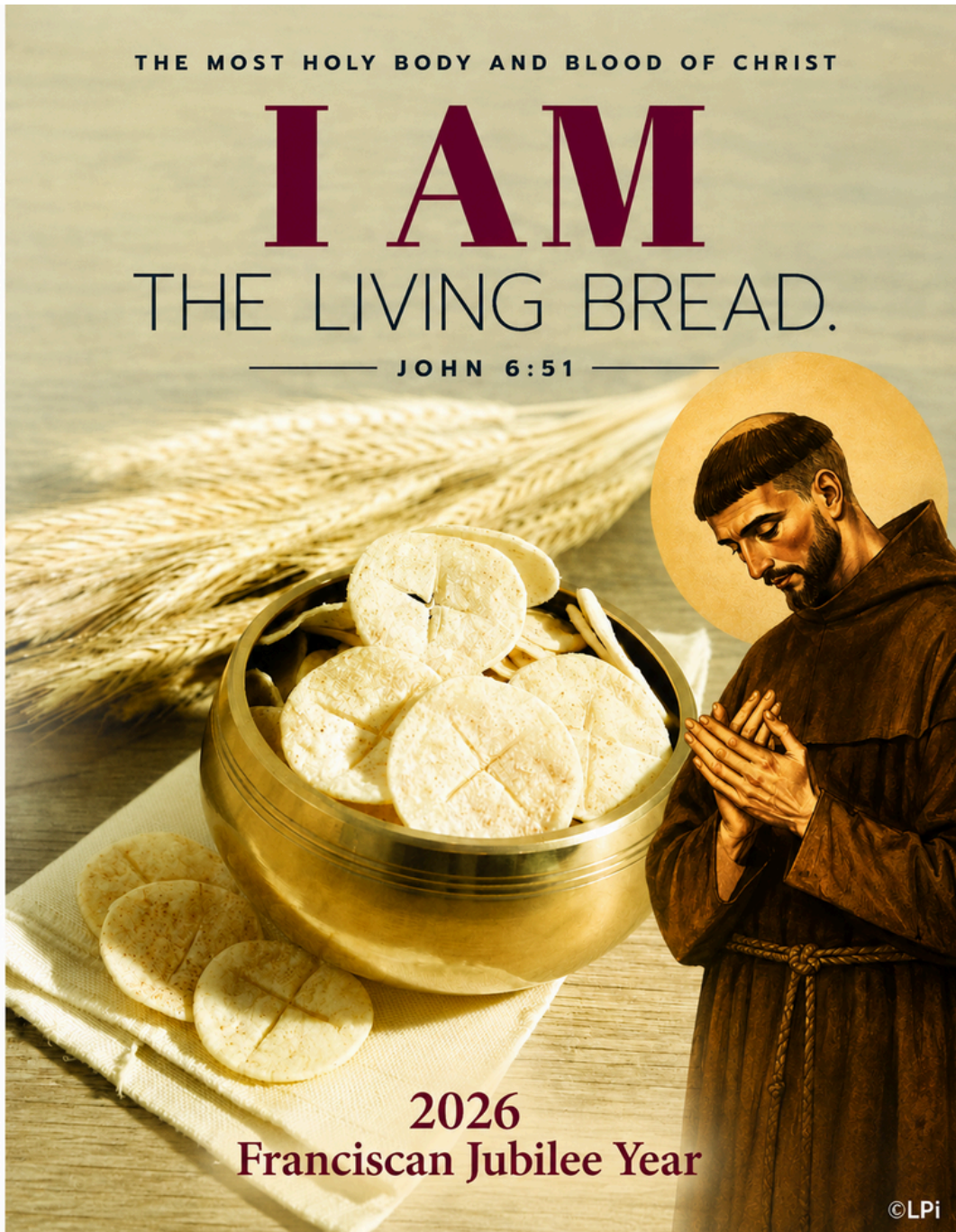

From Monsignor Fran

This Sunday, the Church celebrates the solemn feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. In the past, this day was known as “Corpus Christi.”

