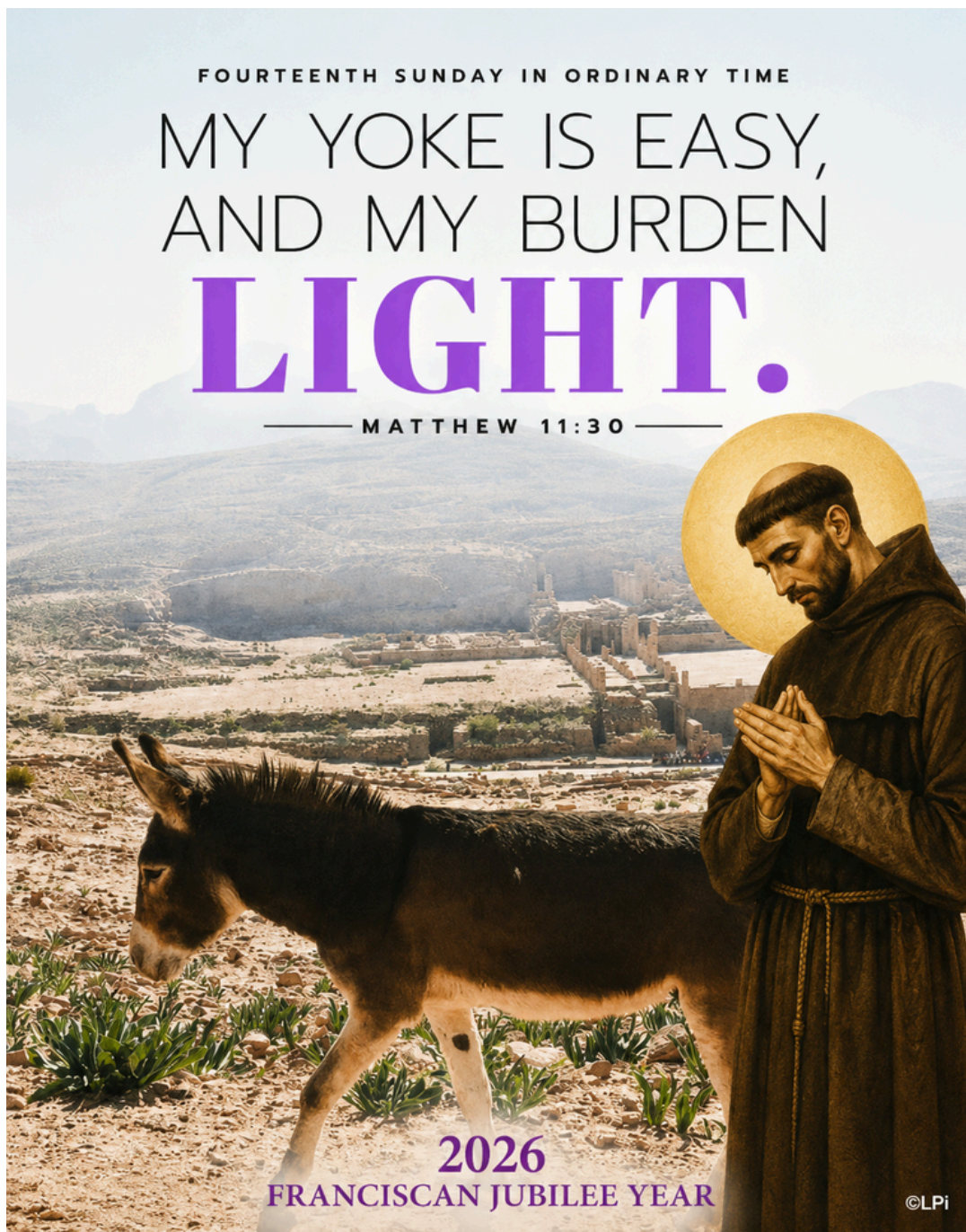

As we celebrate the historic milestone this Fourth of July, let us focus on gratitude for the nation's blessings, the important of spiritual renewal, and the call for Christians to be unifying, hopeful presence in a divided world.

My name is Father Joseph Mendie Nguyen but I go by Father Mendie, due to many priests' named Joseph in our Diocese of San José.

