



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From Monsignor Fran

This Third Sunday in Ordinary Time was designated as “Sunday of the Word of God,” by Pope Francis to encourage the study and celebration of Sacred Scripture, emphasizing its vital role in Christian life and understanding Christ, marked by themes like Jesus opening minds to understand the Scriptures, as seen in the story of the Road to Emmaus (Luke 24).

Psalm 115 declares that God’s word is “a lamp for my feet.” On this Sunday, we pause to reflect how we allow Scripture, God’s word, to guide us. We also focus on the way we experience God’s presence through the word proclaimed at Mass, which is analogous to the Real Presence of the Lord in the Eucharist and in the assembly of the People of God celebrating the Eucharist.

We pray that God’s word will be light for the path of our lives, wherever we go and whatever we do. May we, like the first ones who heard the call of the Lord, also follow where He leads.

Financial Report

Inside the bulletin is the financial report for the fiscal year ending 2025, the period from July 1, 2024 through June 30, 2025. Last fiscal year, total income was approximately \$1.1M, exceeding our Budget by \$93K, primarily driven by higher gifts/donations and the ADA campaign. For expenses, most categories held steady for the year, except for the accounting of previous years projects such as the roof, tenting, and other church improvements, which are reflected as depreciation under ‘Facilities’ and deducted over time. This year’s Budget is largely based on the same year-over-year trends that we have seen over recent years, such as cost of living adjustments to employees and other operational needs. Our balanced budget assumes a similar level of income and expenses as last year. Overall, the parish finished another strong year thanks to all of your continued support. As we look ahead this year, we are grateful for the success of the Sowing of Seeds of Faith campaign thus far, which will enhance our parish with greater outreach to youth, young adults, newlyweds, young families, the homebound, and many more of our parishioners.

Creation Care Tips

“As he walked by the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon, who is called Peter, and Andrew, his brother, casting a net into the sea—for they were fishermen. And he said to them, ‘Follow me, and I will make you fish for people.’ Immediately they left their nets and followed him.” —Matthew 4:18-20

Jesus spent a lot of time in boats, on beaches, and along shorelines, and he spent a lot of time with people who made their livelihoods from fishing. If you’ve ever been to shores in the Holy Land where Jesus once walked or imagined them in your own prayer, you probably don’t envision them littered with all the trash that is so common on our beaches now. Imagine how distressed Jesus would be to walk along a shoreline cluttered with plastic straws, bottles, cans, pieces of styrofoam, old tires, etc. Make time to go to a beach or shoreline near you and pick up trash. If you don’t live near a body of water, do the same in your neighborhood. Better yet, go with a friend or family member, or take some kids with you to multiply the effect.



Weekly Justice Challenges

The Gospel for Sunday includes Jesus' call of Peter, Andrew, James, and John to be his apostles. Scripture tells us that they dropped their nets and immediately responded to his Invitation. Your challenge this week is to listen to Jesus' call to you. What is he asking you to do this week, particularly for those who are in need of healing. Just as Jesus cured those who were sick as he proclaimed the Kingdom of God, how can you help to heal someone who has an injured heart or soul? How can you bring them Jesus' message of God's boundless love and desire that all people live in dignity and hope?




Reflexão por: João Pereira Arruda

Dando continuidade ao chamamento para iniciar a Sua vida pública, Jesus começa o Seu ministério na Galileia, terra de gentios, fértil em gente receptiva à Palavra de Deus. «*Vinde e segui-Me, e farei de vós pescadores de homens.*» A este chamamento aderiram Simão, também chamado Pedro, André, Tiago e João.

Eram pescadores e, como tal, sabiam bem como pescar peixe. Viviam do trabalho do mar. No entanto, ao chamá-los, Jesus prometia algo muito diferente: torná-los pescadores de homens. Isso implicava uma transformação total de vida, cuja primeira e fundamental etapa era segui-Lo e aprender d'Ele como se podia “pescar” pessoas para o Reino de Deus.

Pressentia-se que esta seria uma tarefa difícil, pois os homens mostravam-se muito mais teimosos em aceitar o “anzol” oferecido por Jesus do que os próprios peixes. A proclamação da Palavra de Deus e a oferta de salvação atraíam multidões, mas multidões não são necessariamente toda a gente. Ainda assim, os Apóstolos começaram a perceber que Jesus não apenas pregava, proclamava e revelava a Palavra do Pai, mas vivia-a plenamente.

