



From Monsignor Fran

In the gospel reading today, Jesus encouraged His hearers not to grow weary in their prayer, telling the story of a supposedly powerless widow who confronted an unjust judge. The lesson is that, if the unjust judge will relent and do what is right, how much more will God, who is just, “secure the rights of His chosen ones.”

In another place, however, Jesus also told his listeners “And when you pray, do not keep on babbling like pagans, for they think they will be heard because of their many words (Matthew 6:7). It is not the volume of our prayers, but persistence in prayer that Jesus commends.

When one prays seemingly endlessly, it can happen that less thought is given to those prayers, which can become rote. It is easy to lose focus on the intent of our prayer. Would it not be better to pray with meaning than to rush through many prayers “on automatic pilot”?

Creation Care Tips

With the fall fruit harvests upon us, consider that 30-40% of the food produced in the United States is wasted. Fruit from trees often goes to waste either because there is too much of it in a short space of time to be used or because the tree's owner doesn't have the ability or the time to harvest it. An established fruit tree can often produce 100+ pounds of fruit, far more than one family can consume. If you have a fruit tree, why not donate the excess to your local food bank? When you notice laden fruit trees in your neighborhood, knock on the door and ask if you can help harvest it to donate. Finally, you can look up local gleaning groups and offer your services to help pick or deliver the excess fruit to an organization that will get it into the mouths of hungry people. © Center for Ministry Development. Weekly Justice Challenge

On October 18, we celebrate the feast of Saint Luke, one of the four evangelists. The Gospel of Luke is sometimes nicknamed the "Justice Gospel" because Luke has so many stories of Jesus reaching out to those who were victims of injustice in their society. Perhaps this was partially due to Luke's own experience as a healer. Luke wrote his Gospel to help us understand that Jesus was and is a universal savior—for everyone, everywhere. Your challenge this week is to spend time each day with Luke's Gospel. Find a chapter (or at least a story or teaching in a chapter) which deals with justice, then reflect on and discuss as a family how you can apply the message which the passage teaches in your life today. © Center for Ministry Development. Os discípulos também se sentiam assim quando pediram a Jesus que lhes ensinasse a rezar. Jesus lhes disse orai sempre sem cessar e ilustrou-lhes a importância do orar sem nunca desistir com a parábola da viúva que era injustiçada. O juiz que não temia a Deus nem a nada não lhe fazia caso das petições constantes da viúva até ele se fartar e fazer-lhe a justiça merecida. Não será de modo algum este o comportamento de Deus com as nossas orações. Não foi essa a resposta de Deus aos pedidos de Jesus que lhe afastasse o cálice se assim fosse possível, pois assim é mais uma ilustração que nem sempre Deus atende ao que lhe pedimos porque nem sempre o que lhe pedimos é essencialmente bom para a nossa salvação. Jesus ensinou-nos a rezar o Pai Nosso e nesta oração quando pedimos a Deus para nos perdoar as ofensas dizemos de seguida “Assim como perdoamos a quem nos ofende”. Agradecer-Lhe os favores que nos dá às nossas vidas, implorar-Lhe para que através do seu Espírito Santo nos ajude a fazer decisões que alimentam as virtudes, as boas obras, e a paz de coração. Ser persistente na oração reflecte a necessidade de se querer estar com Deus e com Ele caminhar lado a lado neste mundo até ao encontro com Ele no Céu.

En el Evangelio de hoy, Jesús animó a sus oyentes a no cansarse en la oración, contando la historia de una viuda supuestamente impotente que se enfrentó a un juez injusto. La lección es que si el juez injusto cede y hace lo correcto, cuánto más Dios, que es justo, “garantizará los derechos de sus elegidos”.

En otro pasaje, sin embargo, Jesús también les dijo a sus oyentes: «Y cuando oren, no se queden hablando por hablar, como los paganos, que piensan que serán escuchados por su palabrería» (Mateo 6:7). No es el volumen de nuestras oraciones, sino la persistencia en la oración lo que Jesús recomienda.

Cuando uno ora aparentemente sin fin, puede suceder que se dedique menos atención a esas oraciones, que pueden volverse mecánicas. Es fácil perder el enfoque en la intención de nuestra oración. ¿No sería mejor orar con significado que apresurarse en muchas oraciones “en piloto automático”?

Cuidado de la Creacion

Con la llegada de la cosecha de fruta de otoño, considere que entre el 30% y el 40% de los alimentos producidos en Estados Unidos se desperdician. La fruta de los árboles a menudo se desperdicia, ya sea porque hay demasiada en poco tiempo para ser utilizada o porque el dueño del árbol no tiene la capacidad o el tiempo para cosecharla. Un árbol frutal establecido a menudo puede producir más de 100 libras de fruta, mucho más de lo que una familia puede consumir. Si tiene un árbol frutal, ¿por qué no donar el excedente a su banco de alimentos local? Cuando vea árboles frutales cargados en su vecindario, llame a la puerta y pregunte si puede ayudar a cosecharlos para donarlos. Finalmente, puede buscar grupos locales de recolección y ofrecer sus servicios para ayudar a recoger o entregar el excedente de fruta a una organización que la llevará a las personas con hambre. © Center for Ministry Development. Sembrando las semillas del futuro

\$5,250,000

Hoy en día, el 85 % de los jóvenes católicos se alejan de su fe antes de cumplir los 25 años. Sin embargo, siguen buscando un sentido, un propósito y un lugar al que pertenecer. La Iglesia debe acompañarlos, con autenticidad y compasión, reconociendo que no solo son el futuro, sino también una parte vital de la Iglesia actual.

Esta campaña se centrará en crear espacios y oportunidades en los que los jóvenes puedan construir una relación con Cristo y entre ellos, encontrar un sentido de pertenencia y acoger la llamada de Dios en sus vidas. Las inversiones clave, basadas en las conclusiones de nuestras asambleas sinodales, incluyen:

- Centros regionales para jóvenes adultos que ofrecen mentoría, compañerismo y formación dirigidos por compañeros.