Today is a Eucharistic feast. We celebrate the many ways the Lord is truly present in His Body and Blood: in the consecrated Bread and Wine that we receive in Holy Communion; the same Lord is worshipped by believers.

It was Saint Augustine in the fourth century who taught that we are a Eucharistic people: “See what you are and become what you receive, the Body and Blood of Christ.”

In his 1943 encyclical letter, *Mystici Corporis Christi*, Pope Pius XII taught that the Church is not merely an organization founded by Christ but is truly His Mystical Body, with Christ as its Head and the faithful as its members. This doctrine highlights the intimate union between Christ and believers.

On this feast, then, we celebrate our union – “communion” with Christ and with one another. Let us build up the Body of Christ in all that we are and in all that we do.

Quarterly Collection for Saint Clare School

Next weekend, we will take up our quarterly collection to benefit tuition assistance at our parish school. We endeavor to make the school affordable for as many families as is possible. Your gifts help to extend Catholic Education to more young people. Thank you.

The Peace and Justice Committee

Weekly Justice Challenges

The Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ is a powerful reminder of Jesus' life, death and resurrection. We celebrate the gift of the Eucharist, the sacrament in which each of us is nourished and sent forth. This day reminds us that we don't do things on our own power – but from strength gained from the Eucharist. Before Jesus died, he asked his disciples if they could drink from the cup. He was asking if they were willing to endure what might come if they chose to feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, heal the sick and blind and set captives free. They said YES. The Body and Blood of Jesus is a gift to us, yet it is a challenge too. Ask yourself this week, “How does the Eucharist nourish and strengthen me? How am I being sent like the disciples? To whom am I being sent?” Reflect on how you have responded to these questions in the past. What will your response be from now on?

Boletim Paroquial Português
7 de Junho de 2026 – Solenidade do Santíssimo Corpo
e Sangue de Cristo

São Tomás de Aquino, o grande teólogo da Eucaristia, dizia: «*Na Eucaristia não vemos Cristo com os olhos do corpo, mas cremos na sua presença com os olhos da fé.*» Santo Agostinho afirmava: «*Reconhece no pão o que pendeu da cruz; reconhece no cálice o que jorrou do lado de Cristo. Aquele que se alimenta de Cristo vive de Cristo.*»

Estes dois grandes santos dedicaram boa parte das suas vidas à contemplação e ao estudo dos mistérios da fé. São Tomás de Aquino legou-nos o *Tantum Ergo*, um dos mais belos hinos de adoração ao Santíssimo Sacramento, ainda hoje utilizado nas celebrações eucarísticas. Santo Agostinho dedicou-se profundamente à compreensão do mistério da Santíssima Trindade, procurando explicar como três Pessoas distintas são um só Deus verdadeiro.

Os mistérios de Deus ultrapassam a compreensão humana. O homem esteve, está e continuará a estar longe de compreender plenamente a lógica divina. Para isso, temos a fé. Pela fé acreditamos que o Corpo de Cristo está presente em cada hóstia consagrada. Pela fé acreditamos que o vinho consagrado se torna o Sangue de Cristo, conforme as palavras do Senhor: «*Tomai e comei: isto é o Meu Corpo. Tomai e bebei: este é o Meu Sangue, o Sangue da nova aliança, derramado por vós para remissão dos pecados.*»

Quando o sacerdote ou ministro da Comunhão apresenta a hóstia ou o cálice e proclama: «*Corpo de Cristo*» ou «*Sangue de Cristo*», o fiel responde: «*Ámen.*» Esse «*Ámen*», tantas vezes pronunciado por hábito, significa: «*Eu acredito.*» Significa acolher Cristo na própria vida e confiar no Seu amor, na Sua força e na Sua misericórdia.

É esta a solenidade que hoje celebramos, outrora conhecida como a Festa de *Corpus Christi*. Trata-se de uma celebração de grande importância para os cristãos, pois renova a nossa fé e impele-nos a testemunhar Cristo no mundo.

Na Santa Eucaristia, Cristo continua a oferecer-Se no pão e no vinho. Todos se aproximam do altar para O receber: o operário, o engenheiro, a dona de casa, o político, o médico, o atleta, o professor. Perante Cristo não existem distinções sociais. Todos somos irmãos, todos somos iguais todos somos convidados a alimentar-nos d'Ele.

