From Monsignor Fran

Every few years, our gospel reading for this weekend (Luke 10:1-9) is proclaimed at Mass on the first Sunday of July. It has always seem coincidental to me that we hear these words, “Go on your way; behold, I am sending you like lambs among wolves. Carry no money bag, no sack, no sandals; and greet no one along the way.”

As priests move all over our Diocese to take up their new assignments, it is certain that this passage makes them wonder what they have gotten into. But the reality is that every parish assignment is a good one – because of the goodness of the parishioners in those places.

What Jesus tells us all is to travel lightly, without our own preconceptions, opinions, prejudices, and to remember that the message we bear comes from Him. If we are faithful to that, we will never feel abandoned.

Parish Hall Renovation

We continue the work on the Gym and Small (North) Hall. This work should be complete by July 11.

Weekly/Monthly/Annual Stewardship

“Stewardship” can mean many things to us. Among these is a care for that which has been entrusted to us, as in “stewarding the gift of creation.”

In Spanish, the word for stewardship is “coresponsabilidad.” Co-responsibility gets to the heart of the stewardship that is asked of us. It is shared responsibility for the good of the whole. In the case of our parish, financial responsibility falls to every member. It is not fair to depend up a few to carry the rest of us. Each is responsible, according to their means, to do what they can.

As has been shared in the past weeks, we have fallen short of what has been budgeted for our weekly income (currently \$10,100 per week). To cover expenses in the year that begins on July 1, we need to raise our weekly goal to \$10,400, the smallest increase we can make and come close to paying our bills.

To reduce expenses, we have cut our weekly order of doughnuts by six dozen and eliminated the delivery of drinking water to the rectory. We will also continue to look for other ways.

Thank you for bringing to prayer how you, your family or household can share in the work of the parish in the coming year.



Reflexão Por: João Pereira Arruda

Ao entrar-mos de novo no Tempo Comum, as leituras deste décimo quarto Domingo falam-nos de como Deus é bom para com o seu povo. O Profeta Isaias para o povo se alegrar com Jerusalém, e que vai fazer a paz correr como um rio. Também hoje queria-mos ter essa paz, queria-mos viver livres de temor das ameaças de guerra, violência, terrorismo. Gostaria-mos que as nossas crianças estivessem aprendendo a crescer em segurança, que as pessoas possam praticar seu culto nas igrejas, ir aos cinemas ou concertos seguros que de algum lado apareça alguém armado para matar-los. Nós somos Seu povo e também queremos que “a paz de Deus corra no meio de nós como um rio e Deus nos da isso quando tivermos a vontade de apoiar governantes que facilitam as armas. Deus quer o nosso bem tudo faz para sermos felizes, mas temos que fazer a nossa parte; e quando a fazemos então podemos cantar o refrão do Salmo 65 que o salmista cantará: **“A terra inteira aclame o Senhor:!”**

Porém o motivo maior das igrejas estarem quasi vazias é o facto que a maioria dos que ainda estão vivosserem muito menos dos que já se foram ao encontro do Pai do Céu, ou estão em Lares de Repouso, ou foram de novo para as suas terras de orige,, O Verão é tempo de férias, mas não há férias em vir á missa aos Domingos seja lóa donde se esteja e que tenha uma igreja é o mesmo Cristo que está na hóstia consagrada. Pode-se observar como as liturgias são vividas e porque nunca sabemos tudo, podemos aprender algo diferente que se possa implementar nas liturgias que aqui se fazem.


Creation Care Tips

Have you heard about Fair Trade products? Fair Trade allows farmers and farm workers to receive a fair salary—a just salary—not just the minimum that consumers are willing to pay which often is not enough to live on. When they enjoy better living conditions, farmers and farmworkers may avail themselves of health services and send their children to school (rather than keeping them on the farm to work from a very young age). The leading Fair Trade products are coffee and chocolate, but there are also teas, rice, spices, and bananas. En nuestra parroquia, la responsabilidad financiera recae en cada miembro. No es justo que dependamos de unos pocos para que cubran a los demás. Cada uno es responsable, según sus posibilidades, de hacer lo que pueda.

Como se ha compartido en las últimas semanas, no hemos alcanzado el presupuesto semanal (actualmente \$10,100 por semana). Para cubrir los gastos del año que comienza el 1 de julio, necesitamos aumentar nuestra meta semanal a \$10,400, el menor aumento posible para cubrir nuestras facturas.

Para reducir gastos, hemos reducido nuestro pedido semanal de donas a seis docenas y eliminado el envío de agua potable a la rectoría. También seguiremos buscando otras maneras.

Gracias por compartir en oración cómo usted, su familia o su hogar pueden colaborar en el trabajo de la parroquia el próximo año.

Desafío Semanal de Justicia



El Evangelio de este domingo narra el envío de Jesús a sus 72 discípulos. El mensaje que debían dar era de paz: "¡Paz a esta casa!". Jesús personificó la paz y desafió a sus discípulos a ser portadores de ella. Sin embargo, en nuestro mundo actual, abundan los ejemplos de violencia, tensión, guerra y conflicto.