I am deeply humbled and excited to step into this new role as a new Pastor of Saint Clare Church and School. It is a great privilege to serve you. I would like to thank Msgr. Fran Cilia for his guidance and smooth transition. I wish him well in his new assignment as Rector of Cathedral Basilica of Saint Joseph. I also happy to reunite with Msgr. Francisco Rios, as we worked together at Saint Catherine of Alexandria Parish in Morgan Hill.

Let me take this opportunity to share a little bit about myself: I was born and raised in South Vietnam and came to the United States of America in the year 1991. I worked different jobs prior to entering the Divine Word Missionaries in Spring 2006, then transferred to the Diocese of San José's seminarian formation at Saint Patrick Seminary and University in Menlo Park on fall 2008.

After my ordination on June 1st, 2013, I served as parochial vicar at Saint Simon in Los Altos for six years, the next four years at Saint Joseph in Cupertino from July 1st, 2019 to 2023, then three years at Saint Catherine of Alexandria in Morgan Hill, from July 1st, 2023 to July 1st, 2026.

I have been praying for this community since I was appointed as a new Pastor at Saint Clare. I already feel so welcomed, since my first Mass on last Thursday July 2nd, 2026.

My heart is to see our Church grow in faith, love, and service to our neighbors. I cannot wait to meet you personally, learn your stories, to deepen your relationship with Jesus Christ, and to spread the Gospel of Christ. Please come say hello after the Mass and Happy Fourth of July!

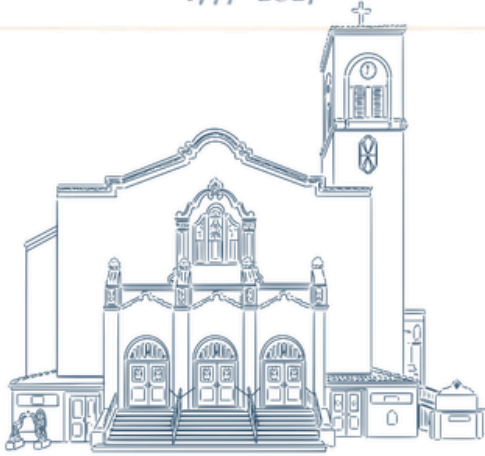

Boletim Paroquial Português
5 de Julho de 2026 – XIV Domingo do Tempo Comum – Ano A
Reflexão por: João Pereira Arruda

Na Primeira Leitura da liturgia deste Domingo, o profeta Zacarias anuncia ao povo de Israel a entrada triunfal de Jesus Cristo em Jerusalém, montado numa jumentinha. Zacarias proclama que este Rei, Jesus, vem estabelecer a paz entre as nações e pôr fim à violência.

Também nós, hoje, necessitamos de líderes que saibam promover a paz, a concórdia e a unidade entre os povos e as comunidades de toda a terra. Vivemos tempos de incerteza e insegurança. Muitos dos organismos que promoviam a paz e a cooperação parecem dar lugar à ganância pelo poder, ao individualismo do “eu primeiro”, à desunião e à perda de valores como a lealdade, a fidelidade e o respeito. Tudo isto alimenta a corrupção, a violência, o crime e a corrida ao armamento, gerando guerras e afastando a paz.

Na Segunda Leitura, São Paulo recorda aos Romanos que não vivemos sob o domínio da carne, mas do Espírito. Se o Espírito de Deus habita em nós, pertencemos a Deus. Como escreve o Apóstolo:

“Se o Espírito d’Aquele que ressuscitou Jesus de entre os mortos habita em vós, Ele, que ressuscitou Cristo Jesus de entre os mortos, também dará vida aos vossos corpos mortais, pelo seu Espírito que habita em vós.”

São Paulo acrescenta que, se vivermos segundo a carne, morreremos; mas, se pelo Espírito fizermos morrer as obras da carne, viveremos para sempre.

No Evangelho, São Mateus apresenta-nos Jesus como manso e humilde de coração. Ele convida-nos a levar até Ele as nossas dores, aflições, preocupações e medos, prometendo aliviar o peso que carregamos. Quem nos fala desta forma é o próprio Deus. O próprio Jesus afirma:

“Ninguém conhece o Filho senão o Pai, e ninguém conhece o Pai senão o Filho e aquele a quem o Filho O quiser revelar.”