Os primeiros Apóstolos não questionaram Jesus perante o Seu convite. Simplesmente deixaram as redes e a família para O seguir. Não perguntaram se este novo caminho lhes garantiria segurança material ou estabilidade de vida. Ao aceitarem o convite de Jesus, abraçaram livremente uma profunda e exigente transformação de vida.

Neste Domingo, para além do chamamento de Jesus aos Apóstolos, as leituras falam-nos também de **unidade**. Bem sabemos o caos que resulta da falta de união — seja nas famílias, nas comunidades, nas paróquias, nas organizações ou até nas nações, por mais ricas e poderosas que sejam. Na Igreja não devem existir divisões, rivalidades ou partidos. Existe um só Batismo, recebido em Cristo, o único Salvador, que veio para unir e não para dividir.

Quem semeia divisão fere, mutila e destrói o Corpo de Cristo, comprometendo o crescimento do Reino de Deus. São Paulo, na segunda leitura deste Domingo, desafia os cristãos de Corinto com uma pergunta que continua atual: «*Estará Cristo dividido?*» Que esta mesma pergunta nos ajude hoje a refletir sobre o caos em que vivemos: divisões de ideias, violência, falsidade, crime e corrupção. Onde Cristo não está no centro, também Deus não está presente no meio da confusão que marca a nossa sociedade.

Neste Domingo, somos convidados a refletir sobre duas questões fundamentais:
Que resposta darei eu ao chamamento de Jesus para transformar a minha vida e segui-Lo?

Que contributo dou para a criação de um ambiente de unidade e de amor fraterno?

Chamamento e unidade estão profundamente ligados, pois os Apóstolos, ao responderem ao convite de Jesus, ficaram unidos a Ele. Dessa união nasceu a Igreja fundada por Jesus Cristo, que chegou até nós e exige de cada um de nós responsabilidade pela sua continuidade junto das gerações futuras.

Eleições do Conselho Paroquial Português

Recordamos que já no próximo **domingo, dia 1 de fevereiro**, terá lugar uma atividade cujo objetivo é a eleição de um novo Conselho Paroquial Português, que representará a nossa comunidade nesta paróquia. Desde o seu início, em 1973, a nossa comunidade tem tido representação ativa, e o seu futuro depende das pessoas que forem escolhidas para assumir os cargos necessários à sua continuidade.

O Espírito Santo concede dons e carismas que devem ser bem geridos e colocados ao serviço do bem comum, neste caso ao serviço da comunidade e da paróquia. Por isso, convidamos todos a participar e a contactar os membros do Conselho atual para colaborar numa refeição partilhada (*potluck*).

O ato eleitoral terá lugar no salão paroquial, em horário a anunciar, no domingo, dia 1 de fevereiro.




Parish Mission Statement



Judged or Invited?

“Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand” (Matthew 3:2) is the message preached by Jesus after the arrest of John the Baptist. It is important to place this message in context. Jesus is not repeating the preaching of the Baptist. His message is unique and compelling.

Look closely at what Jesus is saying. Do not automatically fill in the blanks with the memories of every sermon you have heard. Try to hear Jesus’ words again, for the first time. Is the emphasis on “repent,” or is the emphasis on the announcement, “The kingdom of heaven is at hand”? Does it make any difference?

Repeat these words and change the emphasis each time. Play with the words. Let the words play with you. Notice how you respond. Notice what makes a difference. Notice how you react, and, most of all, notice whether you feel invited or you feel judged.

The Baptist made no bones about it. You are being judged: “Even now the ax lies at the root of the trees” (Matthew 3:10). Jesus, on the other hand, seems not to judge but to invite: “for the

kingdom of heaven is at hand” (Matthew 4:17).

In the invitation, we are challenged to see in a different way. Use different skills. Refrain from automatic judgments. Seek to understand but, most of all, to accept and to love. ●

¿Juzgado o invitado?

«**A**rrepentíos, porque el reino de los cielos se ha acercado» (Mateo 3, 2) es el mensaje que predicó Jesús tras el arresto de Juan el Bautista. Es importante situar este mensaje en su contexto. Jesús no está repitiendo la predicación del Bautista. Su mensaje es único y convincente.

Fíjate bien en lo que dice Jesús. No rellenes automáticamente los espacios en blanco con los recuerdos de todos los sermones que has escuchado. Intenta escuchar las palabras de Jesús de nuevo, como si fuera la primera vez. ¿El énfasis está en «arrepentíos» o en el anuncio «el reino de los cielos está cerca»? ¿Hay alguna diferencia?

Repite estas palabras y cambia el énfasis cada vez. Juega con las palabras. Deja que las palabras jueguen contigo. Observa cómo respondes. Observa qué marca la diferencia. Observa cómo reaccionas y, sobre todo, observa si te sientes invitado o juzgado.

