## From Monsignor Fran

---

From our first reading this weekend, we hear the wisdom of Sirach:

My child, conduct your affairs with humility,  
and you will be loved more than a giver of gifts.  
Humble yourself the more, the greater you are,  
and you will find favor with God.  
What is too sublime for you, seek not,  
into things beyond your strength search not (Sirach 3:17-18, 21).

Too often, we hear of “false humility,” that is not rooted in the truth, or even in a person’s perception of oneself. False humility (for example, “I am a worthless human being”) invites others to declare that the person’s claim is not true. False humility is a show.

The humility espoused by Jesus (“For everyone who exalts oneself will be humbled, but the one who humbles oneself will be exalted”) and throughout the Old Testament is about honesty.

Google/AI adds this: “The words humility and *humus* share a common Latin root, from the Latin word *humus*, meaning ‘earth’ or ‘ground.’”

Let us be so grounded in the truth about who we are and the greatness to which God calls us.

## Rite of Christian Initiation

Are you thinking about becoming Catholic? God works in many different ways. Most of the time, God works through ordinary people and events—a parent, a friend, a beautiful sunset, a song, an inspiring story. Other times, we hear God’s call during crisis moments or major life-changes—a birth, an engagement, a sickness, a death. Sometimes, we just have a feeling that something is missing. No matter what your reason for thinking about becoming Catholic, our hope and prayer is that when God calls, you will respond. (If you’re reading this, you’ve already begun to respond!) One part of the Catholic Church’s mission is to help people respond to God as best they can. For Christians, Initiation and on-going participation in the life of the Church are the primary responses to God’s call. Through the process of becoming Catholic, we try to help people learn how to respond to that call not just for the moment of baptism but for every day of their lives. The way we learn how to respond is by actually doing what Catholics do. So, the process of becoming Catholic is not so much about learning things as in a classroom but learning a way of life as an apprentice learns from a master and that master’s community. Sessions are formed for adults and children from the age of 7 and older. 



## De Monseñor Fran

---

De nuestra primera lectura de este fin de semana, escuchamos la sabiduría de Eclesiástico:

Hija mía, dirige tus asuntos con humildad,  
y serás amado más que un dador de regalos.  
Humíllate cuanto más, cuanto más grande seas,  
y hallarás favor ante Dios.  
Lo que es demasiado sublime para ti, no lo busques,  
No busques cosas que estén más allá de tus fuerzas (Eclesiástico 3:17-18, 21).

Con demasiada frecuencia, hablamos de “falsa humildad”, que no está arraigada en la verdad, ni siquiera en la percepción que una persona tiene de sí misma. La falsa humildad (por ejemplo, “soy un ser humano inútil”) invita a otros a declarar que lo que dice la persona no es cierto. La falsa humildad es un espectáculo.

La humildad propugnada por Jesús (“Porque todo el que se enaltece será humillado, pero el que se humilla uno mismo será exaltado”) y en todo el Antiguo Testamento se trata de honestidad.

Google/AI añade lo siguiente: “Las palabras humildad y *humus* comparten una raíz latina común, de la palabra latina *humus*, que significa “tierra” o “suelo”.

Estemos tan cimentados en la verdad sobre quiénes somos y la grandeza a la que Dios nos llama.

## Rito de Iniciación Cristiana

¿Estás pensando en convertirte en Católico? Dios obra de muchas maneras diferentes. La mayor parte del tiempo, Dios obra a través de personas y acontecimientos comunes y corrientes: un padre, un amigo, una hermosa puesta de sol, una canción, una historia inspiradora. Otras veces, escuchamos el llamado de Dios durante momentos de crisis o cambios importantes en la vida: un nacimiento, un compromiso, una enfermedad, una muerte. A veces simplemente tenemos la sensación de que falta algo. No importa cuál sea tu razón para pensar en convertirnos en católicos, nuestra esperanza y oración es que cuando Dios llame, usted responda. (¡Si estás leyendo esto, ya has comenzado a responder!) Una parte de la misión de la Iglesia Católica es ayudar la gente responde a Dios lo mejor que puede. Para los cristianos, la iniciación y la participación continua en la vida de la Iglesia son las respuestas principales al llamado de Dios. A través del proceso de volverse católico, tratamos de ayudar a las personas a aprender cómo responder a ese llamado no sólo en el momento del bautismo sino en cada día de sus vidas. La forma en que aprendemos a responder es realmente haciendo lo que hacen los católicos. Entonces, el proceso de convertirse en católico no se trata tanto de aprender cosas como en un salón de clases sino de aprender una forma de vida como un aprendiz aprende de un maestro y de la comunidad de ese maestro. Las sesiones están formadas para adultos y niños a partir de 7 años.