A vinda de Jesus Cristo ao mundo teve como missão libertar a humanidade do pecado. Veio trazer a paz e revelar o infinito amor do Pai por cada um de nós. Ensinou-nos também: *“Bem-aventurados os pacíficos, porque serão chamados filhos de Deus.”*

Nunca será demais escutarmos estas verdades que nos chegam pela Palavra de Deus. Quanto mais conhecemos Jesus Cristo, mais conhecemos o Pai. Esse conhecimento ajuda-nos a fazer escolhas de paz, de amor e de justiça, fortalecendo o espírito que habita em nós e afastando tudo aquilo que nos conduz ao pecado.

Mês de Julho - Na próxima sexta-feira, o Grupo da Reza do Terço reunir-se-á na Capela da Reitoria, às 18h30. Todos são cordialmente convidados a participar nesta devoção. Excepcionalmente, o encontro foi transferido para a segunda sexta-feira do mês devido às celebrações do feriado nacional da Independência dos Estados Unidos.

Agradecemos a todos os membros da nossa comunidade que contribuíram com alimentos para o convívio de despedida do Monsenhor Francis Cilia. A sua partida representa uma grande perda para a nossa paróquia e, em particular, para a comunidade portuguesa. A sua liderança, dedicação e respeito na forma de servir e orientar os diversos grupos da paróquia deixam um exemplo que permanecerá entre nós.

Como comunidade, desejamos que o Espírito Santo continue a fortalecer a sua missão sacerdotal e o acompanhe no novo rebanho que lhe foi confiado.

Ao mesmo tempo, damos as boas-vindas ao nosso novo pároco, **Rev. Padre Mendie Nguyen**. Ao longo dos anos, a nossa comunidade sempre soube acolher os sacerdotes enviados pela Diocese de São José. 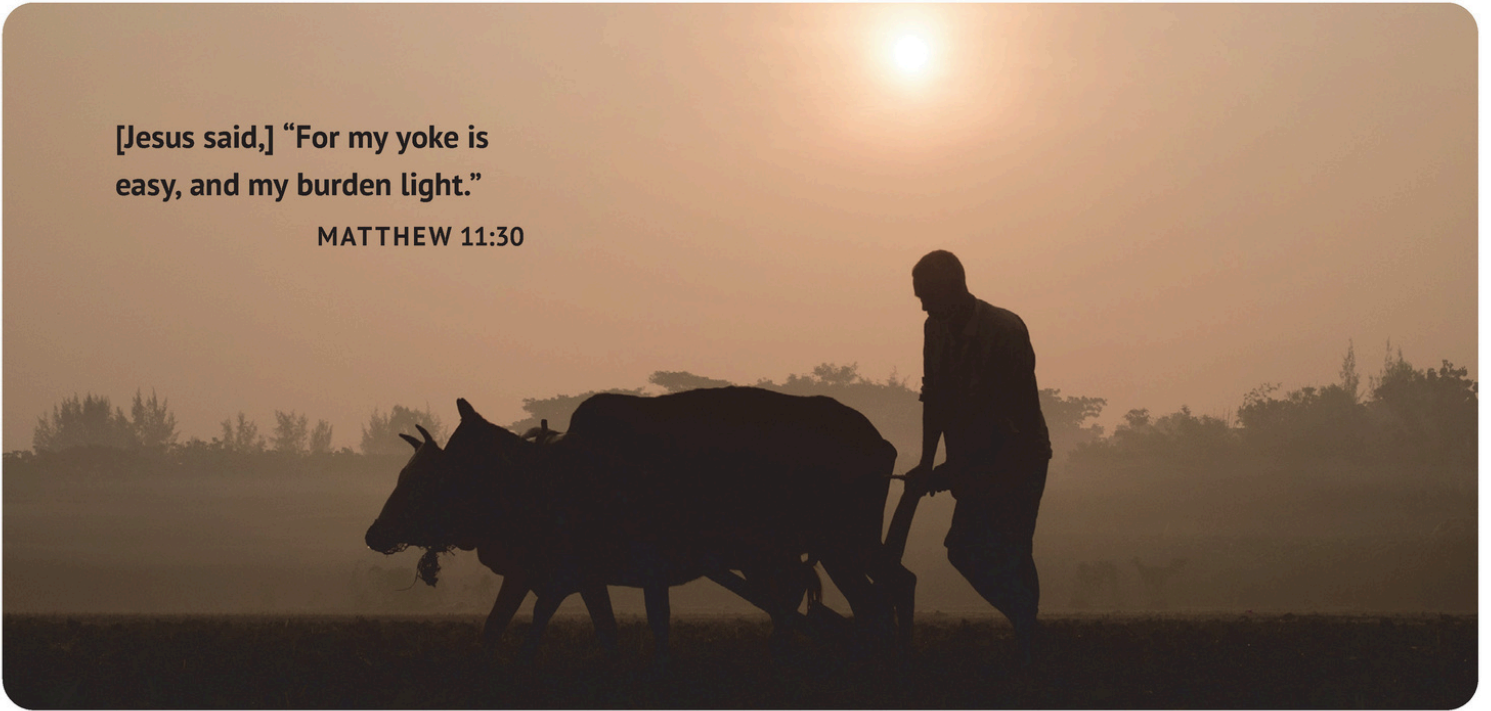

