## From Monsignor Fran

---

With the conclusion of the Christmas Season, we began Ordinary Time last Monday. This does not mean that these weeks are *normal, usual or commonplace*. Rather, the weeks between the seasons of Advent/Christmas and Lent/Easter are numbered in order (First, Second, Third, etc.).

Except for this Sunday, throughout 2026 we will hear from the Gospel of Matthew, beginning next week with chapter 4 and the call of the Apostles. During Ordinary Time, the Church will offer us sequential passages from the Gospel. In this way, we can follow and make ourselves present to the events of Jesus' public ministry and come to know the Lord more and more. Even though we have heard these same readings at Mass every three years, each time they are proclaimed is an invitation to us to hear them in new ways. God's word is the same; but, as the circumstances of our lives change, we can hear that word with new ears.

## Sowing Seeds of Faith Update

---



Thanks to many in the parish, we continue moving toward our secondary goal of \$1.5 Million. This will allow us not only to hire a full-time Pastoral Associate to oversee parish implementation of the priorities of the Diocesan Pastoral Plan and of our Parish Listening Sessions, but to build this position into our budget for many years to come.

In this way, we can strengthen ministries for Youth and Young Adults, Young Families, Elderly and Homebound and Parish Liturgy.

If you have not yet been able to make your pledge for this five-year effort, it is still not too late. Those who have not yet responded will be receiving a campaign mailing this coming week.

Currently, we have received 138 gifts and pledges in the amount of \$1,171,976.03 !!!

## Behold the Lamb of God!

**O**f the many names Scripture provides to help us ponder the mystery of Jesus, one of the most intriguing is the name that John the Baptist offers at the opening of today's gospel: "Behold the Lamb of God!" (John 1:29).

Scripture scholars debate what John means here. Is he alluding to the Passover lamb—that unblemished lamb whose blood the enslaved Israelites were to post over their doorways? The angel of death knew to "pass over" these homes. Perhaps John was saying that by Jesus' blood, the people would be freed from death.

Or was John thinking about the guilt offerings mentioned in the Hebrew Scriptures when priests offered animal sacrifices to God as a way of seeking the removal of their sins? Leviticus mentions use of a scapegoat who would carry the sins of the people away into the desert. (See Leviticus 20-28.) Could John have understood that Jesus would bear the sins of the world?

Or did John have in mind the great constellation Aries, the ram, considered the prince of the stars of the sky, the center from whom all the other constellations were mapped in ancient times? Perhaps John was pointing out that Jesus was the center around whom heaven and earth revolve, like the ruling lamb mentioned in the Book of Revelation.


Today at Mass, when the host is elevated and you hear John's words again—"Behold the Lamb of God!"—take a moment to savor these words anew. ●

«Eis o Cordeiro de Deus, que tira o pecado do mundo.»

Foi assim que João Baptista exclamou quando Jesus veio ao seu encontro. Deste modo, retirava de si o peso daqueles que pensavam que ele próprio fosse o Messias. Ao mesmo tempo, apresentava Jesus como o verdadeiro Messias, o Salvador esperado há tanto tempo pelo chamado Povo do Senhor.

João assumiu a responsabilidade de ser o precursor escolhido por Deus para preparar os caminhos por onde Jesus haveria de caminhar, anunciando a Palavra de Deus e o plano de salvação para a Humanidade. Avisado por Deus, João reconheceu Jesus ao ver o Espírito Santo descer sobre Ele depois do Seu Batismo no rio Jordão: «*Aquele sobre quem vires o Espírito descer e repousar é que batiza no Espírito Santo.*»

Foi desta forma que João apresentou Jesus com total confiança, porque acreditou na mensagem de Deus. Não só O indicou ao povo que o seguia e lhe pedia o Batismo, mas também encaminhou André, Tiago e João para seguirem Jesus na Sua vida pública.

Assim se dá início ao Tempo Comum do Ano Litúrgico A, no qual os Evangelhos de São Mateus nos servirão de guia para refletirmos e para nos ajudarem a viver a nossa vida quotidiana. Segundo a vontade do Pai, Jesus inicia obedientemente a Sua vida pública. Os discípulos de João Baptista, um a um, seguem-No, deixando para trás a vida do mar e do seu trabalho, para se tornarem Apóstolos. Jesus faria deles *pescadores de homens*.

Aceitando o convite de João Baptista, decidiram seguir o Cordeiro de Deus. # ¡He aquí el Cordero de Dios!

**D**e los muchos nombres que las Escrituras nos ofrecen para ayudarnos a meditar sobre el misterio de Jesús, uno de los más intrigantes es el que Juan el Bautista propone al comienzo del evangelio de hoy: « ¡He aquí el Cordero de Dios!» (Juan 1, 29).

Los estudiosos de las Escrituras debaten qué quiere decir Juan aquí. ¿Está aludiendo al cordero pascual, ese cordero sin mancha cuya sangre debían untar los israelitas esclavizados en las puertas de sus casas? El ángel de la muerte sabía que debía «pasar por alto» esas casas. Quizás Juan estaba diciendo que, gracias a la sangre de Jesús, el pueblo sería liberado de la muerte.

¿O estaba pensando Juan en las ofrendas por la culpa mencionadas en las Escrituras hebreas, cuando los sacerdotes ofrecían sacrificios de animales a Dios como forma de pedir la remisión de sus pecados? El Levítico menciona el uso de un chivo expiatorio que llevaba los pecados del pueblo al desierto. (Véase Levítico 20-28). ¿Podría haber entendido Juan que Jesús cargaría con los

pecados del mundo?

¿O tenía Juan en mente la gran constelación de Aries, el carnero, considerado el príncipe de las estrellas del cielo, el centro desde el cual se trazaban todas las demás constelaciones en la antigüedad? Quizás Juan estaba señalando que Jesús era el centro alrededor del cual giraban el cielo y la tierra, como el cordero gobernante mencionado en el Libro del Apocalipsis.

Hoy, en la misa, cuando se eleve la hostia y vuelvas a escuchar las palabras de Juan —«¡He aquí el Cordero de Dios!»—, tómate un momento para saborear estas palabras de nuevo. ●