Celebremos, pois, Cristo Salvador presente no pão e no vinho, para que, por Ele, tenhamos vida e tenhamos em abundância.

Desejamos a todos um santo e alegre domingo.

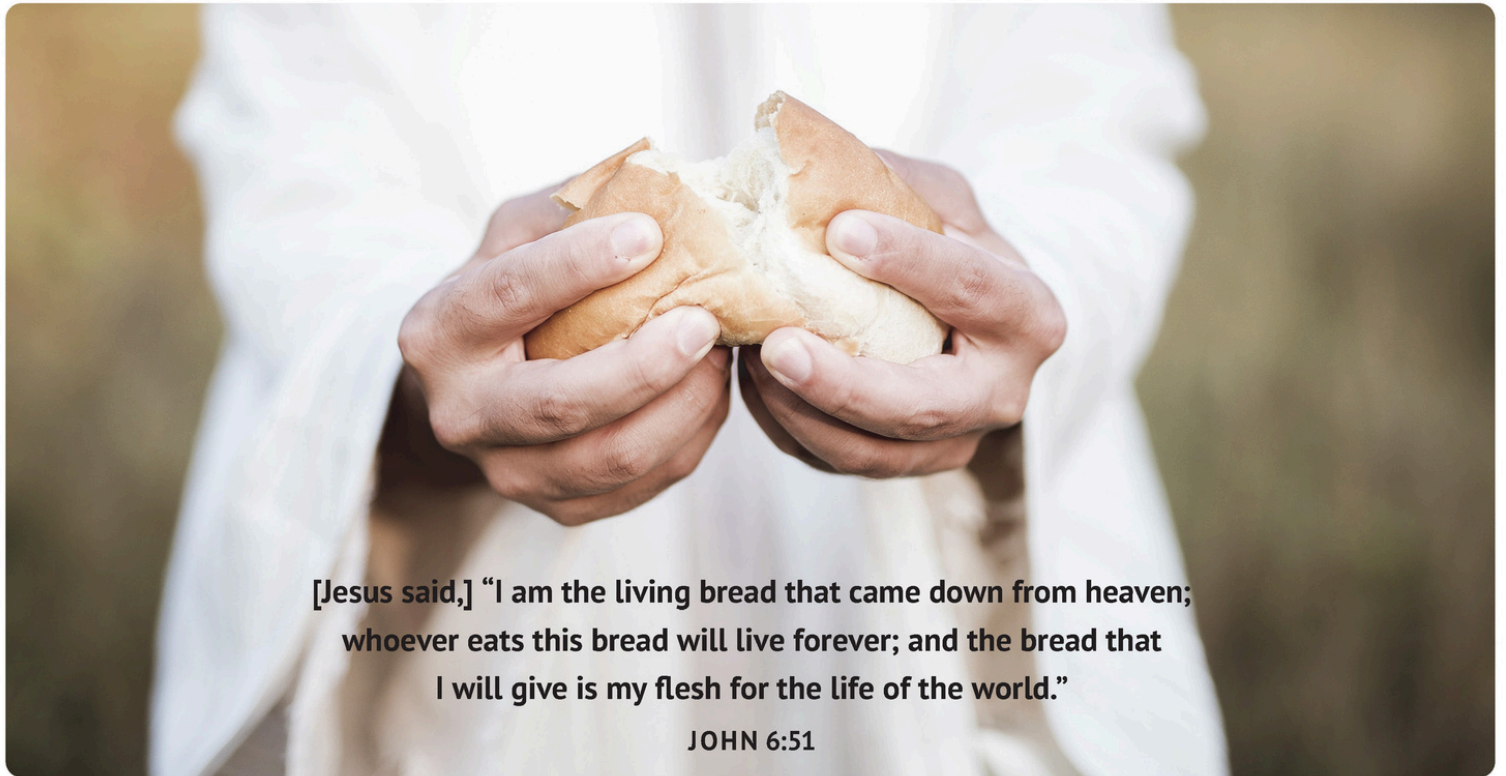

[Jesus said,] “I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world.”