Take Up the Yoke

The invention of the yoke 6,000 years ago marked one of the great advances in human history. The yoke—a wooden beam fitted across the neck—harnessed the energy of two cattle pulling in the same direction, hastening the tilling of soil and transport of goods.

It is easy to see why, among many ancient peoples, the yoke became a symbol of subjugation. When the Roman army won a battle, they forced defeated soldiers to walk beneath a “yoke” of spears to indicate they were now in a state of servitude. The prophet Jeremiah once walked through Jerusalem wearing a yoke to warn the people they were about to be conquered by Babylon.

In Judaism, however, the Torah was also sometimes referred to as a yoke. It was a law to be submitted to, but it also was a way of life that offered an alternative to the cruel “yokes” imposed by kings. The Book of Sirach encourages youth to “Take [Torah’s] yoke upon your neck; that your mind may receive her teaching.... See for yourselves! I have labored only a little but have found much” (Sirach 51:26–27).

It is unclear exactly what Jesus meant when he invited us to accept *his* yoke, but it is likely that he was echoing the invitation of Sirach. He wanted us to know that following God’s law makes it possible for us to work together, accomplishing much that we could not do on our own. And that God’s law is a gentle law—one that enables rather than oppresses. Are you willing to receive Christ’s gentle teaching and make it your own? ●

Tomar el yugo

La invención del yugo hace 6.000 años supuso uno de los grandes avances de la historia de la humanidad. El yugo —una viga de madera colocada sobre el cuello— aprovechaba la energía de dos animales que tiraban en la misma dirección, agilizando el trabajo de la tierra y el transporte de mercancías.

Es fácil ver por qué, entre muchos pueblos antiguos, el yugo se convirtió en un símbolo de sometimiento. Cuando el ejército romano ganaba una batalla, obligaba a los soldados derrotados a caminar bajo un «yugo» de lanzas para indicar que ahora se encontraban en un estado de servidumbre. El profeta Jeremías caminó una vez por Jerusalén llevando un yugo para advertir al pueblo de que estaban a punto de ser conquistados por Babilonia.

En el judaísmo, sin embargo, la Torá también se denominaba a veces «yugo». Era una ley a la que había que someterse, pero también era una forma de vida que ofrecía una alternativa a los crueles «yugos» impuestos por los reyes. El Libro de Sirácide anima a los jóvenes a «Tomad el yugo [de la Torá] sobre su cuello, para que su mente reciba su enseñanza... ¡Veánlo por ustedes mismos! He trabajado poco, pero he encontrado mucho» (Eclesiástico 51, 26-27).

No está claro exactamente qué quiso decir Jesús cuando nos invitó a aceptar su yugo, pero es probable que se hiciera eco de la invitación de Eclesiástico. Quería que supiéramos que seguir la ley de Dios nos permite trabajar juntos, logrando mucho de lo que no podríamos hacer por nuestra cuenta. Y que la ley de Dios es una ley suave, que capacita en lugar de oprimir. ¿Estás dispuesto a recibir la suave enseñanza de Cristo y hacerla tuya? ●

Permítanme compartirles un poco sobre mi historia. Nací y crecí en el sur de Vietnam y llegué a los Estados Unidos en 1991. Antes de ingresar a la vida religiosa, trabajé en distintos empleos. Ya desde la primera Misa que celebré con ustedes el pasado jueves 2 de julio de 2026, me he sentido recibido con un cariño y una calidez que agradezco de todo corazón. 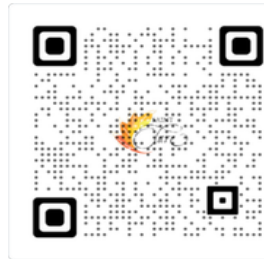