El Bautista no se anduvo con rodeos. Estás siendo juzgado: «El hacha ya está puesta a la raíz de los árboles» (Mateo 3, 10). Jesús, por otro lado, parece no juzgar, sino invitar: «porque el reino de los cielos se ha acercado»

(Mateo 4, 17). En la invitación, se nos desafía a ver de una manera diferente. Usa habilidades diferentes. Abstenerse de los juicios automáticos. Buscar comprender, pero, sobre todo, aceptar y amar. ●

Este Tercer Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario fue designado como “Domingo de la Palabra de Dios” por el Papa Francisco para fomentar el estudio y la celebración de la Sagrada Escritura, enfatizando su papel vital en la vida cristiana y en la comprensión de Cristo, con temas como Jesús abriendo las mentes para comprender las Escrituras, como se ve en la historia del camino a Emaús (Lucas 24).

El Salmo 115 declara que la palabra de Dios es “lámpara para mis pies”. En este domingo, nos detenemos a reflexionar sobre cómo permitimos que la Escritura, la palabra de Dios, nos guíe. También nos centramos en la forma en que experimentamos la presencia de Dios a través de la palabra proclamada en la Misa, que es análoga a la Presencia Real del Señor en la Eucaristía y en la asamblea del Pueblo de Dios que celebra la Eucaristía.

Oramos para que la palabra de Dios sea luz para el camino de nuestras vidas, donde quiera que vayamos y lo que hagamos. Que, como los primeros que escucharon el llamado del Señor, también sigamos a donde Él nos guíe.

Reporte De Financia

Dentro del boletín se encuentra el informe financiero del año fiscal que finaliza en 2025, el período comprendido entre el 1 de julio de 2024 y el 30 de junio de 2025. El año fiscal pasado, los ingresos totales fueron de aproximadamente \$1.1 millones, superando nuestro presupuesto en \$93,000, principalmente debido a mayores donaciones y a la campaña de la ADA. En cuanto a los gastos, la mayoría de las categorías se mantuvieron estables durante el año, excepto por la contabilidad de proyectos de años anteriores, como el techo, la carpa y otras mejoras de la iglesia, que se reflejan como depreciación en la sección de "Instalaciones" y se deducen a lo largo del tiempo. El presupuesto de este año se basa en gran medida en las mismas tendencias interanuales que hemos observado en los últimos años, como los ajustes por costo de vida para los empleados y otras necesidades operativas. Nuestro presupuesto equilibrado supone un nivel similar de ingresos y gastos al del año pasado. En general, la parroquia finalizó otro año exitoso gracias a su continuo apoyo. Al mirar hacia el futuro, estamos agradecidos por el éxito de la campaña *Sembrando Semillas de Fe* hasta el momento, que enriquecerá nuestra parroquia con un mayor alcance a jóvenes, jóvenes adultos, recién casados, familias jóvenes, personas enfermas y confinadas en sus hogares, y muchos más de nuestros feligreses.

Consejos Para el Cuidado de la Creación

“Jesús iba caminando por la orilla del Lago de Galilea, cuando vio a dos hermanos: uno era Simón, también llamado Pedro, y el otro Andrés. Eran pescadores, y estaban echando la red al agua. Jesús les dijo: «Siganme, y yo los haré pescadores de hombres». Al momento dejaron sus redes y se fueron con él”. — Mateo 4,18-20

Jesús pasó mucho tiempo en barcas, en playas y a lo largo de las orillas de los lagos, y pasó mucho tiempo con personas que se ganaban la vida pescando. Si alguna vez has estado en las costas de Tierra Santa donde Jesús caminó, o si te las has imaginado en tu propia oración, probablemente no las has imaginado llenas de basura, como lo es tan común en nuestras playas en la actualidad. Imagina lo angustiado que estaría Jesús al caminar por unas orillas llenas de pajitas de plástico, botellas, latas, pedazos de poliestireno, llantas viejas, etc. Dedicar un tiempo para ir a una playa o a una orilla cercana a recoger basura. Si no vives cerca de un cuerpo de agua, haz lo mismo en tu vecindario. Mejor aún, ve con un amigo o con un familiar, o lleva a algunos niños contigo para multiplicar el efecto

La Semana de las Escuelas Católicas he llegado; y la Escuela Saint Clare comienza las celebraciones con nuestra parroquia y la comunidad local!




Luego, acérquese a la jornada de puertas abiertas de nuestra escuela de 11:30 a. m. a 1:30 p. m.