JOHN 6:51

All You Can Eat

The “**Bread of Life Discourse**” in the sixth chapter of the Gospel of John is an astonishing teaching. “The bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world” (John 6:51b). Creation was wonderful, the Incarnation was wonderful, but now Jesus takes the final step in God’s coming ever closer to us human beings, as close as food, as intimate as eating Christ’s body and drinking his blood. For us Catholics, it’s called *transubstantiation*: the Host—something we hold in our hand—is so divine that we worship it!

The crowds listening to Jesus could not have imagined how you would “eat” (literally, “gnaw”) Jesus’ flesh or drink his blood, and certainly not a whole year before the Last Supper (not to mention, hundreds of years before St. Thomas Aquinas). When surveys showed that many of today’s Catholics are just as confused and doubtful as the crowd at Capernaum, having lost faith or even interest in the Eucharist, the American bishops launched a search-and-rescue mission to recover “The Mystery of the Eucharist in the Life of the Church,” published in 2021.

Paul bases the sacrament in our own experience. “The cup...that we bless” and “the bread that we break” create the ultimate reality: “we, though many, are one body”—of Christ! (See 1 Corinthians 10:16–17) The priest says, “The Body of Christ,” and we respond, “Amen!” ●

Todo lo que puedas comer

El «Discurso del pan de vida» del capítulo sexto del Evangelio de Juan es una enseñanza asombrosa. «El pan que yo daré es mi carne para la vida del mundo» (Juan 6, 51b). La creación fue maravillosa, la encarnación fue maravillosa, pero ahora Jesús da el paso definitivo para que Dios se acerque aún más a nosotros, los seres humanos, tan cerca como la comida, tan íntimo como comer el cuerpo de Cristo y beber su sangre. Para nosotros, los católicos, se llama *transubstanciación*: la hostia, algo que sostenemos en nuestra mano, es tan divina que la adoramos.

Las multitudes que escuchaban a Jesús no podían imaginar cómo se «come» (literalmente, «roer») la carne de Jesús o se bebe su sangre, y mucho menos un año antes de la Última Cena (por no hablar de cientos de años antes de Santo Tomás de Aquino). Cuando las encuestas mostraron que muchos de los católicos de hoy en día están tan confundidos y dudosos como la multitud de Cafarnaúm, habiendo perdido la fe o incluso el interés por la Eucaristía, los obispos estadounidenses lanzaron una misión de búsqueda y rescate para recuperar «El misterio de la Eucaristía en la vida de la Iglesia», publicado en 2021.

Pablo basa el sacramento en nuestra propia experiencia. «La copa... que bendecimos» y «el pan que partimos» crean la realidad última: «nosotros, aunque somos muchos, somos un solo cuerpo», ¡el de Cristo! (Véase 1 Corintios 10, 16-17). El sacerdote dice: «El Cuerpo de Cristo», y nosotros respondemos: «Amén». ●

Para Reflexionar

¿Qué significa mi «Amén» cuando recibo la Eucaristía?

Este domingo, la Iglesia celebra la solemne fiesta del Santísimo Cuerpo y la Santísima Sangre de Cristo. En el pasado, este día era conocido como “Corpus Christi.”

Hoy es una fiesta eucarística. Celebramos las muchas maneras en que el Señor está verdaderamente presente en Su Cuerpo y Sangre: en el Pan y el Vino consagrados que recibimos en la Sagrada Comunión; el mismo Señor es adorado por los creyentes.

Fue San Agustín, en el siglo IV, quien enseñó que somos un pueblo eucarístico: “Miren lo que son y conviértanse en lo que reciben: el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo.”

En su carta encíclica de 1943, *Mystici Corporis Christi*, el Papa Pío XII enseñó que la Iglesia no es simplemente una organización fundada por Cristo, sino que es verdaderamente Su Cuerpo Místico, con Cristo como su Cabeza y los fieles como sus miembros. Esta doctrina destaca la íntima unión entre Cristo y los creyentes.


