesus weeps with us in our times of grief and sadness. This evening, learn about Ignatian contemplation, also known as imaginative prayer or Gospel contemplation. After learning about this form of prayer, practice it while reading of the raising of Lazarus (John 11:1–44). *Today's readings: Exodus 33:7–11, 34:5b–9; Psalm 34:2–3, 4–5, 6–7, 8–9, 10–11; John 11:19–27.*

Friday, August 8

St. Dominic

St. Dominic, a Spanish priest, was known for his preaching. He founded the Order of Preachers, also known as the Dominicans. The Dominicans follow four pillars: prayer, study, community, and preaching. After Dominic's example, they dedicate themselves to balancing these four pillars in their lives to proclaim the Good News. How can you dedicate yourself to prayerfully study your faith? Consider joining a Bible study at a parish near you. *Today's readings: Deuteronomy 4:32–40; Psalm 96:1–2a, 2b–3, 7–8a, 10; Matthew 16:24–28.*

Wednesday, August 27

St. Monica

Monica was St. Augustine of Hippo's mother. Most of what we know about her comes from Augustine's writings. In his *Confessions*, Augustine describes himself as a wayward son. St. Monica had a vision that assured her he would return to the faith, so she dedicated herself to praying and fasting for him. St. Monica teaches us the importance of patient, disciplined prayer. Today, ask St. Monica to join you as you bring your intentions to God. *Today's readings: 1 Thessalonians 2:9–13; Psalm 131:1bcde, 2, 3; Matthew 23:27–32.*

Despedida de Padre Víctor

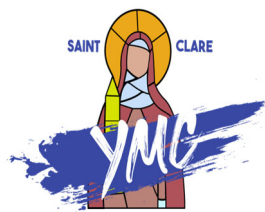

Consejos para el Cuidado de la Creación

“Envías tu aliento y los creas y renuevas la faz de la tierra”. —Salmos 104, 30

Respira profundamente aire fresco en este día de Pentecostés. Este simple gesto tiene un gran significado en nuestra tradición cristiana. De hecho, la respiración rítmica conduce a una meditación más profunda, la gracia de sentir la presencia de Dios. Lamentablemente, uno de cada cinco niños sufre de asma que puede ser causada o empeorada por la mala calidad del aire en nuestras ciudades, el uso intensivo de pesticidas en áreas agrícolas, las plantas que queman carbón y los incendios forestales. Las personas mayores también tienen más riesgo de problemas pulmonares cuando la calidad del aire es deficiente. Ten cuidado cuando el pronóstico indique contaminación (smog): si te es posible, evita usar tu automóvil para reducir las emisiones, especialmente en aquellos días en que la calidad del aire sea deficiente.

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Desafío Semanal de Justicia

El espíritu de Pentecostés celebra el poder del perdón. Las Escrituras dicen que Jesús sopló sobre los apóstoles y les dio el poder de perdonar o atar. Dios no quiere que nadie esté atado por el pecado, y extiende el perdón a todos los que están arrepentidos y buscan el perdón de Dios. Pero perdonar a los demás es realmente difícil cuando somos víctimas de la injusticia. El desafío de esta semana es perdonar para que tu enemigo y tú no estén atados por el pecado. El perdón es un poder del Espíritu, no un poder humano. Si te resulta difícil perdonar, profundiza haciendo lo que Jesús enseñó: ora bondad sobre tu enemigo y haz el bien por él/ella
